I had begun to think about how the pioneers might have approached a cold night out in the wilds of the territories they were settling. How would they have heated water for soups, coffee, steam facials?

Now I realize that they didn't have fondue pots back then, but they put water in a kettle over a fire to boil. I felt a bit like Martha Stewart as I set my fondue pot up. Then my triumph faded as I learned that I needed lantern fuel for the heating unit.

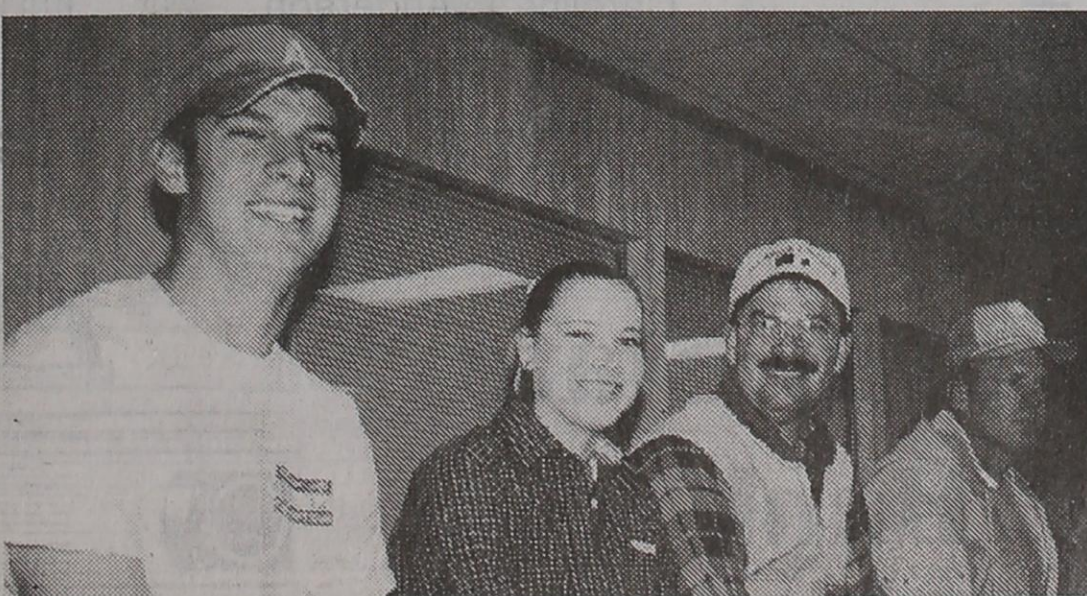
Lantern fuel? I had simmering potpourri liquid, bath oil, olive and canola oil, but nothing as flammable and long burning as lantern fuel.

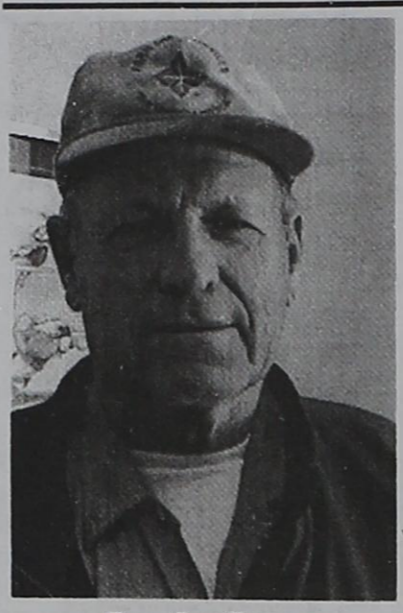

Lawsuit against Parmer County settled out of court

Parmer County Judge told the county commissioners in executive session on Monday that the lawsuit filed last January involving the Friona pool hall raid has been settled.

The lawsuit accused then-Parmer County Sheriff Walt Yerger and deputy Keith Payne of arresting innocent citizens during the raid in April 1999.

District Judge Mary Lou Robinson had ordered the case to mediation, and it was settled with the county's insurance company last Friday.

The amount of the cash settlement was not revealed. Although the agreement was reached, some paperwork still has to be done before all is finalized.

The plaintiffs were pool hall owner Francisco Ortiz and customers Daniel Padilla, Ruben Villanueva, Tomas Hernandez and Arturo Aguilar, acting on behalf of a minor.

The case has been set for trial on Jan. 9. Police had been accused of pointing loaded firearms at the plain-

tiffs and others. Some patrons were handcuffed while police searched the premises, the suit had alleged.

Those arrested in the raid were not prosecuted.

In other business, the commissioners:

-- Renewed the contract with Wade Cargile for court-house lawn care services.

-- Approved the 2001 holiday schedule.

-- Named folks to the county grievance committee (which has never met).

-- Okayed Sheriff Randy Gerles' request to buy a new vehicle for the department.

Winegeart has setback; hip dislocates again

Bobby Winegeart progresses toward regaining the feeling throughout his lower body and legs after his spinal and hip surgeries in November.

However Bobby has suffered a major setback in that his hip has dislocated, once again.

Bobby went for an MRI (magnetic resonance image) last Tuesday. It was discovered that his hip that had been operated on three times was definitely dislocated.

"His hip muscle is very weak and it's not able to help hold the hip socket in place," said Linda Thompson, Bobby's mother. "Bobby's still very positive about his progress however."

Bobby has regained more feeling into his lower body. He now has sensation to about an inch and a half below his navel. Before Christmas, the feeling was only above his navel.

"Slowly, but surely, the feeling is coming back," Linda said.

Bobby will now be seen by Dr. Kyle Sheets. He will hopefully be able to refer Bobby to someone that can help fit him with a brace or some other device to help keep the hip in place. The brace and rod between his feet would have worked quite well if Bobby's

muscles around his hip were stronger. Bobby will also have to have the hip operated on for the fourth time to get it back into position.

