## Texico 4th of July gala cancelled

The Texico Community Activities Organization (TCAO) has cancelled its annual Fourth of July celebration, announced Ann Cooper.

The celebration is highlighted by a fireworks demonstration.

Due to the drought and dryness, plus lack of funds, the TCAO is skipping holding the event this year, Mrs. Cooper said.

This year also is when the Texico Volunteer Fire Department has the giveaway at Border Town Days.

Mrs. Cooper said the department will not have a giveaway this year -- but that the TCAO will.

The TCAO will be awarding several prizes, highlighted by a barbecue grill worth more than \$1,300, and a half side of beef.

Proceeds from the TCAO giveaway will be used to start a bank account toward building a new swimming pool in Texico, said Mrs. Cooper.

### Muleshoe Pea & Bean's reception pays off big

The efforts made by Muleshoe Pea & Bean to have a Russian trade delegation come to Muleshoe have paid off -- bigtime.

Susie Sowder, of Muleshoe Pea & Bean, reported that the trade delegation has purchased a substantial amount of blackeye peas through the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

In all, 18 railroad cars are being loaded, through June 15, for transport to ports on the West Coast.

The blackeye peas being loaded come from last year's area harvest. Planting for this year's harvest starts this month.

The peas being shipped to Russia come from an overabundance grown here.

Ms. Sowder said the purchase by the Russian Delegation is the largest one made through the USDA of blackeye peas since Muleshoe Pea & Bean opened five years ago.

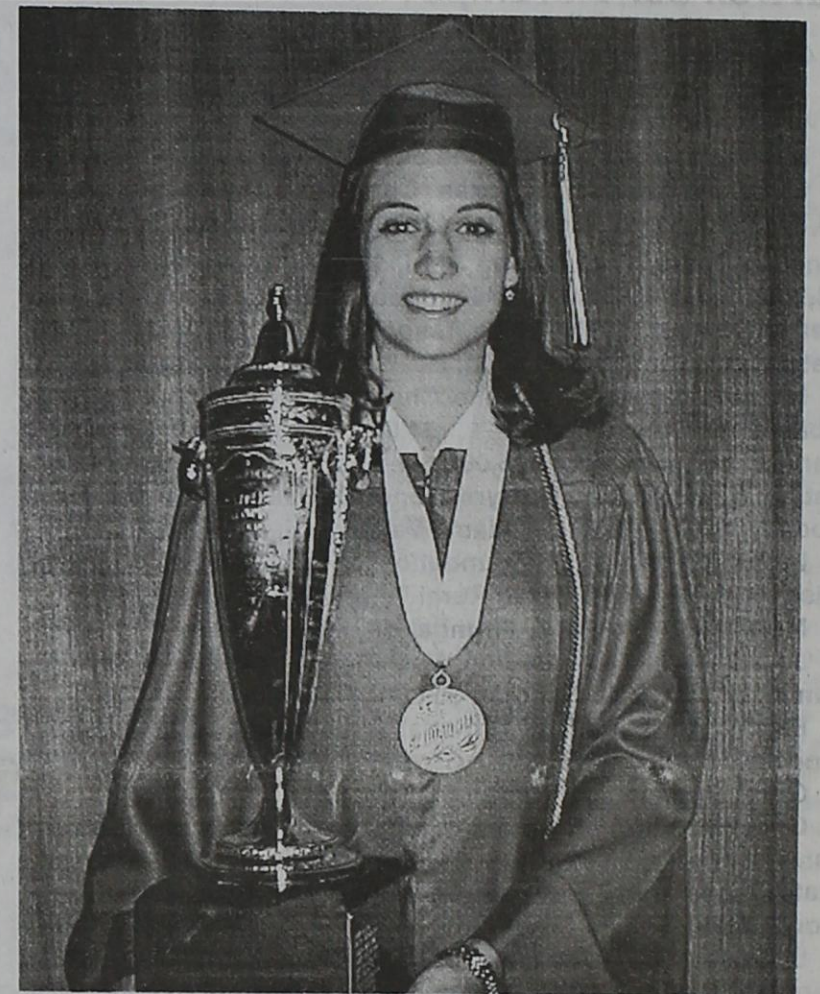
### Byrd named to head Farwell Chamber

**Special Texico meeting planned to discuss proposed dairy**

The Texico City Council will hold a special meeting open to the public on June 5 at 6:30 p.m. mst at the Texico Community Center.

Council members along with concerned citizens of Texico will meet to discuss the New Mexico Environment Department permit #DP1290 for the Martin Grain Dairy that might possibly coming here. The site is just outside the west city limits near the Texico cemetery.

A number of citizens have done research on this matter and will present their findings at the meeting.

Some people are concerned about the dairy coming into this area because of

the fact that if the permit goes through, the dairy will be discharging 40,000 gallons of wastewater a day.

Water level is a big concern for the people of Texico and Farwell.

Complaints voiced by some include the excessive use of water, contamination, decreases in area real estate along with odor and dust problems.

So far, more than 90 letters have been collected opposing the dairy, said Texico city clerk Teresa Harth and Farwell city clerk Cynthia Thigpen.

