Bobby is currently going through intensive physical therapy on his arms. He does the therapy at his home. Every exercise he does helps to strengthen his arms, shoulders and back.





Mitz Walling reminisces How the bodies were discovered

By Teresa Mesman

Mitz Walling of Farwell remembers very well the day that the bodies of the Hasell family members were discovered.

He was ten years old and had gone out to the homesite with his father J.L. Walling. J.L. was a wholesale oil and gas dealer for Texaco at the time and he had received word that men were needed to help dig up the bodies that had been discovered behind the cistern.

"My daddy had me come along with him in our old open top Model-T Ford pickup out to the old Hamlin place. I nearly froze to death that day because I didn't have a jacket on and it was really cold outside. The site was even more chilling," Mitz recalled. "Judge and Mrs. Kate Hamlin owned that place and were out there when the Hasell sale took place. Mrs. Hamlin was over by the cistern watching a man with a wagon that was turning around after loading the wagon full of things that he had bought at the sale. When he was turning the wagon around, the wheels got off into a bunch of soft dirt and the twist on the wagon caused one of the wagon wheels to fall off. That's when Mrs. Hamlin discovered everything."

Mitz explained that Mrs. Hamlin went over to where the

"I remember standing around watching the men get those bodies out of the dirt and then load them onto 1x12 boards and carry them over to several pickup trucks," Mitz explained. "Hasell stood over to the side watching them do this the whole time. I walked around a little bit and then went over to the trucks and saw the bodies."

Mitz feels that Mrs. Hamlin should get the credit for the whole situation because if she hadn't seen the cloth in the wheel rut, Hasell probably would have gotten away with


everything. Mitz said that the bodies were then taken to one of the grocery warehouses in Farwell. "There were two grocery warehouses in town at the time,

a Radford warehouse and a Noble warehouse. The groceries for Clovis were shipped in by railroad and unloaded there so that the tax wouldn't have to be added onto the groceries going into New Mexico. The groceries were then trucked into Clovis from these warehouses. Anyway, that's where they took the bodies and kept them. until the smell got so bad that they finally took them and buried them in the Farwell Cemetery north of town," he recalled.

Mitz remembers the day very clearly and said that it is one that he can never forget.

Lady Wolverines' stats show why they are champions

It was quite a year, statistically speaking, for the Texico Lady Wolverines. Not only did they sweep to their second straight state Class AA championship, but they dominated the competition throughout the year, ending with a 27-1 mark.

Texico scored 2,162 points to their foes' 1,172. This means they averaged 77.2 points a game to their opponents' 41.9. That is a huge victory margin.

Actually the margin would have been bigger than that except that Coach Roy King put in substitutes in the 4th quarter so that other teams were not wiped out in that final period as they were in the first three quarters.

And during the course of those many routs, they caused 954 turnovers -- 34.1. per game. This included 633 steals by the Lady Wolverines, plust another 321 unforced errors ("opportunities").

Here's a look at the team's individual stats:

Jennifer Roberts - 8 blocks, 19 points a game, 117 steals, 118 assists, 145 rebounds, 71 percent from the charity line, 36 percent of 3 pointers and 51 percent of 2 point shots.

Elizabeth Richards -- 119 blocks, 21.1 points a game, 124 steals, 136 assists, 380 rebounds, 67 percent on free throws, 27 percent from beyond the arc, and 64 percent of 2-pointers.

Callie Rucker -- 2 blocks, 6.5 points a game, 47 steals, 79 assists, 88 boards, 40 percent on free throws, 30 percent on 3-pointers, and 40 percent of 2-point attempts.

Krysta Morris -- 4 blocks, 6 points a game, 171 assists, 145 steals, 134 rebounds, 50 percent of charity tosses, 30 percent of 3-balls, and 50 percent of 2-point shots.

Kara Jenkins -- 2 blocks, 12.1 points a game, 58 assists, 74 steals, 127 boards, 47 percent of charity tosses, and 48 percent of 2-point shots.

Carrie Phipps -- 15 blocks, 4.6 points a game, 76 assists, 64 steals, 83 boards, 63 percent on free throws, 29 percent on 3-pointers and 41 percent of 2-point attempts.

Carrie Rucker -- 2 blocks, 2.1 points a game, 22 assists, 25



steals, 46 percent from the free throw line, 21 percent from beyond the arc, and 37 percent of 2-pointers.

Dru Mayfield -- 3 blocks, 2.7 points a game, 22 assists, 17 steals, 46 rebounds, 69 percent from the free throw line, and 40 percent of 2-point tries.

Shilo Thornton -- 2 blocks, 0.8 points a game, 4 steals, 4 assists, 13 boards, 63 percent on free throws, and 18 percent on 2 point tries.

Nicole Richards -- 1.4 points a game, 2 assists, 4 steals, 8 rebounds, 55 percent on free throws, 50 percent of 3-balls, and 60 percent on 2-point shots.

Kelsi Cain -- 1.6 points a game, 1 rebound, 100 percent on free throws (2 of 2), 100 percent on 3-balls (1 for 1), and 75 percent on 2-point tries (3 of 4).

Tori Bradley -- 1.5 points a game, 1 block, 2 assists, 2 steals, 7 rebounds, 1 for 1 from beyond the arc, and 30 percent of her 2-point shots.

Megan Brown -- 2.2 points a game, 4 assists, 9 steals, 15 boards, 47 percent of free throws, and 44 percent of 2-shot attempts.



derly conduct if he didn't do something to get us to turn the chimes off.


"I got a letter from the police officer asking us to turn them off. So because it was a police officer who did the asking, I turned off the chimes.
