If you've been wondering what the status of the investigation is concerning the missing funds of over $\$ 300,000$ from the Parmer County Teachers Credit Union, it appears an indictment may be coming soon -- but don't bet on it.
In October 1996, an audit County Tow-derunct Parmer County Teachers Credit Union revealed that $\$ 300,000$ to FBI took was the casing The FBI took over the case.
Parmer County Sheriff Rex Williams told the Tribune on Westlake, in charge of the investigation, said it has been vestigation, said it has been Attorney's office and may go to the Grand Jury next week or as soon as possible after that.
