## Texico council votes to reconsider variance request

The Texico City Council voted Tuesday to reconsider the request for a variance from Jose and Re
Last month, the council told the Martinezes to remove the house because it didn't meet city codes, chiefly that it didn't have 800 square feet. Also, 27 percent of responses of neaby property owners opposed the variance.
The Martinezes were represented by Portales attorney Eric Dixon who pointed out that there was another small house in the area (it was "grandfathered in" before the current ordinance was passed) and that several nearby trailers had received variances.
In deciding to reconsider the variance, the council said that if city codes are not met, they won't approve the variance. At city attorney Marion Ty Rutter's urging, the regular variance request route is being taken again, and nearby property owners will be written to again.
