

I believe the cross country training that the Lady Blue did sure has paid off in a big way.



Farwell firemen get funds for training

The Farwell City Council on Tuesday heard a request from the Farwell volunteer fire department for funds to help upgrade their training.

Fire Department Chief Henry Garcia and Paul Fulcher, training officer, said Texas Tech University will be offering a class whereby EMTs (emergency medical technicians) can move up a notch to be EMTIs (emergency medical technician intermediate). Tentatively, it would be given in Farwell.

Fulcher explained that EMTs are only allowed to offer basic life support help -- externally. But EMTIs can do much more, including chest decompression, IV's, use internal drugs, putting in tubes, etc.

The firemen said six department members would like to take the class for the upgrading but it costs about \$750 per student. Fulcher said those taking the class will guarantee they will stay here for a given period of time and also, if they fail the class, will pay for it themselves.

Of the six wanting to take the class, three live in Farwell and three reside in Parmer County.

The council agreed to pay the cost for the three who live in Farwell but asked Fulcher to approach the Parmer County Commissioners for financial help for the others. If he doesn't get funding there, he was asked to come back to the council (Continued on Page 8)

(Continued from Page 1) On my side of the family, we have traditions that range from the type of trimming used on packages to a particular type of photograph that must be taken each and every time the Christmas tree is decorated. Since the time that I was three, I have always been given one gift by my mother that is topped off with a well-worn Christmas elf. I always save this gift for last and I savor the time of carefully lifting the elf off the package and holding him for yet another Christmas morning. I always say a little prayer to the Lord for blessing me with such a wonderful mother and bringing us together in health and love. He is then carefully tucked away in a safe place to be used next year.

It is also a tradition in my family to focus on the true meaning of the season. Two years ago, my husband and I purchased a new decoration for our Christmas tree. It is a large, dull edged spike nail. It is the Christmas nail and it is meant to remind us that the Christmas season foreshadows the season of the Christ tree. This is the Easter season and the Christ tree is the Cross that Jesus was nailed to and died upon to save us all. We hang this decoration together and we reflect on how joyous this time of celebrating the birth of Christ truly is to us all.

We have many friends that come from various ethnic backgrounds that blend their cultures into their Christmas celebrations. Flo Davis, of Oklahoma Lane, told me of how her family would come together in a Polish tradition each Christmas Eve. The family would gather in a circle and pass a large flat bread wafer to each person. As each one held the wafer, they told of the many blessings and good fortune they had and thanked God for them. They would then take and eat a piece of the wafer and then pass it on to the next person.

I experienced the celebration of Hanukkah with a friend of mine in college. The lighting of the Menorah is a truly beautiful tradition. Suzanne Miller openly discussed her Jewish beliefs and the reasons for many of their traditions. While, our beliefs were vastly different, I held the generations of tradition that had been passed down to Suzanne in much regard.

A tradition doesn't have to be centuries old to become a tradition, however. Someone can start a tradition by trying something different and if it is favorably received by the family, it can be implemented. Some people have traditions that they didn't even know were traditions.

I know a lady by the name of Caroline Stutton that felt her family was lacking in holiday traditions until she realized that her children anxiously awaited the first weekend of each December. "We always went to the mountains and gathered pine cones and pine boughs and spruce sprigs that we would then craft into homemade wreaths," she explained. "My children looked forward to this time together and thought of new ways to decorate their wreaths each year."

Humorously enough and simple enough, one tradition that most families have in common is the giving of underwear and socks each Christmas. It has also become one tradition that is sorely missed by those that refuse to give into the tradition or have given it up for the sake of "better gifts!"

Holiday traditions are important to all members of a family. They give a sense of permanence, comfort and anticipation. And more importantly, traditions don't have to be expensive. The most cherished ones are usually those that don't cost a penny. There are thousands of ways to take part in traditions - sing in a Christmas program, gather the family up and go to church advent services, make cookies together, start an ornament collection...the list goes on. 

Weights on all animals must be turned in to the Parmer County extension office in the county courthouse by 5 p.m. on Friday, Jan. 3.


Judge for the event will be Kenneth Lujan, a former ag teacher at Estancia, N.M. He also served as judge here last January.

Christ was rejected by His own. "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to them that believe on His name" (John 1:12). Those who believe on the name of Christ have a right to become children of God. It does not say that those who believe are children; rather those who believe have a right (power) to become children.