The letters will be sent on June 7 to the New Mexico Environmental Department in

order to meet the June 10 deadline.

Both city halls are taking signed letters until June 7.

**Recipe of Week**  
**CARAMELIZED ONIONS**  
6 medium Yellow onions (3 lb.)  
1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil  
1 teaspoon Thyme, crushed  
1 teaspoon Rosemary, crushed

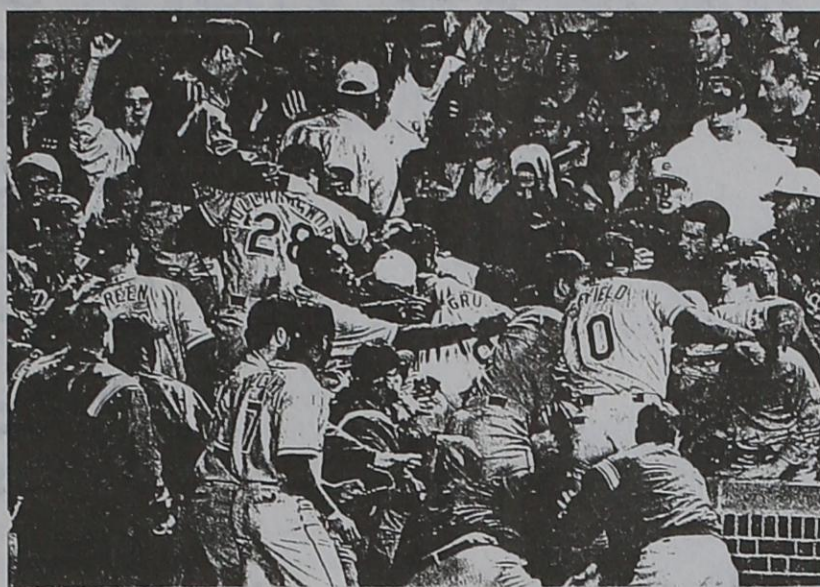

## Sheriff's Report

Here is the weekly report from Parmer County Sheriff Walt Yerger:

On May 26, Samuel Diaz, 22, of Bovina, was arrested by the Texas Highway Patrol on charges of DWI subsequent, pending before the grand jury, and evading arrest, pending in county court.

On May 25, Joseph Bustos, 18, no address given, was arrested by the sheriff's office on a charge of violation of probation. The case is pending in county court.

On May 23, Monica Ramos, 18, of Friona, was arrested by the sheriff's office on a charge of theft by worthless check. In county court, she paid fine and court costs of \$1,046.

In 287th District Court, with Judge Gordon Green presiding, last week:

-- Pedro Garcia Ramos Sr., 31, of Hereford, charged with aggravated assault with a weapon, and aggravated assault on a peace officer, was sentenced on the first charge to 6 years in the Texas Department of Corrections, probated for 6 years, \$292 court costs, \$2,000 fine and 320 hours of community service; and was sentenced to the second charge to 4 years in the Texas Department of Corrections, probated for 4 years, \$267 court costs and \$1,000 fine.

## Financial Focus

Just because a particular stock has slumped for a while, does that mean it's a "loser"?

Not necessarily. Nonetheless, far too many people "bail out" on stocks that have fallen in value.

By selling when the stock price is down, these investors are doing the exact opposite of the classic "buy low, sell high" investment formula.

The key to making smart "sell" decisions depends on careful analysis of the depressed stock. Any number of factors may cause a stock's price to drop for an extended period of time.

An energy stock, for instance, will suffer when world oil prices are down.

Other stocks may flatten because, after their prices initially ran up on investor enthusiasm, it may take some time for earnings to climb enough to support higher stock prices.

This has happened in recent years with several well-known stocks, including Wal-Mart.

If investors had jumped ship while these stocks were stagnant, they would have missed out on tremendous future growth.

When, then, should you sell a stock that has performed sluggishly for some time?

You need to determine if the stock's fundamentals have changed.

Is a new management team in place? Have the company's products fallen behind those of its competitors?

Or is the company in a fading industry?

If any of these fundamental factors have changed, then it may be time to consider selling your stock and using the money to invest in a better opportunity.

But if you determine that the fundamentals are still sound, and that the company still has good long-term prospects, then you should look beyond its current performance.

It's very costly to constantly buy and sell stocks, and most investors are not successful in chasing performance.

That's why it's almost always a good idea to find good, solid companies - and hand on to them for the long term.

Today's "losers" may be down - but they might not be out.

And when they rebound, you'll be glad you stuck with them.

The cost of the 5-day tour is \$940.

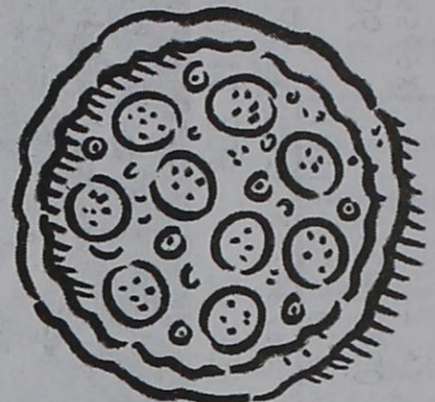
