



## Springlake-Earth stops Farwell

Farwell's Steers fell to 4-3 overall and 0-1 in district when they lost to Springlake-Earth there last Friday, 21-6.

The Steers started on offense, were held and punted. Bryce Howard has a great tackle, then Finus Nolte and a "herd" of Steers pushed back the Wolverines, forcing a punt.

On offense, Roper Ledbetter passed to Brett Howard for a first down, but then S-E intercepted a long pass near midfield. The Wolverines moved the ball and scored on a 5-yard run at 2:49. The kick failed.

The kick-off was returned by Finus Nolte to the Steers 23. On 3rd and 10, Ledbetter hit a pass for a first down but the drive stopped.

The Wolverines ended up with the ball on Farwell's 33. Johnathan Edwards had a great hit! Then Nolte has another great stop. But S-E scored on a 32-yard pass to take a 12-0 lead. The kick failed.

On offense, Ledbetter ran for a 1st down, followed by a great carry by Alex Olmos. The Steers then struggled a little and S-E took over its 24.

Edwards had a good tackle, followed by a great hit by Logan Carpenter. After a couple of Wolverine penalties, the Steers get the ball on the Wolverine 23. But Farwell lost a fumble.

Bryce Howard had a great hit and the teams traded possessions as the 1st half ended.

S-E started the 2nd half near midfield. Daniel Cantu had a great tackle. The teams again traded possessions.

Then Cantu recovered a fumble near midfield. Ledbetter connected with Brett Howard for an 18 yard pass,, then Ledbetter ran for 5 more but the drive is halted.

back at their 38. The first play is amazing with Olmos running behind some great blocking for 13 yards.

Nolte returns the kick to the Steers' 39. The Wolverines intercepted. On defense, Trace Stevenson had a QB sack. The Wolverines punted into the end zone.

On the first down, Olmos takes a pass and runs 80 yards for a TD at the start of the 4th quarter.

The kick fails and it's 18-6. S-ES scored on a 21-yard field goal with 4 minutes left.

Ledbetter connected with Jaime Saenz for 17 yards. Ledbetter then ran for 20 more. On 4th and 9, a Farwell pass is incomplete near midfield.

Carpenter recovered a fumble near game's end.

Team stats were: 1st downs, Farwell 10, S-E 10; rushing yards, Farwell 94, S-E, 134; passing yards, Farwell 173, S-E, 103.

Farwell's ground attack was led by Ledbetter, 49 yards; and Olmos, 39.

## County increases salaries for election workers

The Parmer County Commissioners on Monday increased salaries for election workers.

The pay for election clerks rises from \$6 to \$8 an hour, and for election judges from \$7 to \$10 per hour.

In other business, the commissioners:

-- Approved a request for the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission to seek up to \$500,000 from the Texas Rural Community Affairs for Non-Border Colonial Funds to finance a water and sewer project.

The project would assist 10 homes on FM 1731 at Bovina's northern edge and 12 homes bordering Lakeside Drive on the southeast side of Bovina.

Currently, 1" water lines are provided the two areas, and no sewer lines. PRPC is proposing to put in sewer lines plus larger water lines.

There will be no cost to the county. PRPC is paying for the whole project. And there would be no city annexation.

-- Voted to upgrade the

door-lock system from the booking area into the dispatch center at the county jail, and to make Internet improvements so that the security cameras may become fully functional.

-- Accepted the bids from Warren Caterpillar, of Amarillo, for backhoes for Pct. 1 (Frona area) and Pct. 2 (Bovina area).

-- Received three bids from Amarillo companies to make paving improvements on County Road DD. The bids will be turned over to the project engineer for recommendations on which to accept.

# Wolverines still have shot at state playoffs

The Texico Wolverines lost a thriller to the Tucumcari Rattlers, 15-13, last Friday at home.

The loss put Texico at 3-5 on the season but they still have a good shot at the state playoffs.

According to Texico High School Principal Buddy Little, there are 17 teams in New Mexico in Class 2A, and 12 will make the state playoffs.

