## Lazbuddie teacher finds success at state competitions

The education Marsella Jennings provides students at Lazbuddie Schools is more than a mere job -- it's a standard of excellence not often achieved even by the best teachers.

Marsella was recently honored by the state of Texas for her contributions and outstanding work both as an educator and sponsor in U.I.L. academic events. She received the Dennis-U.I.L. Sponsor Excellence Award given to only 10 sponsors throughout the state from all areas (i.e. athletics, music, academics) combined. Such an award is a rare, but well-deserved honor for the recipients, and Mrs. Jennings is no different, having proved her worthiness repeatedly during her career at Lazbuddie.

Mrs. Jennings has taught for the past 12 years at Lazbuddie, in subjects ranging from business math, economics, gifted/talented, and yearbook to her present classes in accounting and computer applications. But perhaps her forte lies in her sponsorship and coaching of U.I.L. events.

For the past several years, Mrs. Jennings has been in charge of U.I.L. Accounting, a contest whose success at Lazbuddie is rapidly becoming phenomenal. The tradition began in 1991, the first year a Lazbuddie individual competed at the state level. The next year, two students made it to state and in 1993, team competition opened in Texas. Lazbuddie captured the first team state championship title in accounting as they have every year since.

Many teachers and administrators, not just in this area but throughout the state, marvel at Lazbuddie's overwhelming success and wonder what secrets Mrs. Jennings holds in coaching students to such high levels of achievement.

"There really aren't any secrets," she said. "It's just hard work."

Dedication and hard work are definite requirements, and students who are willing to provide it are sometimes rarities as well. So what inspires these students to give up a little of their carefree fun to dedicate themselves to something like accounting?

"It's just like in football or athletics: once a tradition is established, other students see that and want to jump on the bandwagon and be a part of that accomplishment," she explained. "They see what their peers have done and think 'Hey, maybe I can do that too.'"

But Mrs. Jennings also notes that students in this program come in knowing they are expected to work and do so throughout the entire school year. Accounting is a difficult contest in that not only must students know the material but be able to perform quickly as well as it is a timed competition.

So when school begins, students start going through the book with the goal of finishing it and having time to just practice at the end, something that requires some of their own personal time. They come in early before school and stay afterwards to work on the contest, scheduling around many of their other activities and responsibilities.

Mrs. Jennings, of course, must be the determining factor in how well the students are prepared and thus how well they perform. She is likewise dedicated to not only helping them learn the material but in inspiring them to keep the tradition alive. If a student wants to work, then she will be there to help them, regardless.

However, Mrs. Jennings does have a little time for personal interests of her own. Her husband is co-owner of Jennings Land & Cattle, so much of her time is spent in supporting him as a farm- and house-wife. They have a daughter, Mia, who has graduated from Baylor and resides in Waco.

Mrs. Jennings is also the organist at the First Baptist Church in Muleshoe and she and her husband enjoy attending Texas Tech games when they find time in their busy schedules.

Lazbuddie is fortunate to not only have exceptionally talented students with unique and admirable work ethics, but a teacher who is willing to cultivate those qualities and help bring them to full fruition. So while some may be surprised at Mrs. Jennings' continued success at the state level, members of the Lazbuddie community knew the jewel they possessed all along.

## Texas releases school ratings

The Texas Education Agency last Friday released its annual accountability ratings and Farwell Schools did superbly.

"They were the best scores we have ever had," said Supt. Richard Boothby.

The rating system goes in this order:

Exemplary is first, followed by recognized, acceptable, and low performing.

Farwell's overall accreditation status was "recognized," as it was last year.

But two of Farwell's three campuses -- the high school and the junior high school -- were rated "exemplary."

Farwell Elementary School was "recognized," and was close to the "exemplary" rating.

Last year, only Farwell High School was "exemplary."

This was the high school's third year in a row to get "exemplary" status.

Rankings are based on student test scores and dropout rates. School districts may release them to the public if they wish.

Farwell's attendance rates were:

High school, 96.3 percent; junior high, 97.7 percent; and elementary, 97.3 percent.