One of the most widespread and erroneous tenets held by many professed Christians is the idea of justification by "faith only." It is supposed that one becomes a child of God simply by believing in Christ. "Only trust Him" is the hue and cry. But our inspired text makes it clear that the believer has the **right to become** God's child. More than faith is required to **achieve** childhood in God's family.

If one is saved at the point of faith, why should demons shudder? If salvation is by "faith only," will not demons be saved (Jas. 2:19)? If one can be saved by faith, apart from works (obedience), is he not saved by a "dead faith?" "Faith apart from works is dead" (Jas. 2:26). If faith alone is required, why were the believers on Pentecost told to repent and be baptized (Acts 2:38)? And why did Christ say, "he that believeth and is baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16:16)? If faith is the single requirement for salvation, why is one called on to "add to faith" (2 Pet. 1:5f)? If faith alone produces a child of God, why does John say that believers have a right to **become** children?

Truth is, faith is very essential. But real faith motivates one to repent and be baptized -- and live the Christian life. "For ye are all sons of God by faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ did put on Christ" (Gal. 3:26,27). One is not a child of God until he has experienced the new birth (John 3:3f).

Nell informed members that she will present a program at a later meeting of past presidents who will bring their scrapbooks and their favorite memories of ESA. This should be a wonderful program.



Well, we got to the entrance and no extra tickets could be found and baby Jill had to have her own ticket. So we sent Abby one of our cell phones and the car keys with the Riddles. We took Drew and Jill and watched Ukraine, Romania and China.

After a few hours, we called the Riddles. We met them at Centennial Park with Abby and gave them our ticket stubs so they could watch, too. In the other events, you were not allowed to leave and re-enter a venue. With all three kids and in 99 degree temperature, we explored the Olympic park. I lis-

Scott and I, plus some friends, watched the U.S. women's softball team on Tuesday in Columbus, Ga. The U.S. ladies entered the stadium near where we sat. I turned into a giddy 8 year old and screamed "Dot!" She flashed that now famous smile and waved at me! The U.S. ladies beat the Netherlands easily. Dot smacked a 3-run homer, as did teammate Michelle Smith.

The only thing the Dutch had going for them was an enthusiastic group of 10 or so college-age guys. Each donned interesting headgear of bright orange and mostly tasseled. Near the game's end, they were doing a conga line through the stands.

Scott and I returned July 24 to see the U.S. ladies take on Taiwan. The U.S. obviously outclassed all the competition. The U.S. team was so nice, staying on the field and in the venue to sign balls and programs until the staff made the fans stop. It was obvious they were grateful to have some welldeserved recognition at last. they were truly strong athletes.

We watched the U.S. baseball team twice. They were unstoppable against the Japanese with many standouts. However, the Sunday game was different. Cuba was up by 2 before our peanuts were cool. The U.S. lost in the 9th, 11-8, a heartbreaker. We went downtown and got bit by the pin bug. It was the cool thing to get the most obscure pin possible.



The proverbial gift of underwear is thoughtful, practical and downright necessary in my family, at least.





The U.S. liberation of Guam wasn't easy

(Editor's note: U.S. Navy Commander Will Anderson, a Farwell High graduate, is the son of Bob and Carrie Anderson. Periodically over the years, he has sent articles about his postings as features for the Tribune. Currently, he is stationed in Guam. Following is one of several articles he has sent us about that fascinating island.)

Guam's culture goes back thousands of years to the ancestors of the Chamorro people, but that chapter of its history which is most evident in World War II. Japan invaded Guam hours after the bombing of Pearl Harbor in December 1941, and the U.S. Marines and Army were landed by the U.S. Navy and Coast Guard in July 1944 to take it back. Attu and Kiska, in the Aleutian Islands, had been liberated in 1943, so this was the last American territory over which the Rising Sun of the Japanese flag still flew.


The landings took place north and south of the Orote Peninsula and Apra Harbor (where Naval Activities Guam is located today). Fighting their way over the reefs and up the steep slopes, the U.S. Marines and the U.S. Army broke the first line of Japanese defense around the beaches. The Japanese moved the bulk of their forces to the north of the island and threw up another line of defense between Barrigada and Finegayan. Their last organized defense was around the village of Yigo and Mount Santa Rosa and the island was declared secure on 10 August 1944.