Since there are four districts, that means the top two teams in each district will earn playoff berths -- 8. It will be up to state officials to pick 4 more teams to fill out the state playoff brackets. And there's a good chance that the Wolverines will be one of those teams.

The game opened with the Rattlers on their 30. They were held at the Wolverine 43 and punted 9 yards to the 34.

QB Cary Crist kept for 5, followed by a burst up the middle by Justin Garrison for 19. Crist ran for 11, and Mario Posada for 4. Crist passed to Kyle Teitz for 16 yards to the Tucumcari 2, on a 3rd and long situation. Then Crist snuck over from the 1 at 2:20 for a 6-0 lead. The kick for extra points was blocked.

A short Texico kick gave Tucumcari the ball at its 42. Brett Anderson had a good tackle. Then Sterling Bowers provided two good tackles in a row, the second of which saved a probable TD.

Edgardo Meza recovered a Tucumcari fumble at the Texico 7.

Posada ran for 4, then Garrison for 26. The drive was halted at the Texico 41. On defense, Anderson had an excellent tackle on a reverse run, and the Rattlers were forced to punt.

Seth Bailey had a strong punt return. Garrison ran for 10, Posada for 5 and Crist for 12. Then Garrison shot up the middle for a 13-yard TD at 3:50. The pass for extra points failed and Texico was up, 12-0.

Tucumcari had a big kick return to the Wolverines' 41. On defense, Bailey and Ethan McDaniel had good tack-

les. Bailey and Jesse Walthers combined on a key tackle. Anderson then intercepted at the Texico 8. But Texico then lost a fumble at its 22.

With 29 seconds left in the half, Tucumcari scored from 3 yards out. The kick attempt misfired and it was 12-6 at halftime.

Texico opened the 2nd half at its 20. Although Crist had a 15-yard gallop, they had to punt. On defense, Crist and Mark Rivera had good tackles. But Tucumcari hit a 32-yard bomb, followed by a 35-yard run. Teitz had a good tackle. On 4th and 3, Teitz tackled the Rattler's runner short of the first down, and Texico took over at its 11.

Texico was stopped cold and punted, with Aaron Morgan tackling the punt returner at midfield as the 3rd quarter ended.

Tucumcari drove the ball downfield, and scored on a 30-yard run at 5:48. The kick was wide and it was 12-12.

Texico started at its 17. Garrison broke tackles en route to a 35-yard run. Crist hit Ryan Morgan with a 10-yard pass. But a penalty stopped the drive, forcing a punt to the Tucumcari 14.

ON defense, Eduardo Rodriguez had a good tackle. Then Rivera and Rodriguez combined on a QB sack, forcing a fumble recovered at the Tucumcari 17 by Adam Ingram.

**LIVE CATTLE:** The market came under pressure again this week even with the expectation of a steady cash market. Overall, the market is moving in the general direction we have been anticipating with prices moving close to our targets around the \$84 level basis the December contract. Cash beef is steady, but lower chicken and pork prices are dragging on demand.

**FEEDER CATTLE:** Lower Live Cattle prices and a run-away corn market has dropped feeder prices rather quickly over the last few weeks. As Funds continue to press corn to higher levels, feeders are expected to continue their collapse. Many cattle feeders are now making attempts to recalculate break evens as feed costs are rising sharply higher. If corn continues, look for prices below \$1.00.

**CORN:** Funds, Funds, Funds. This is the driving force and money seems to follow money just as higher prices usually lead to higher prices. There is little fundamentally to support prices at these levels. Don't be too surprised if you begin to hear rumors and stories about running out of corn? When you do, just remember we didn't run out of crude oil either, but that didn't stop the move.

**SOYBEANS:** Expectations for one of the largest crops in US history may have one wondering why the market is running straight up? Soybeans are being supported by an overall higher grain complex. Higher corn and wheat prices have helped to support prices. Expect beans to continue to follow behind the corn as the market moves higher. All trends are currently pointing higher.

