We have definitely enjoyed the games this year and are looking forward to the Winter Olympics in 1998. At least the two year break gives me enough time to recuperate and heal my body. It also gives me time to work on my 2 1/2 vertical figure skating spin and my buildup of speed and control in the giant slalom ski race.

Area schools schedule grid workouts, scrimmages

It's football time! Here's how the workout schedule looks for area teams:

Farwell

Pre-season 2-a-day workouts for Farwell Steer football players begin at 8 a.m. on Aug. 7 at the Farwell football field.

All returning players, and new players, need to be there.

The first week will stress running and conditioning, learning basic plays and safety. Helmets, pads and other equipment will be passed out later when the team begins working on blocking and tackling.

Players will practice each day from 8 to 10:30 a.m., then against from 6 to 8:30 p.m.

Farwell's first scrimmage will be at 10 a.m. cdt on Aug. 24 against Texico at Wolverine Field.

The Steers also will scrimmage Whiteface (there) on Aug. 30. The time will be announced later, said coach Stan Stroebel.

Texico

Texico's 2-a-day football practices will start on Aug. 12. All interested players are asked to show up at the dressing room of the high school gym.

Practices will be held from 7 to 9 a.m. mt and from 6 to 8 p.m. mt. Each player will need to have a physical exam prior to the start of the season.

Players need to bring their physical exam forms, insurance forms and parent permission forms to practice.

Texico's first scrimmage will be against Farwell (see information in Farwell report).

Lazbuddie

Once again, the 6-man football squad will be under the direction of veteran coach Mark Scisson.

The Longhorns begin 2-a-day workouts at 7 a.m. on Aug. 7.

They will have one workout at 7 a.m. and a second one at 7 p.m. each day. The workouts will begin with non-contact activities such as conditioning exercises and learning basic plays. Contact activities will begin about a week later.

All players will need to have a physical before the season begins. The school has made arrangements so that players can get a free physical at 2 p.m. on Aug. 4 at the Mule-shoe gym.

Or, players may have a physical exam by the doctor of their choice if they wish to pay for it.

The Longhorns open their season with a scrimmage against Groom at Silverton at 5 p.m. on Aug. 23.

A second scrimmage will be against Chillicothe, ranked No. 2 in the state, at Matador at 6 p.m. on Aug. 30.

Texico council votes to reconsider variance request

The Texico City Council voted Tuesday to reconsider the request for a variance from Jose and Rene Martinez to move a house to Anderson and Kindred streets.
