

#### Golf program at Texico Schools?


Some of the parents of Texico High School students are interested in getting a golf team started at Texico.


The parade kicks off Saturday at 11 a.m. cdt and participants are asked to be in line at least 15 minues early.



The Farwell Convalescent Center offers a wide variety of services. Lavonn Guthals took me on a tour of the facility recently. My grandmother used to be a resident at the center and since my last visit there they have added a lot of items.

First of all, is the Therapy room. They offer physical, speech, and occupational therapy. They also have in- and out-patients. The Therapy room is where the sunroom used to be. This allows the residents to take their therapy in an open room full of sunshine.

Next, Mrs. Guthals showed me the newly renovated shower room. I wish that my bathroom at home was as clean as this one is. She also showed me their new whirlpool. It is so new that it hasn't even been installed. The new whirlpool will be great for residents who have poor circulation or skin prob-

After that, I was shown the bird aviary and the fish tank in the nurses' station and the lobby. Mrs. Guthals said that they are part of the "Eden Experiment" -- which tries to bring the outside -- inside.

Then, Mrs. Guthals showed me the remodeled dining hall. Every table had a batch of fresh flowers on them. The center gets fresh flowers in every Monday.


Another improvement that the Convalescent Center has that wasn't there the last time I visited was the Alzheimer unit. known as Jericho Road. The unit is self contained. The residents who live there eat, sleep, and play in there. Yes, you heard me right, play. Jericho Road has it own Activities Director to keep the residents busy with their favorite activities. They also have their own patio in case they want to go out-

Overall, the center is licensed for 70 residents and they take Medicaid or Medicare. They have semi-private and private rooms. In addition, the center has a new state of the art lift system. This will cut down on back injuries, since the nurses won't have to lift up the residents anymore.

The center also offers many activities. In addition to the daily devotions and games, there many monthly activities, such as birthday parties. Also, they celebrate every holiday with some kind of meal or activity.

The center has 11 nurses on staff. Six are registered nurses and five are licensed vocational nurses. On top of that they many other employees from kitchen staff to house keep-


The proposed expansion of the Farwell Country Club from 9 to 18 holes was the chief topic at a meeting earlier this month of the country club's board of directors and stockholders.

It was one sheet with a pictorial display of life in the desert. it showed snakes, bugs, birds, javalinas and deer munching on the desert flora. At first I couldn't find the self-sticking stamps. They are scattered in the full color picture.

You have to be sharp to find all 25 stamps. They don't say "US Postal Service" but rather "USA 33", so it is possible to see all of them.

On the back of the sheet there is a key in case you fail to see the lines where the stamps fit on to the sheet. And, there is a discription of the Sonora Desert which is divided between the U.S. and Mexico.

I bought a sheet to give to my nephews as a little gift. They are the right age to hunt and seek things. They will enjoy the colorful designs. The former teacher in me came out as I looked at the colorful picture.

The operative words are

beautiful, creative, informative.

Recently I received a letter from the Chicago area from a family member whose husband just got out of the hospital.

She put 17 two-cent stamps on the letter. They were Mary Lyon two-cent stamps. Mary Lyon worked to improve women's rights; she founded Mr. Holyoke College.

The stamp honoring her has to be licked to get it to stick to a letter, and it is printed in only one color, blue ink on white paper.

It took five marks by the post office to cancel all of the stamps on that letter. The post office had to work to get its money's worth.

Farwell's postmaser, Lynne Mahaney, has given talks to many clubs and organizations about stamp collecting. She can tell you about the increased value of some stamps.

Stamp collecting is like a lot of other investments. Some things increase in value more than other things do. These Sonoran Desert stamps looked like a good investment to me because they were the first of their kind.





Phillips is most widely known for writing and recording the No. 1 hit in 1958 His original "Sugartime." version was recorded at the Norman Petty Studios in Clovis. Buddy Holly played the lead guitar on the original recording. It hit the top of the country and western charts, but the McGuire Sisters' pop version gave it worldwide recognition.

In September 1995, HBO cable TV produced a movie about Phyllis McGuire, one of the McGuire sisters. It was entitled "Sugartime." Phillips' music was used in this movie.