**WHEAT:** Aside from great weather across most of the major winter wheat growing areas, continued problems in Australia and tight world stocks have helped to support prices. A major reversal which took place this week may have stopped the move temporarily, but a continued Fund presence which is key to higher prices seems to still be in place. Funds can take the market higher.

**COTTON:** Prices made an attempt to rally this week, but with all trends still pointing lower, we would expect the downtrends to continue. If the market moves back towards the contract low at the 48 cent level and holds, then there is potential for a bottom? World stocks were increased this week and world demand decreased which increased world stocks to 52.26 million bales which is up from last months estimate of 46.7 million bales. This may drive the market lower over time?

Gunter said new federal laws allow for "quiet zones" where trains don't honk so much or even at all.

He said other communities have been successful in creating these zones and he plans to move ahead on this. He said the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad favors these.

To set up quiet zones, where a stretch of track is exempt from horn blowing, communities must implement other safety measures, which can be costly.

In other business, the council:

-- Said that Bermea Construction had put some dirt in several alleys atop the ash. They will be asked to remove the dirt.

-- Noted that sand in some of the water lines is a problem, and city employees are working to resolve it.

-- Announced that water rights for 151.6 acres

south of Texico have been purchased from Leon Meeks for \$1,000 per acre foot. Thus, if the Ute Lake water project doesn't work out (or even if it does), the city can drill water wells on this property.

-- Okayed resident Judy Lekovich's request to extend her fence.

-- Heard Fire Chief Lewis Cooper report that officials are trying to set up a public meeting with state lawmakers to discuss the pro's and con's of the Ute Lake project, which has been its cost rise from \$250 million to \$480 million since it was announced.

-- Repairs for curbing after the truck gas spill a couple of weeks ago will be footed by the trucking company, councilmen said. The state has given the go-ahead for the city to allow the work.

-- Okayed buying a new ambulance, at a cost of \$96,000. The state is providing a \$90,000 grant and

the old ambulance will be sold for \$8,000, said Cooper.

-- Discussed the problem with the new water line being 300 feet short of its construction, as explained in the Oct. 12 issue of the Tribune.

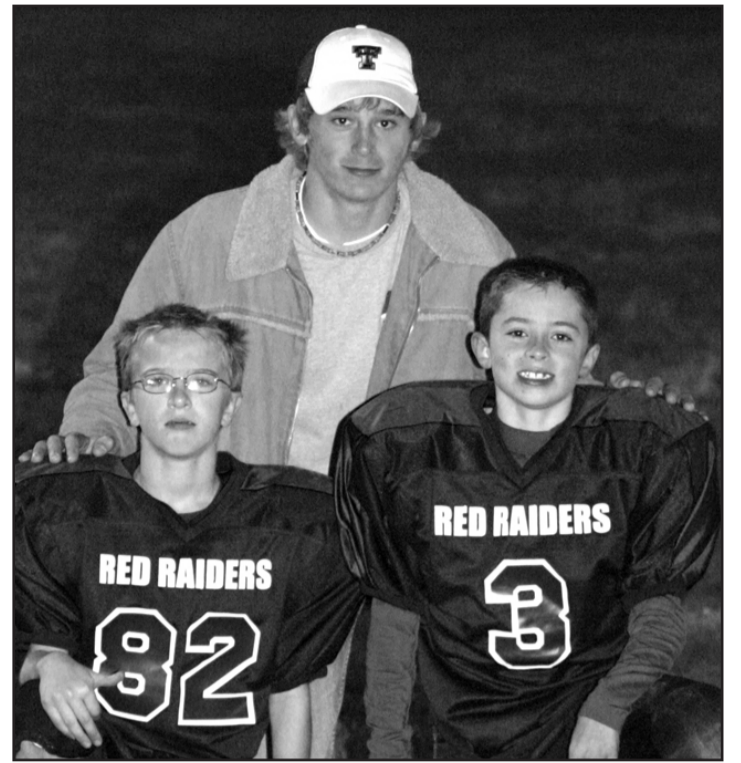
A representative of the engineering company said the specs called for 3,685 feet of pipe, including bore pipe. But the bid accepted was for that 3,685 feet without bore pipe.

