* Expenditures for 1994-95 were: direct instruction $\$ 1,550,899$; instructional support, $\$ 383,080$; administration $\$ 112,288$; business and support services, $\$ 61,598$; operation and maintenance of plant, $\$ 235,193$; food service, $\$ 2,921$ athletics, $\$ 40,757$; non instructional student support, $\$ 9,251$; community services, $\$ 2,539$; capital outlay, $\$ 74,249$-- total 2,472,775.
Revenue sources were: state, 98 percent; federal, 1 per
ent; local, 1 percent.
* The average teacher's salary was above the statewide average, as were the average expenditure per student and average administrative cost per student.