Phillips was a teen-ager at Farwell High when he wrote the hit song while driving a tractor on the family farm.

Since then, he has recorded a number of country and western hits. In the 1960's every record he made was on the national charts. He has performed on the Grand Ole Opry

and toured with Johnny Cash, Willie Nelson, Jim Reeves and Marty Robbins.

Phillips has stopped writing music, but he still playing. Phillips has a 5-member band that consists of Jimmy Young, fiddle; Vick Ashmead,

steel guitar; Frank Hardcastle, lead guitar; Chet Calcote, base guitar; and Ted Czahowske, drummer. Young and Calcote once played with the legendary Bob Wills. Young is a member of the Western Swing Hall of Fame.





The bride's mother helped make up a guest list, but the hostesses provided names, too. Invitations were sent out. And the Tribune is contacted.



#### There's an art to getting a grade for your school work

A tongue in cheek column from Greg Qualls:

Most people think that writing an "F" paper is pretty hard since any paper with some amount of effort would receive a "D." Writing an "F" paper is truly an art that must be acquired. But with some non-work and cheating, you too can have an "F" paper. All you have to do is follow my three easy

Specifically, put commas and periods wherever you feel they need to go. In fact, if you can say it smoothly, then it must be right. In conclusion, if you follow my three simple steps, you will surely be awarded an "F" paper. By following these steps you destroy the framework of a good paper (size, content, and mechanics). But by giving up the framework, you gain ample amounts of time, save your mind, and invent your own system of grammar. If nothing else, you will be "original"!

#### Sittin' in the Corner by Wade Cargile

Have you ever stopped to think about how many different abbreviations there are for situations?

People sometimes use abbreviations in their daily speech. Newspaper ads, magazine ads, and other publications also use abbreviations to describe a thought. Let's look at some:

"For Sale -- 1925 almost new & reconditioned Ford Model T with accessories. Asking \$900 OBO."

What does OBO stand for? I always thought it stood for 'or butt out' until an editor told me different. When you see an ad selling a pet, you'll see "aka" at the end of that ad. I suppose "aka" stand for 'another kind animal' which makes sense; no one wants to buy an unkind animal. "AKC" sometimes appears at the end of an ad for animal for sale, which could stand for "Always Keep Clean."

When people send you an invitation to a party, they'll write "RSVP" at the end of the invitation. What does "RSVP" stand for? It could mean 'Real Society Visiting Place' or maybe 'Reserved for Important People.' AKA is sometimes used to identify people or things or places as 'Also Known As,' but it could also mean 'another kooky antonym.'

"I.E.", or i.e., is sometimes used to abbreviate 'in other words.' This never made much sense to me; the words don't fit the abbreviated letters. "I.E." should stand for 'incoherent trouble.

Let's take a look at the medical field of abbreviations. 'Stat' means fast or right away, urgent. "CC" stands for 'cold cash,' "qd" means 'quarantined delinquent,' "ER" stands for 'Enterprising Resident,' and "OR" means 'Occupied Room.'

The different titles that medical person have can be confusing to the ordinary person. "RN" stand for 'Registered Nurse,' although some people have interpreted "RN" to mean 'Rejuvenated Neurosurgeon' and "LPN" really stands for 'licensed Practical Nurse,' but again some have understood it to mean "Last Person Needed."

Other abbreviations are used in everyday life. When I was young, my mother would sometimes come into my room with her on her hips and say "BYOB," which stood for 'behave, you ornery boy.'

I told my parents that I would pursue a career as a "CPA" and they were proud that I wanted to be an accountant. What I really wanted to be was a "car parking attendant." I did acquire a Ph.D. (post hole digger) degree, and my wife claims that I have a degree as an MD (maniac driver).

In the armed services, abbreviations are used quite frequently. "CO" sometimes means 'Commanding Officer,' but can mean 'constitution obeyer,' and "CPO" can mean 'candid personal observer.'

Other abbreviations used daily are LTD (let's take the day off), Inc. (inspectors need compassion), Co. (conscientious oddball), and etc. (everybody takes credit).

The next time you run into an abbreviation, take time to carefully study what it really means, it may save you a lot of