The rep said two bids had been received, and the engineering firm reviewed them and recommended the bid chosen.

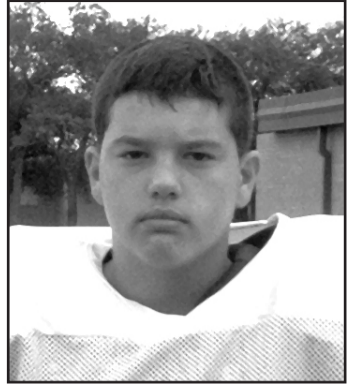
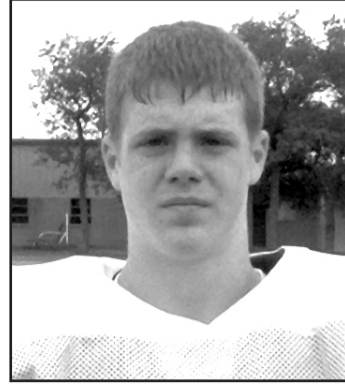

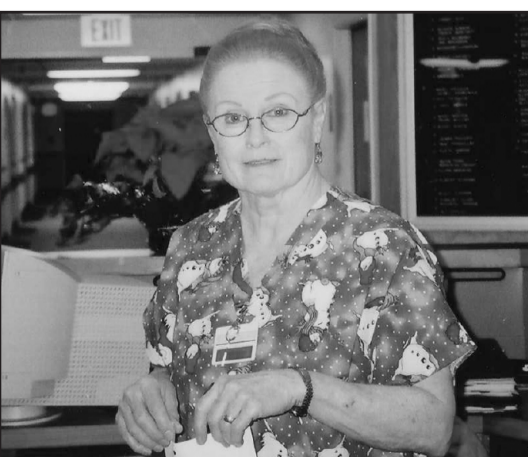

The Bovina Colts continued rolling as they defeated Seagraves Oct. 19, 24-8.

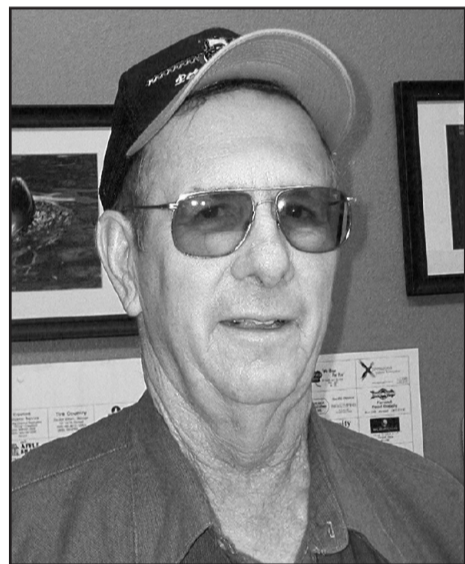
The Colt defense began the game by shutting the Eagles down and giving the Bovina offense chance at first blood.

Several Farwell and Bovina youngsters are members of the Red Raiders football team that is going to the Youth National Championships in Las Vegas Nov. 21 and 22.

