Texico highway changes modified

The Texico City Council Tuesday discussed the highway project that starts in February.

Councilman Oran Jay Autrey attended the pre-construction seminar.

The highway between Clovis and Texico is going to be re-constructed, BUT it will stop at the elevators near the Port of Entry.

The last mile or so of 60-70-84 that runs directly through Texico will not be fixed, nor will we have the five lane highway, with the fifth as a turning lane, coming through Texico.

Autrey said he was told that the highway department will have run out of money to complete the job and redo the road to the state line.

So...the construction will begin on Norris Street in Clovis and will end somewhere near the Kelly Green Seed property in Texico.

The end date for construction of the highway is expected to be May 2001.

In other business, the council:

- Discussed the lay-down curb on Highway 108. The

council was going to take bids on the removal of the curb there and install a lay-down curb.

Apparently, they did not receive bids until after the work was done.

It was tabled.

- Approved a business registration to Brad Hampton.

Hampton is a certified personal perfection agent and will be opening up a business in that area.

Hampton says that he will be mostly working out of the home and possibly out of state.

- Approved the purchase of educational books that teach children about fire, and also approved the purchase of 2 automatic triggered ventilators for EMS.

- Councilman Dean Henninger asked the council to look into crosswalk signs to put up near the schools.

- Hired a fourth police officer. James Mondragon, of Raton, will be offered the position.

Mondragon is certified and is willing to live in the city limits.

Texico School board election will be Tuesday

The \$1.5 million Texico Schools bond election will be held on Tuesday.

Voters can cast their ballots at the Texico Community Center between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.

All registered voters within

the Texico school district may vote.

The school board is looking at two possible projects if the board issue is passed: a new gymnasium, and a learning activities center.

Precinct \$\$ totals given

At the beginning of each year, the Tribune publishes financial information for the four Parmer County precincts so folks will know the shape they are in.

The funds that each precinct has can be used for any precinct business, such as employee salaries, equipment, machinery, fuel, supplies, etc. All funds are maintained by county treasurer Anne Norton.

The precincts, and their commissioners, are: Pct. 1, John Tannahill, Friona area; Pct. 2, Tom Ware, Bovina area; Pct. 3, Jerry Davis, Farwell area; and Pct. 4, Raymond McGehee, Lazbuddie area.

Cash on hand is maintained in the Farm to Market Fund and the Lateral Fund. The Lateral Fund consists of money that comes from the state each October, based on the number of road miles in each precinct.

Here's a look at the cash on hand (as of January) for each precinct (with the numbers in parentheses showing the corresponding amounts from last year).

Pct. 1 -- \$16,136 (\$20,344).

Pct. 2 -- \$14,35 (\$6,968).

Pct. 3 -- \$5,657 (\$19,953).

Pct. 4 -- \$21,876 (\$8,062).

In addition to cash on hand, some precincts have Certificates of Deposit and/or Tex Pool Investments. Tex Pool is a statewide investment group that many governmental entities, including Parmer County, are members of.

Pct. 1 has a \$100,000 Certificate of Deposit and \$80,000 in investments.

Pct. 2 has a \$150,000 Certificate of Deposit and \$100,000 in investments.

Pct. 3 has \$55,500 worth of investments.

Pct. 4 has two Certificates of Deposit -- \$100,000 and \$188,367.

But I have always felt that the small American force which defeated the Japanese on Guadacanal was.

One of the first military books I ever read was called "Guadacanal Diary," by Richards Tregaskis. It was a great book.

It outlined the day by day heroics of our servicemen during those dark days of World War II.

Later in the war, we had the upper hand on the enemy, both the Japanese and the Nazis. We had superior air power and sea power.

But in the early days, in 1942, we were the underdog, or maybe even-steven at best. So the fighting on Guad-

acanal was vicious. Our troops didn't have a lot going for them, just their courage. And our men won.

And that was the first of the backward steps the Japa-

nese would take throughout the rest of the war, island by island.

I normally don't use this column to recommend reading books or seeing movies.
