Well, Paul made his putt, beautifully.

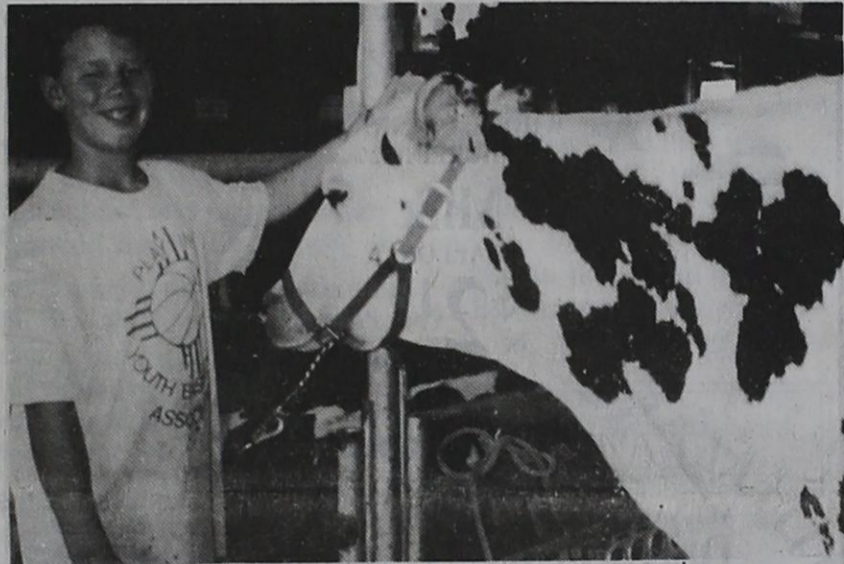
Me? Well, let's put it this way -- I DEMAND a rematch!

## Search continues for Farwell folks with New Mexico license plates

Farwell Police Chief Roy McGaa reported at Tuesday's City Council meeting that he has busy issuing citations to municipal court to Farwell residents with illegal New Mexico license plates.

Texas residents like to use New Mexico plates because they cost a lot less.

McGaa noted that "there have been attempts at hiding vehicles, but sooner or later, they will surface. Those that require surveillance to prove residency will be tackled, too."

McGaa also said that he has received complaints about how folks were treated at the Parmer County tax assessor-collector's office involving payments to transfer registration.

Parmer County tax asses-

sor-collector Doris Herington, when asked by the Tribune on Wednesday, to answer this, explained what her office has been doing.

She said that when a Texas resident comes in to change from New Mexico to Texas plates, they are charged for registration and title, plus the difference in sales tax.

That difference in sales tax can be very costly.

But if a person just moves to Parmer County from New Mexico, they only are charged a \$15 new resident fee plus, registration and title fees.

Mrs. Herington said her office has just started asking for proof from folks who say they have just come from New Mexico to Texas. They need to provide a New Mexico utility bill, or voter registration card, for example.

## Farwell EMS service, fire dep't separate

The Farwell City Council on Tuesday approved an amicable splitting of the city volunteer fire department and the city volunteer emergency medical services (EMS), the ambulance service.

There have been major disagreements within the department in recent months over how the ambulance service should be operated. Mayor Jimmie Mace has been involved in trying to seek a solution.

Aloha Fulcher will be director of the EMS, while Henry Garcia remains as fire chief.

Mrs. Fulcher noted that by having a separate EMS, it will allow Farwell to have a better chance at getting state grants.

EMS' Paul Adams said he has talked to Dr. Nancy Chasteen about her becoming their local medical director. This would be beneficial, said Adams, because it would allow EMS to offer quicker help for some problems.

Adams also asked the council for funds to buy equipment to help cardiac arrest victims. But he was told to wait and see how the fire department's funds were split with the EMS.

Veteran fireman Lee Hutchins said the ambulance service has been financed by the city and has gotten expensive to operate. He suggested that the service might be placed under the Farwell Hospital District so it could receive better funding. He noted that the hospital district has a much lower tax rate and broader tax base.

Hutchins said he has talked with hospital district board president Jack Allen Kirkland, who is receptive for a meeting with his board to study this possibility.

Hutchins pointed out, for example, that the city's "new" ambulance has over 115,000 miles on it.

In other business, the city council:

-- Amended its dog and cat ordinance to put limits on the number of pets in a household. Residents are now allowed up to 4 dogs and/or cats over the age of four months, or up to 10 puppies or kittens, under the age of four months. If more than these numbers are housed, a kennel license will be needed.