Here's a look at the totals from the TAAS (Texas Assessment of Academic Skills):

High School -- reading, 96.3 percent passed; math, 100 percent passed; and writing, 96.3 percent passed.

Junior high -- reading, 96.8 percent passed; math, 97.8 percent passed; and writing, 100 percent passed.

Elementary -- reading, 86.6 percent passed; math, 89.2 percent passed; and writing, 96.2 percent passed.

## Lazbuddie

Supt. Phil Warren reports that Lazbuddie Schools also did very well in this state

yardstick.

Lazbuddie has one campus (kindergarten through 12th grade) and it received a "recognized" ranking.

Last year, Lazbuddie had an "acceptable" rating because one sub-group scored below 70 percent.

This year, all of Lazbuddie's scores were up significantly:

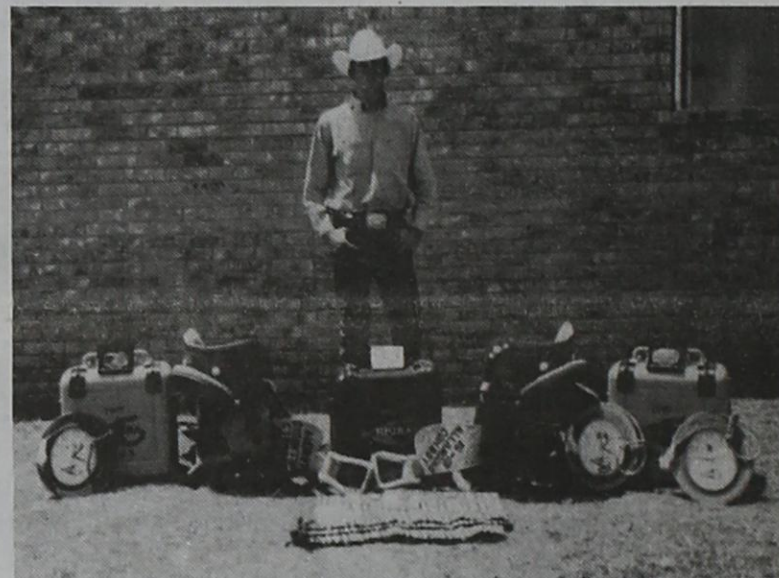
Reading, 92.3 percent, up from 88.7 percent last year; writing, 94.1 percent, up from 86.8 percent; and math, 89.6

percent, up from 80.4 percent.

One hundred and thirty-five students were tested. Lazbuddie was just short of being an "exemplary" campus due to one sub-group getting a 77.8 percent in the math category.

"We made a big jump and I feel very good about it," said Warren.

But he stressed that the state's "report card" is just one yardstick to use in judging how well a school is doing.

