## Bollworm population peaked

The first week of August brought lower temperatures and some much needed moisture to the area. Although rain is al-
ways welcome, it was, the for the most part, too late. Area ways welcome, it was, the for the most part, too late. Area clops win. Farwell received 1.5 inches of rain, according to the PET weather station. September has been drier but tom peratures remained above normal for the most part giving peratures remained above normal for the most part, giving Cotton bollworm populations peaked from bolls.
Cotton bollworm populations peaked from Aug. 10-26 here as moths moved from maturing corn into cotton. Some fields extended bollworm period.
With the cooler temperatures in August. verticillium wilt was seen in area cotton fields. This wilt is characterized by brown streaking in the stem, whereas a healthy plant would have a solid white stem.
Boll weevils are making their presence known as their late season migration continues. This results in weevils traveling many miles northward from maturing fields down south in search of fields that still have squares and soft bolls to feed on. Plains Cotton Growers and the Texas ag extension service GRIP traps showed significant increases in weevil numbers starting in late August. Parmer County, with 27 traps, showed 2 last week, while Bailey County, with 24 traps, caught 181. This is the typical pattern we have seen the last three years. These late weevils pose little threat to this year's crop but can provide earlier problems next year. Producers are encouraged boll weevils if they saw boll wail activity in their fields. Timely use of harvest aids will deeny lacte weevils their fieds. nity to feed and gain aids wit do Late aphid infestations in early opening cotton posed a possible sticky cotton problems early on. However, parasitic wasps cleared out remaining populations.
Smut is very evident in corn fields throughout the area that was stressed by early hail or lack of adequate water. This was an unforgiving season on corn with limited irrigation.
Greenbug populations in sorghum peaking Aug. 10-20. Most fields received an insecticide application with remaining greenbugs soon eliminated by parasitic wasps. Some sorghum fields that were stressed did not pollinate. For those who are wondering if this season will ever end, it's coming around the

In their biggest victory in years, the Farwell Steers ran their record to 3-0 last Friday at home, upsetting the highlyranked Nazareth Swifts, 8-7
Farwell plays at Kress tonight (Friday) at 7:30 in another non-district game.
Both teams scored one touchdown; the difference was a trick play that Farwell used in scoring a two-point conversion. It also was a game of halves -- Nazareth dominated the first half, while Farwell came on strong the second half. Both eams had a hard
The game opened with Spencer Ketcherside tackling the kick returner at the Nazareth 14. Kolby Kimbrough had a TDsaving tackle on defense, and Michael Ancira had a strong tackle.
Nazareth had a 4th and 4 at the Farwell 35 when their QB was gang tackled for a 5 -yard loss.
On Farwell's first play, Ancira burst up the gut for 25 yards. In Nazareth territory, Farwell went for it on 4th and 3. Tyler Chadwick hit Tobe Diaz with a 7 -yard pass. The Steers got to the Swifts' 15 and had 4th and 3 again. This time, a Chadwick aerial was tipped incomplete.
On defense, Chadwick and Grant Oppliger had good tackles as Nazareth moved the ball downfield and the first quarter ended.

The snap went over the punter's head and Schwertner tackled the punter at the Nazareth 11. On 4th and 3, Farwell went for it -- but was stopped at the 3. Nazareth was stopped and forced to punt again. And, again, the snap went over the punter's head. This time Farwell took over on the Swifts' 8. Ancira bulled for five hard yards. Then Diaz scored on 3rd down around end from the 4 with $6: 17$ left. Then Farwell decided to go for broke, trying for a 2 -point conversion -- a win or a loss. On a hidden ball reverse, Ketcherside scored the 2 points.
Farwell kicked to the Swifts' 36. Schwertner recovered a fumble at the Steers' 48 with 4:44 left. Farwell then ran out the clock.
