## Lady Wolverines blast McCurdy for state title

The Texico Lady Woiverines swept past the McCurdy Bobtats, 72-53, in "The Pit" in Albuquerque on Saturday to win the Class AA State Championship.
The Lady Wolverines finished the season with a $27-2$ recrd. McCurdy ended at 26-3.
It was the Lady Wolverines' first championship since 1981 when they beat Carrizozo.
Texico used balanced scoring, tough rebounding and its always-tenacious defense to knock off the Bobcats.
