The Parmer County Sheriff's Posse will meet at the Spur Restaurant on Monday at 7 p.m.

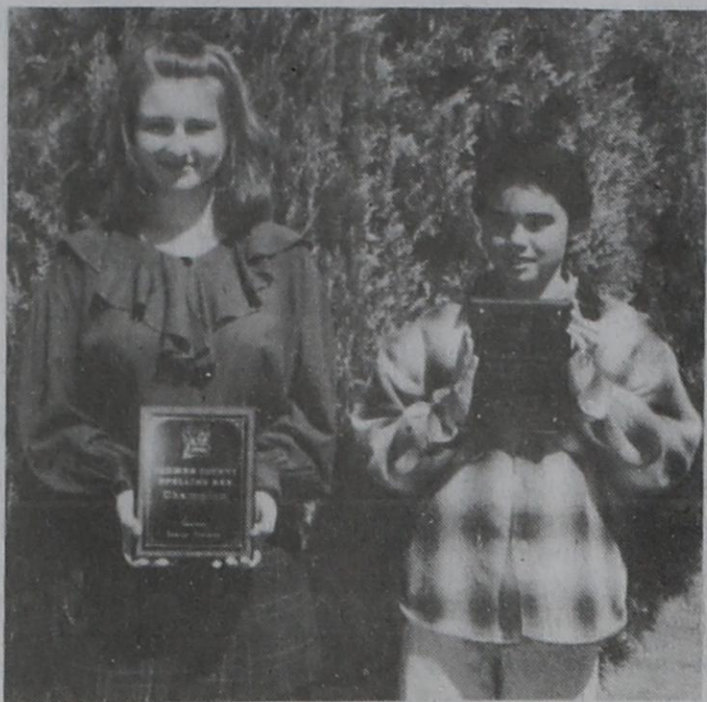
Folks from the Farwell area are urged to attend and find out about the posse.

It's a non-profit group of Parmer County residents which will help the sheriff's department when needed.

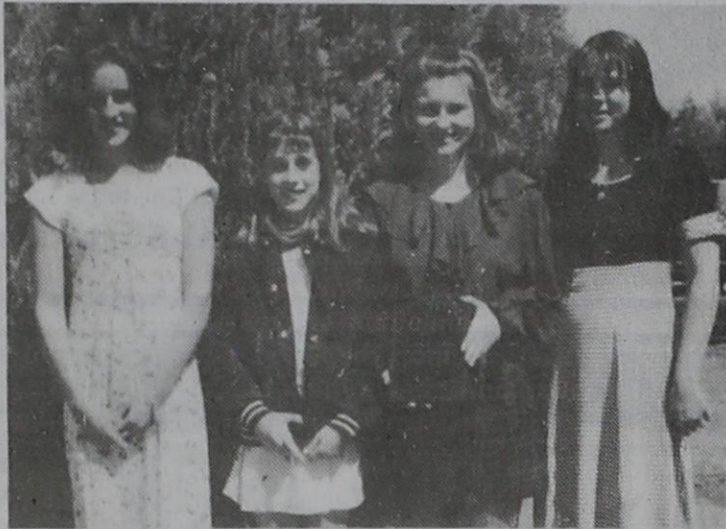
The annual Tootsie Roll fund-raising drive undertaken annually by the Knights of Columbus will be March 30.

Mobile home removal ordered

The Texico City Council on Tuesday listened to a request from Audenago Estrada to waive certain guidelines to the city's mobile home ordinance.

Estrada has been in a dispute with a neighbor after he moved in a mobile home at 502 Florence. Municipal Judge George Herrington recently issued an order to Estrada to remove his mobile home or it will be towed away by the city.

Frank Phillips, a friend of Estrada, spoke for him at the meeting. He said Estrada would comply with city guidelines but suggested a waiver for the clause that a mobile home's front had to be parallel to the street.

Mayor Butch Tharp responded that the council had taken "great pains" to explain the guidelines to Estrada who had been given a lengthy period to comply. Tharp said Estrada failed to comply and the matter was turned over to the judge. "It's in his hands, now," said Tharp.

County to keep open burning

The Parmer County Commissioners on Monday discussed a request by Friona Fire Chief Jimmy Taylor to ban open burning in rural areas.

Recently, a fire in eastern Parmer County almost got out of control.

After discussion, the commissioners agreed to urge county residents to use common sense and if they do any open burning, to first call their local fire departments or the county sheriff's office (481-3303) and tell them what they plan to do.