## Clyde Jenkins wins All Around Saddle

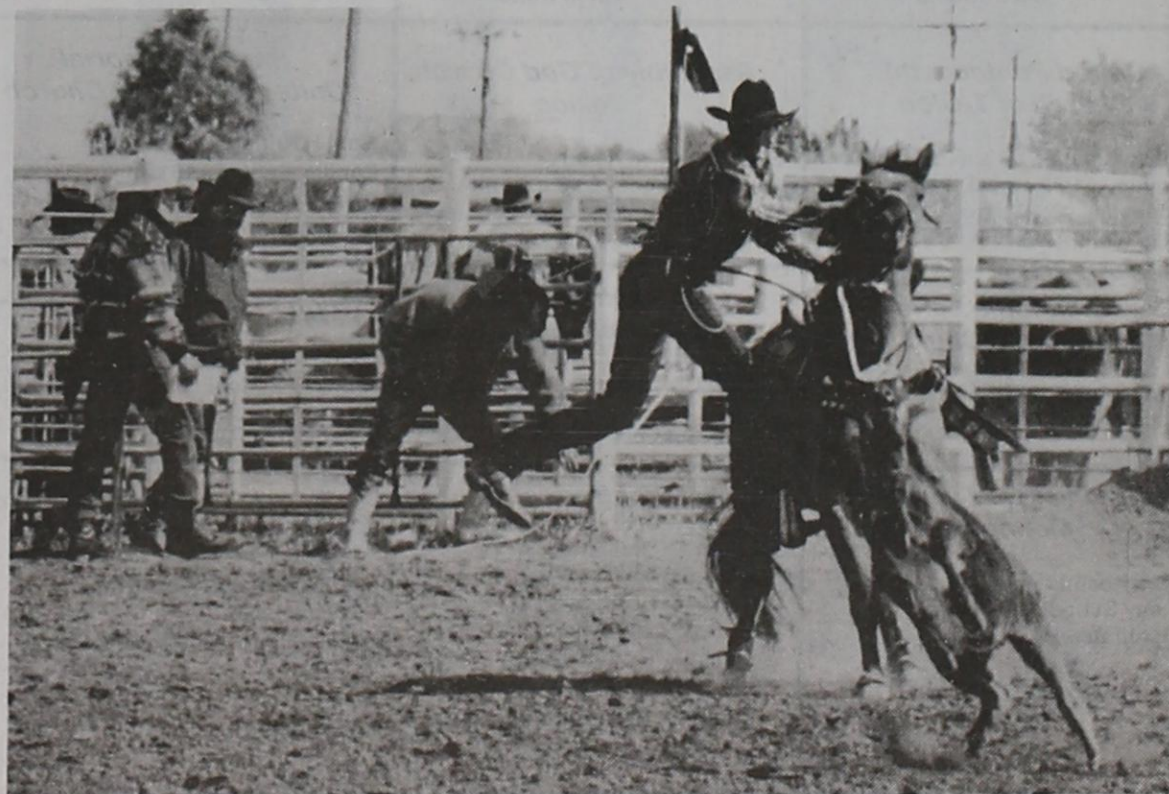
Jenkins dominated his division, bringing home a bushel of awards in addition to two saddles for All Around for the year as well as for finals.

Jenkins won two year-end belt buckles for 1st in Chute Dogging and 1st in Ribbon Roping and two finals buckles for highest average in Chute Dogging and Team Roping.

He won three clocks for the fastest times at the finals in Ribbon Roping (5.630 seconds), Chute Dogging (2.801) and, with partner Neal Stanfield, Team Roping (8.016).

Jenkins brought home travel feeders for winning the 2nd go around of Chute Dogging, the 1st go of Ribbon Roping and 2nd go of Team Roping.

Jenkins started rodeoing H.P.J.R.A. when he was in the 9-12 age group and this was the last year he was eligible for junior rodeo, finishing out his junior career in style.

### THE ANCIENT LANDMARKS

"Thou shalt not remove thy neighbor's landmark, which they of old time have set" (Deut 19:14).

Before the use of fences, property was marked by stones, posts or some fixed objects. These served as boundaries for ranches and estates. One could remove the landmark and thus enlarge his estate and diminish that of his neighbor. "Cursed be he that removeth his neighbor's landmark" (Deut 27:17; cf. Prov 22:28).

In a muddled, confused and turbulent world it is a sobering task to search out the ancient landmarks in religion. If one would know the true bounds of religion he will seek to find the original stakes set by Christ and the Apostles. The name, doctrine, government, worship, work and destiny of the church can thus be determined. Every facet of Christ's religion can be clearly seen.

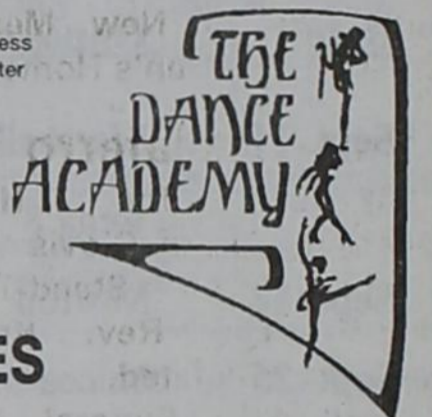
How were these disciples related? They were related to one another as all were related to God (1 John 1:7). They composed the church (Acts 2:47).