-- Increased prices to use the city cemetery because its budget was running a deficit. The "permit fee" will stay at \$125. But the lot fee is raised from \$300 to \$500, and the open and closing fee is raised from \$175 to \$300.

-- Scheduled a public hearing at the September council meeting to raise the tax rate from .3663 cents per \$100 assessed valuation to .4111. The increase is just under the amount that would call for a rollback vote, if sought.

-- Approved the proposed budget which would include \$1,000 pay raises for each city employee.

## Lazbuddie's pupil decrease causes concern

Here's a look at our local schools' first week enrollments:

### Farwell

Farwell is looking at about the same number of students it had at this time last year.

The first day enrollment showed 565 students, with about half a dozen more expected.

This included elementary school, 271 (with a large kindergarten class of about 47), up from 270 last year; junior high, 120, down from 130 last year; and high school, 174, up from 173 last year.

Last year's total was 573.

### Lazbuddie

Lazbuddie reported 199 students for their first day enrollment counts. This figure is down considerably from enrollments reported last year -- 229.

The high school enrolled 67 students, the junior high had 43 and the elementary reported 89 students.

The drop in students, plus a lower appraised valuation in the school district, will cause a financial problem for Lazbuddie.

Lazbuddie's tax rate is as high as state law allows.

-- Adopted a contingency plan ordinance, at the state's request. It's modeled after the Friona ordinance.

-- Received a letter from Charles Aycock suggesting the city write the state and request a hearing before Farwell Feed Yard expands. Many folks have complained this summer of feed lot odors in Farwell. The council approved asking the state to hold a hearing when the state discusses the expansion request.

chief's office into the old jail behind the Parmer County courthouse.

County Sheriff Walt Yerger said work will begin in January on converting the old jail into a new training center. When completed, the area will contain a secure office area and he has offered part of it to Farwell as a way of centralizing public safety service.

Yerger said the only request he had was for Farwell to allow Farwell Police Chief Roy McGaa to continue service as a training officer for county police. And the only items that would be supplied by the city would be phone service and furniture for the office.

McGaa backed the idea because his current office is located in the city employee break area. He also noted that half of his office furniture has been supplied by the sheriff's office so that cost is negligible.

-- Heard McGaa report that the new pistol and rifle range at the city landfill is expected to be fully operational later this year. He credited Yerger with massive help, including getting donations of lumber and other material from area businesses. The sheriff's posse has also volunteered material and labor.

McGaa also said that a big thank you should go to drug dealers since police are working diligently at confiscating their vehicles, homes, etc., and selling them to buy police equipment, such as being used at the shooting range.

# Meals-on-Wheels program needs volunteers

Volunteers are desperately needed for the local Meals on Wheels program.

Currently, four local churches are signed up to deliver the meals, but due to work schedules, illnesses and other factors, many church volunteers are unable to deliver meals for their designated time.

"The church groups are scheduled for three months at a time to deliver the meals," said Maurine Caywood, local coordinator for the program. "We could sure use some more help, either in more church groups or organizations or individuals willing to volunteer about an hour of their time to get the meals to the recipients."

There are nine recipient households on the delivery list at this time. Some of these households receive more than one meal, due to couples or housemates being signed up for the program. Each recipient pays for their meals through an account at the Farwell Convalescent Center, where the meals are prepared and picked up for delivery.

"The recipients are in both Farwell and Texico," said Mrs. Caywood. "The meals are picked up at 11:30 a.m. cst(10:30 a.m. mst) and delivered seven days a week to the homes. If the people aren't at home to receive their meal, the volunteer needs to bring the meal back to the Convalescent Center, so that the recipients aren't charged for that meal."

Recipients are also urged to contact the Convalescent Center to notify the cafeteria in advance if they aren't going to be home for delivery. This greatly helps the volunteers and cuts back on waste.

The First Baptist Church in Texico is currently on the schedule to deliver meals through the month of September.

The 9th Street Church of Christ will then begin delivery October through December.

"Even though we have groups scheduled to deliver, we still need more help. If a person or group can't deliver on particular days or weeks, for whatever reasons, we have to have people to fill in for them," said Mrs. Caywood. "It would also be nice to split the three month schedules with other groups or persons that want to get involved."

For information and sign-ups, contact Mrs. Caywood at her home at 482-9264 or at the Senior Citizens Center in Texico at 482-3835. She is there all day Tuesdays and Thursdays and afternoons on Wednesdays.

"Any and all help will be greatly appreciated," she stated.