The Japanese had executed more than 7,000 Chamorros in less than three years of occupation. When the pre-invasion bombardment and bombings of Guam began by the U.S. Navy in 1944, the Japanese executed any Chamorro they thought might pass information to the American soldiers about Japanese fortifications after the invasion began. The rest of the Chamorro population was forced into concentration camps near Yona where many more of them died due to the harsh conditions and treatment.

With the American forces pushing on into the north of the island, the Japanese soldiers also collected all the Japanese inhabitants of Guam who had served the Japanese forces in preparing for their attack in 1941, and in their occupation of the Chamorro people. They took them to a cliff above the (Continued on Page 8)




A Japanese Navy coastal defense gun at Agat beachhead.

Apricot Cream Cheese Shortcake

1 package (6 oz.) dried apricots, snipped into bite-size pieces.

Sweet Potatoes and Honey

- 3-4 lg. sweet potatoes
- 4 T. butter or margarine

1/2 tsp. cinnamon

1/2 c. honey.

Peal and quarter potatoes. Place in a large saucepan with enough water to cover halfway. Cook over low heat until just tender, about 15 minutes. Spray 13x9 inch baking dish with non-stick cooking spray. Remove potatoes from saucepan with a large slotted spoon; reserve cooking liquid. Arrange potatoes in baking dish. Pour 1/4 c. of reserved cooking liquid over potatoes. Dot with 4 Tbs. butter. Sprinkle cinnamon over potatoes and drizzle honey over all. Bake uncovered in 350 degree F. oven for 30 minutes until liquid is reduced and syrupy. Makes 6-8 servings.

sea called Pati Point and directed them to jump off in a mass hara-kiri, just as the Japanese had committed mass suicide on the cliffs of Saipan (an island to the north) a few weeks earlier. An American bombardment of Pati Point scattered the Japanese soldiers and their Japanese civilians, canceling the attempt at mass suicide, so ironically this bombardment by artillery and aircraft saved more lives than it took.

American soldiers and marines liberated the Chamorros from the concentration camps and accepted volunteers, eager to help hunt the Japanese down in the jungles. The Japanese had tortured and beheaded Chamorros for years for helping to hide Americans in the jungle since the 1941 invasion. (the only one to survive the whole occupation until the Americans returned was a sailor named George Raymond Tweed.) The Chamorros of a village called Merizo in the south of Guam had seen all the leaders and strongest young men herded into caves and killed with grenades and machine guns, and they struck back. When American forces arrived in Merizo, all the Japanese were already dead or fleeing, and Merizo had the bitter consolation of knowing that it was the only village which liberated itself. Just 20 miles to the north, the Japanese General Obata and his force of 60 officers and men had constructed a command bunker in a dense sinkhole south of the village of Mataguac. The Chamorros of this village who had been forced labor on this project were then all beheaded to keep them silent. General Obata and all his men died in these bunkers a few days later.

Navajo Indians had been trained in radio procedures, because no Japanese could understand, or had probably ever even heard this language. The Japanese did not begin to use Kamikaze suicide bomber aircraft in great numbers until they were defending home soil on Okinawa, but Guam was the last time that they tried massive "human wave" attacks to any great extent. After the enormous losses they took in futile attacks into machine-gun fire on Guam, Japanese officers on other islands were told to order their soldiers to stay in their holes, never surrender, and to take as many lives as they could before they died.

When the island was declared secure by 11 August, 1,769 Americans were dead and more than 6,000 were wounded. Body counts revealed that 10,971 Japanese had been killed, and almost no Japanese soldiers surrendered. In the next 4 months, American-Chamorro teams patrolled the cliffs and jungles and the wardogs of the marine K-9 corps, offering surrender to Japanese stragglers. Almost none did surrender, and an additional 4,926 Japanese were killed. Over the

next 25 years, Japanese soldiers continued to surrender, either individually or in groups, and the last Japanese soldier, Sergeant Shoichi Yokoi, was captured in January 1972.


The rest of the Japanese soldiers who refused to surrender are believed to have died long ago in their isolated caves and holes of malnutrition or disease, and their remains will probably never be found. If there are such things as ghosts, they have joined the thousands of other ghosts in these jungles at night, moving sadly past the trees, the overgrown foxholes, and the rusting equipment.
