Grand jury expected soon in union case

If you've been wondering what the status of the investigation is concerning the missing funds of over \$300,000 from the Parmer County Teachers Credit Union, it appears an indictment may be coming soon -- but don't bet on it.

In October 1996, an audit of the now-defunct Parmer County Teachers Credit Union revealed that \$300,000 to \$350,000 was missing. The FBI took over the case.

Parmer County Sheriff Rex Williams told the Tribune on Tuesday that FBI agent Blaine Westlake, in charge of the investigation, said it has been turned over to the U.S. District Attorney's office and may go

Williams said he had been told by the FBI that an indictment would be presented by Christmas 1996. That's right --1996.

And phone calls and requests for status reports by Williams and Friona School Supt. Hal Ratcliff have been repeatedly ignored over the past several months, said Williams.

The Tribune contacted the U.S. Attorney's office on Monday and was told by Mark Nichols that they had no comment on the case.


The Disney channel, previously a premium channel, will become part of the Standard Service lineup and remain on Channel 28.

A BORN-AGAIN CHRISTIAN

There is no other kind!

It is slightly amusing and greatly pathetic to hear some expressions of twentieth century moderns. One such saying, often uttered by sophisticated people: "I'm a born-again Christian." The implication is that there are other kinds of Christians; Christians who have not been born again. This is but one more example of man's misunderstanding in a benighted, mixed-up, world.

Every real Christian (follower of Christ) has been born again. But not all born-again people are faithful disciples of Christ.

It is the office of the new birth to produce a child of God and introduce one into the family of God, the church. Christ "Except one be born of water and the Spirit, he cannot see the kingdom of. One is begotten for life when the seed (Word of God) is implanted in his heart and faith is developed (Jas. 1:21; 1 John 5:1). When faith becomes sufficiently strong that one is buried in baptism and brought forth (delivered) into newness of life. He becomes a child of God and God adds him to the church, God's family (Acts 2:47). The same thing that makes one a child of God, makes that one a member of the family of God. 