The commissioners voted not to ban open burning 3-0, with Johnny Mars, the Friona representative on the commissioners court, abstaining.

The federal government

does allow some open burning. Approvals are needed.

The commissioners' vote only pertains to rural areas. The cities of Bovina, Farwell and Friona have their own ordinances.

In other business, the commissioners:

-- Accepted the lone bid it

received to buy a used tractor for Pct. 3 (Farwell area). It was purchased from Wards Equipment, Clovis, for \$17,500.

-- Received a notice from the Texas Ag Extension Service concerning its staff-

Will overpass be needed here?

An overpass over the tracks between Texico and Farwell was discussed at Tuesday's Farwell Chamber of Commerce meeting.

Chamber President Ralph Franse reported that when the Santa Fe is 4-tracked, he's heard that it will mean well over 100 trains crossing through the Twin Cities each day -- an estimated 25% to 50% more train traffic than currently.

The Chamber voted to have Franse and the members of the Chamber's industrial development committee to meet with the Farwell City Council at its April meeting about this. The council will be asked to be take the point in dealing with governmental and railroad officials on possibly building an overpass.

Since both Texas and New Mexico are involved, Texico officials will be asked to work with Farwell on this project. Mike Pomper was asked to discuss this with the Texico City Council and Texico Chamber of Commerce.

In other business, the Chamber:

-- Picked the State Line Tribune as the Business of the Month to be publicized in April.

-- Re-elected board directors Franse, Donna Ratke and Mary Gustin.

-- Decided to leave the dollar amount for the Chamber scholarship fund at \$500 but will take another look at it next year. Currently, one senior gets \$500. Next year, the Chamber may give out two such scholarships.

-- Finalized plans for the Saturday banquet. Mrs. Ratke pointed out that the social hour starts at 6 p.m. Mike Ratke will serve as emcee. The Chamber is setting up to feed 300.

-- Discussed dues for new members. New business members will be offered a special deal -- a \$50 payment will be good for dues through next year. Current dues are \$50 annually for businesses and \$25 annually for individuals.

ing plan for Texas counties and the payments it receives from those counties toward staff salaries.

Texas counties were ranked from 1 to 7, and Parmer County was rated a "4." Parmer County has two extension service posts -- ag agent and home economics agent.

For 1996, Parmer County will pay \$14,120 toward their overall salaries. In 1997, the Texas Ag Extension Service wants Parmer County to pay \$16,000 toward their overall salaries.

The commissioners won't vote on this request until budget discussion time this summer.

County Judge Bonnie Clayton pointed out that Parmer County saved \$5,000 in 1996 because the state agreed to pay for the extension service employees' health insurance.

A near-record crowd of more than 660 folks attended the annual meeting Tuesday of West Texas Rural Telephone Cooperative in Hereford.

The three directors were re-elected: Charles Christian, of Oklahoma Lane; Pat Robbins, of Frio, and J.B. Noland, of Summerfield.

It was noted that the co-op will be a provider for an internet type of service in the future. It will cost \$30 a month.

The net margin for the year was \$233,304.

Members who received telephone service in 1973 will be getting their share of patronage capital credit checks totaling \$155,800. That sum represents 100 percent of the capital credits allocated by the co-op for 1973.

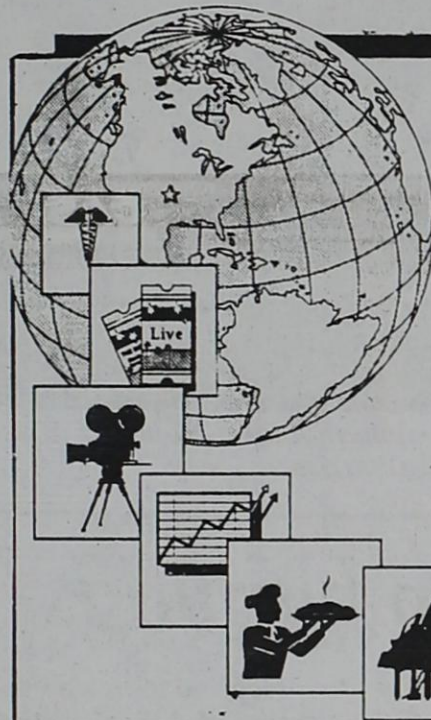

In other business, the council:

- Heard that the animal control officer plans to resign. When that's done, the council will advertise for a replacement.
- Appointed Ronnie Warmuth as the council's representative to the Ute Water Association.
- Heard that the Brown well was out because of a valve failure. The go-ahead was given to fix it at a cost about \$2,000. Kirkland Pump, Farwell, will do the work.
- Approved buying a new phone system. Folks have had a difficult time calling City Hall and it's believed the problem is with the current system.
- Agreed to put a fence around the Brown well property.
- Noted the next meeting with state officials about dealing with a property purchase of farm or ranch land for a new well. This is just in the discussion stage right now.
- Agreed to send letters to the three owners of the buildings directly east of city hall asking them to rectify the dangerous problems or face possible condemnation.
- Received three applications for swimming pool manager. They will be evaluated.
- Heard Sharp report that structures at 112 Opal and 408 Hutson that had been moved into the city are well past their deadlines for meeting city codes and still in violation. The council will discuss this at the next meeting.
- Heard Mike Pomper, representing the Farwell Chamber of Commerce, note the upcoming discussion of an overpass between Texico and Farwell (see story on Page 1). The item was put on the next council agenda.
- Discussed the agreement between Texico and Curry County to house persons arrested by Texico police at the county jail. Currently, Texico pays one "institutional" fee (about \$3,000 a year). The county now wants \$35 per day per person, plus extra costs for hospital treatment and the institutional fee. Texico city attorney Marion Rutter will contact the county attorney about this.
- Received a request from Cynthia Ortiz to bring a house from 23 miles north of Texico to Kindred and Anderson streets. The council will look at the house before deciding.

Farwell girl golfers go 1-2

Farm Bill details outlined

Cong. Larry Combest has given details of the final Farm Bill version. The bill has been tentatively agreed to by Congress and the Secretary of Agriculture has advised the President to sign it.

The 7-year farm legislation contains provisions Combest pushed for -- a fair market value for land protected by the CRP, opening the peanut market away from a government monopoly, as well as flexibility for producers to also grow vegetables as alternative crops. Also, operating and marketing provisions of the three entity rule and marketing loan program remain intact.

Landowners will continue to be able to participate in the CRP program. CRP is capped at the current 36.4 million acre

Weather data to be reviewed

Representatives of North American Weather Consultants has started to review Lubbock area weather data from 1981 to 1990 for the initial phase of a precipitation enhancement study conducted by the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1.

Researchers will extract information on climactic conditions associated with historic precipitation events in the Lubbock area from the National Weather Service data base compiled from weather balloon releases. The data will then be used to identify weather parameters of precipitation events where enhancement operations are most likely to prove effective.

The information collected from the 10-year study will be used to determine if and how often silver iodide released from ground generators is likely to reach the -5 degree Celsius level during precipi-

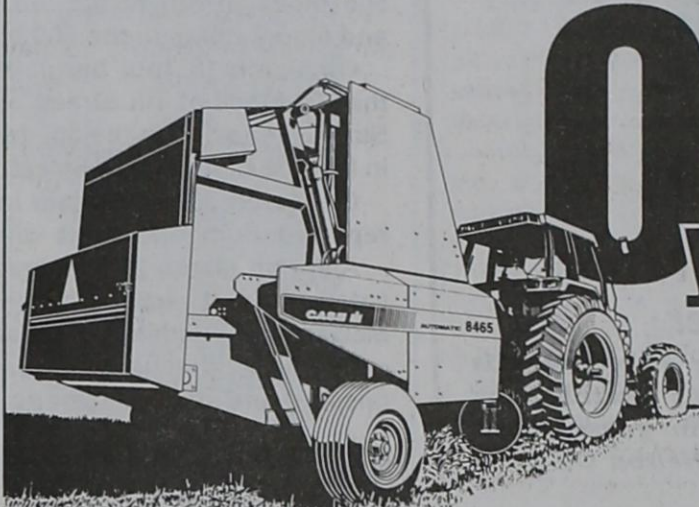
tation events. That's the temperature at which silver iodide becomes effective.

total. New enrollments and re-enrollments of existing CRP contracts will receive CRP payments at a cash rate based on the share-rental value that most farmland is rented when used for crops. During the most recent sign-up, CRP payments were inaccurately calculated on the lower cash-rental arrangements, which gave little incentive to landowners to participate in CRP, because cash-rental arrangements are usually made only on poor quality land.

More valuable and highly-erodible lands which the government pays landowners to protect under CRP would otherwise be rented out for the more profitable share arrangement of the tenant farmer's profit in the harvest on the landowner's acreage.

The crop flexibility provision allows any producer to grow vegetables on their farm program acreage, as long as the region has a history "double cropping" vegetables with commodity crops. So producers will be able to grow for vegetable processing plants without being prevented from continuing to receive full farm program aid.
