## Grand jury expected soon in union case

If you've been wondering what the status of the investigation is concerning the missing funds of over \$300,000 from the Parmer County Teachers Credit Union, it appears an indictment may be coming soon -- but don't bet on it.

In October 1996, an audit of the now-defunct Parmer County Teachers Credit Union revealed that \$300,000 to \$350,000 was missing. The FBI took over the case.

Parmer County Sheriff Rex Williams told the Tribune on Tuesday that FBI agent Blaine Westlake, in charge of the investigation, said it has been turned over to the U.S. District Attorney's office and may go to the Grand Jury next week or as soon as possible after that.

But this isn't the first time that action has been promised on the matter, so don't hold your breath.

Williams said he had been told by the FBI that an indictment would be presented by Christmas 1996. That's right -- 1996.

And phone calls and requests for status reports by Williams and Friona School Supt. Hal Ratcliff have been repeatedly ignored over the past several months, said Williams.

The Tribune contacted the U.S. Attorney's office on Monday and was told by Mark Nichols that they had no comment on the case.

## Grant to be sought to upgrade Elva Avenue

The age-old problem of the condition of Avenue F was again discussed at Tuesday's Texico City Council meeting.

Part of Avenue F (at the south edge of town) is in the city limits. It's called Elva Avenue and runs between College and Garwood.

All the folks who live along Elva live in the county, not the city, except for one.

Councilman Rick Queener will go to Santa Fe to see if the state will budget some funds (as much as \$70,000) to chip seal the dirt road.

And county commissioner Bruce Deavours said he hopes the county will maintain the road, too.

Last month's snows made the dirt road very difficult to drive on.

One hundred and forty-one animals were sold at the county show, taking in \$65,100 (plus any add-ons).

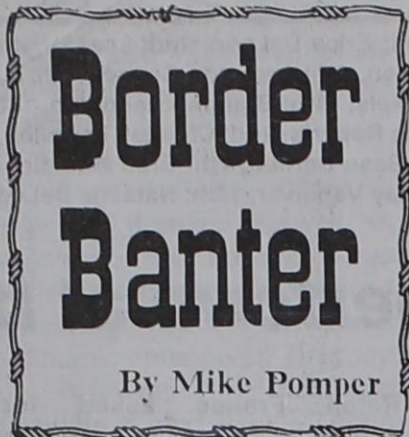
This compares to last year's show when 140 animals were sold for \$59,424 (plus any add-ons).

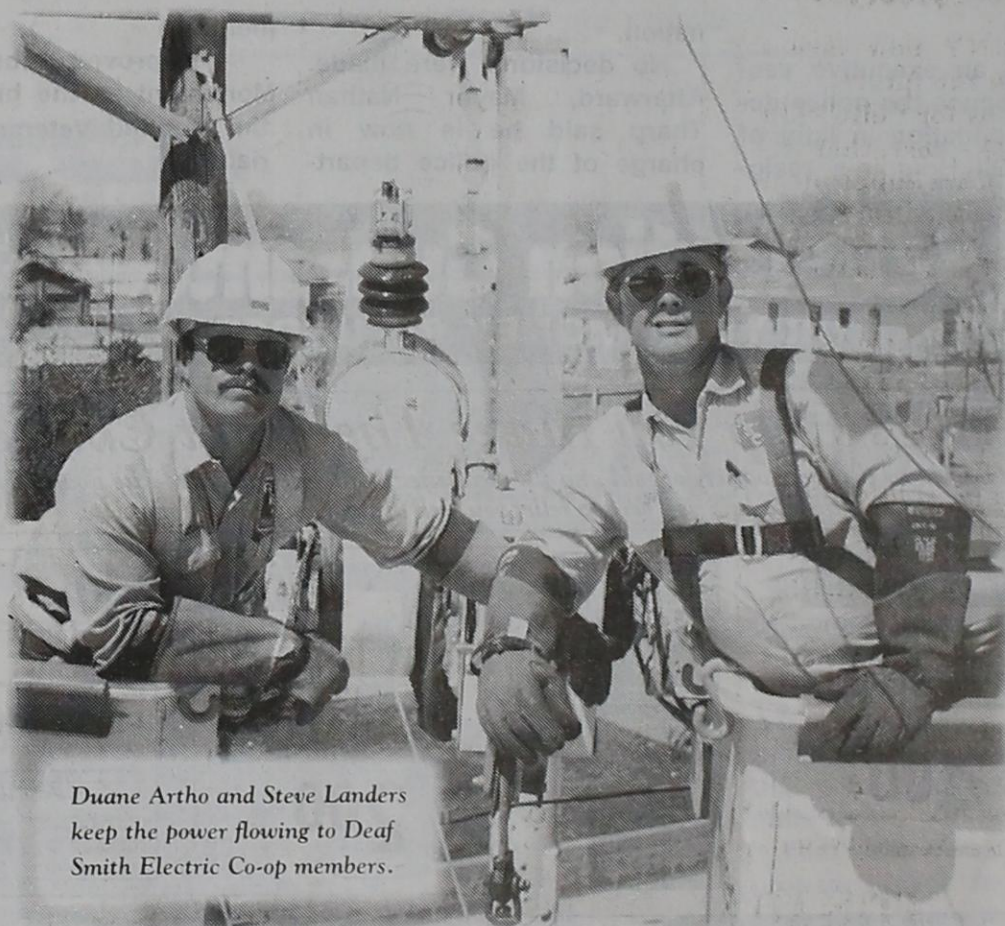

## Bailey County Co-op offers scholarships

Bailey County Electric Co-operative has provided scholarships to students within the area since 1961. But a new state law allows nonprofit electric cooperatives to put unclaimed funds - previously collected by the comptroller's office for the state general fund, to use for student scholarships. This means that up to \$800,000 in new rural scholarships may be available through electric cooperatives this year. The new law states that scholarship recipients should be rural students and they must attend college, technical school or other post-secondary educational institutions. A stipulation is that contributions to the funds from all electric cooperatives in the state cannot exceed \$800,000 per year. ### A BORN-AGAIN CHRISTIAN

One is begotten for life when the seed (Word of God) is implanted in his heart and faith is developed (Jas. 1:21; 1 John 5:1). When faith becomes sufficiently strong that one is buried in baptism and brought forth (delivered) into newness of life. He becomes a child of God and God adds him to the church, God's family (Acts 2:47). The same thing that makes one a child of God, makes that one a member of the family of God. And all of God's children are in God's family; every one!

A Christian is a disciple, a follower of Christ (Acts 11:26). Sadly, many of God's children do not follow Christ. And if one does not follow Christ he is not a true Christian (John 8:31,32). Unfaithful children will be disinherited.