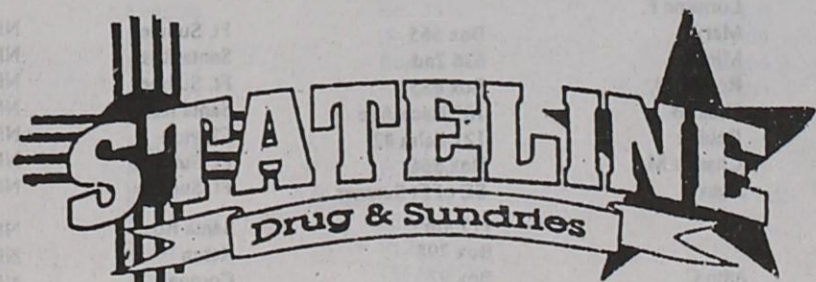
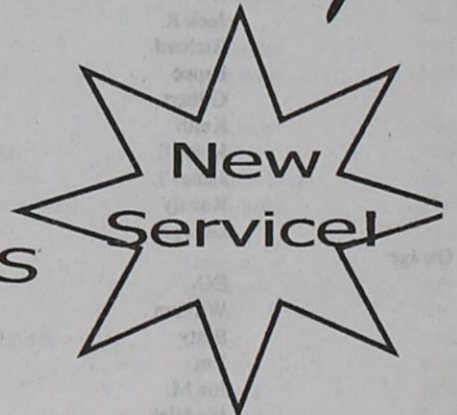

Scisson said if they can develop the offensive line and defense, they have a good chance at winning district again.

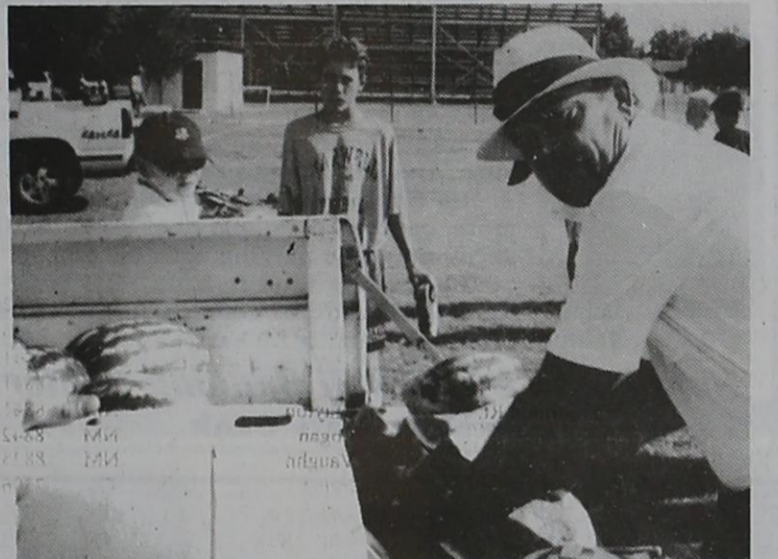

## Bicycles registered during safety rodeo

The Texico-Farwell Bicycle Safety Rodeo held on Aug. 15 was a success, and congratulations to all who made it possible.

Bicycling teaches youngsters balance. It strengthens leg muscles and gets that old heart pumping. It builds coordination, used arms to steer and legs to propel. The rodeo, held besides Farwell's courthouse, gave kids a chance to show off their skills, develop new ones and learn safety habits.

Youths learned hand signals, road signs and some rules of the road. They learned the value of wearing a helmet which could save their lives. They took turns going through the course, which required youths to show knowledge of the rules of the road, and to demonstrate they could stop and start their bicycles as directed.

Bicycles were checked to make sure they were in good working order. Tightening a chain or adjusting the brakes could save a life or it could just make riding more enjoyable. Adults were on hand to help with such adjustments.

Folks running the bicycle safety rodeo were from our area police and fire departments, plus county extension office, volunteers and others. They had the whole course laid out in advance. Traffic cones were used and they had displays to teach the children about safety. There were even two youngsters dressed as crash test dummies.

Youngsters who participated were of all ages, some who appeared to be only about 5 years old. Many rode the course with training wheels on their bikes. There also were some mountain bikes and lightweight 10-speed types, too.

Each bicycle was registered during the rodeo. Thus, if the bike is stolen or lost, law enforcement officials will know where to return it. Several years back, the sheriff's department discovered a ring of "bicycle nappers." They recovered many bicycles which stayed locked up behind the sheriff's office. Some bikes had been registered -- they were swiftly returned. Others were not.

Kids also could purchase helmets for only \$4. They also could be used when skateboarding or roller skating.
