The Parmer County 4-H Dog Project began in May and the instructor is Debbie Harling.


She trains and raises border collies and has been successful in competition across the nation. And she has worked with 4-H groups in Kansas to help them learn to train their dogs to be obedient.

Texico 4th of July gala cancelled

The Texico Community

Mrs. Cooper said the department will not have a giveaway this year -- but that the TCAO will.

The TCAO will be awarding several prizes, highlighted by a barbeque grill worth more than \$1,300, and a half side of beef.

Proceeds from the TCAO giveaway will be used to start a bank account toward building a new swimming pool in Texico, said Mrs. Cooper.

Susie Sowder, of Muleshoe Pea & Bean, reported that the trade delegation has purchased a substanial amount of blackeye peas through the U.S. Department of Agricul-

In all, 18 railroad cars are being loaded, through June 15, for transport to ports on the West Coast.

The blackeye peas being loaded come from last year's area harvest. Planting for this year's harvest starts this month

The peas being shipped to Russia come from an overabundance grown here.

Ms. Sowder said the purchase by the Russian Delegation is the largest one made through the USDA of blackeye peas since Muleshoe Pea & Bean opened five years ago.



Special Texico meeting planned to discuss proposed dairy

Just because a particular slock has slumped for a while, does that mean it's a "loser"?

There will be a Boston/New York Educational Tour in June 2001, said Texico teacher Amy Kelley.





And let me tell you, you have to try R.C.'s cowboy stew.







Letter 70 The Editor

Dear Editor,

On Friday and Saturday, we experienced a pasture fire near Pleasant Hill. We want the community to know what competant, hard-working men, women and teens we have in our Pleasant Hill, Texico and Clovis fire departments.