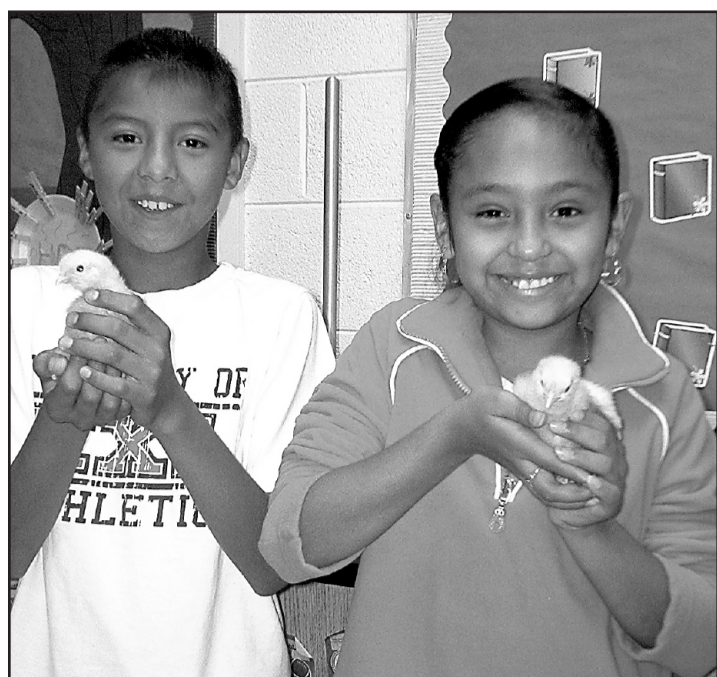

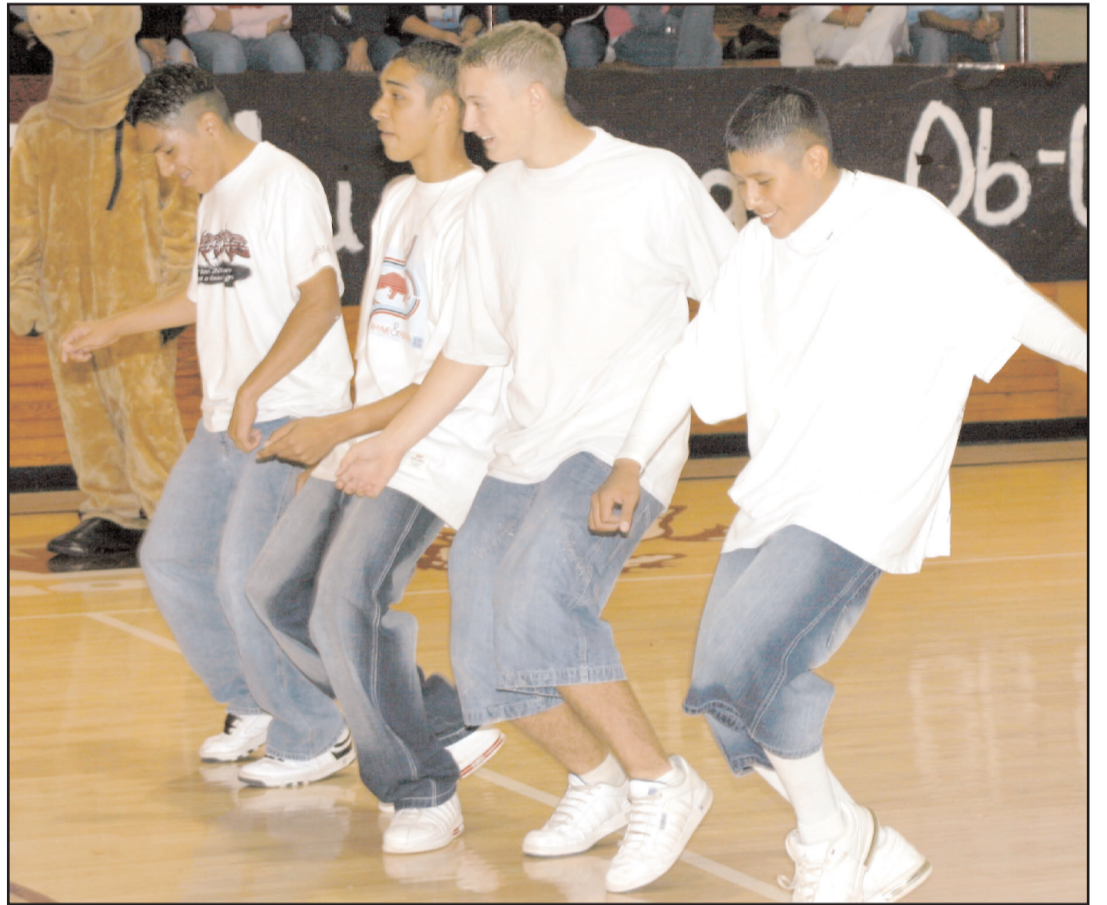
