## 'The Overpass' still years away

Steve Perez, Texas district state highway engineer, told the State Line Tribune on June 29 that the longdiscussed overpass between arwell and Texico has been way dep by the stat high and planning.
That's the
That's the easy part. Now come the more difficult aspects. These include coord Mexico highway department personnel (meetings are being set up), decisions on funding, and dealing with the multitude of problems associated with a major building project.
Perez said that Texas is willing to handle the design, construction and maintenance of the overpass, so he expects approvals with the New Mexico officials should go well.
Agreeing on how much each state will pay will be an issue, although most of the funds for the project will come from the federal govrnment, he said.
"Right now, we are still in "Rrawing stage," he added. The plans will call for the overpass to have a loip int to the Santa Fe Railroad tracks on the Texas side. In other words, the overpass will not we a straight shot from Farell's Avenue A to Texico's Wheeler Avenue.

This is because U.S. High-
way 60 (the Amarillo highway) must be integrated into the plan. By having a loop, traffic from U.S. 84 (the Lubbock highway) and U.S. 60 can Perez said Texico easily. Perez said Texas oflicial want this project to be state of-the-art and appealing to a gateway into both states gateway into both states. An to be dealt with before construction can begin involve property acquisition.It appears the Town \& Country and Allsup's convenience stores would be involved among others