"It's set him back a few more months and we're all disappointed, but we're hanging in there and Bobby knows that it's just going to take a little more time," said Linda.

Bobby is still working very hard at his upper body physical therapy in the mean time.

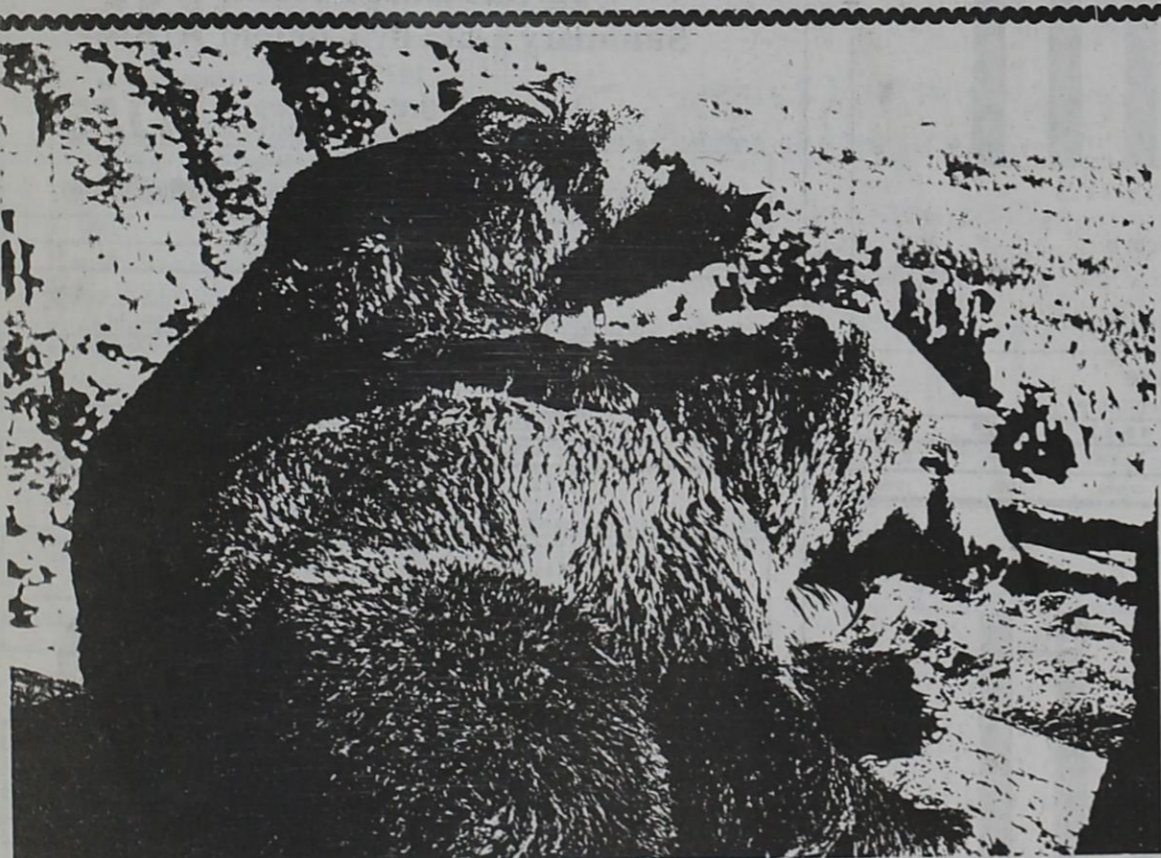

Word has been received of the death of Lloyd Niece, 72,

of Clovis. During his life, he served as chief inspector for the state of New Mexico at the Port of Entry in Texico, as a deputy sheriff of Parmer County, and as Friona police chief.

The board of directors of First Ag Credit, Farm Credit Services, has approved a \$14.7 million capital and cash patronage dividend to its members.

About \$9.9 million was in the form of a stock retirement effective Dec. 1, 2000, and the remaining \$4.8 million will be paid as a cash patronage dividend in early 2001.

Members of the nominating committee include Steve Pierson, of the Oklahoma Lane exchange, and Danny Allen, of the Parmer exchange.

Texico seeks to join Texas water plan

The Texico City Council on Tuesday passed a resolution seeking to join the Texas Llano Estacado Regional Water Supply Plan.

The Llano Estacado plan is being run by the High Plains Underground Conservation District No. 1, and includes Parmer and Bailey counties. It is planning to pipe water down to this area from the northern Texas Panhandle.

Texico Mayor Marie Christian took the lead in seeking to join the Texas group, since the Ute Lake Water Project has run into snags. In fact, councilman Jeff Queener, Texico's representative to the Ute Lake group, said it's "going nowhere...we'll never see a drop of water from it."

In other business, the council: -- Heard a proposal from Eastern Plains Council of Governments representatives Eva Woods and Pat Garcia about a developer wanting to build 20 apartments along Highway 108 (adjacent to Borderline Cuts on Wheeler Avenue).

It would feature 3 bedroom units of 978 square feet and 4 bedroom units of 1,100 square feet, it was said. EPCOG would manage the low- to moderate-income units.

The council said it would be better to have such apartments off the highway and, perhaps, the developer could look at sites in residential areas.

-- Received a letter from Rick Qualls noting a water backup problems at Lamar and Hereford streets, and Lamar and Hamlin streets. City employees will clean out ditches there.

-- Heard councilman Oran Jay Autrey report on the Avenue F annexation plans. Two property owners' approvals still have not arrived, but are expected, he said.

-- Decided to terminate its contract with a cleaning service for city hall and the community center, and put out bids on it.

Public meeting planned on proposed Martin dairy

A public meeting with state officials to discuss the proposed Wayne Martin Dairy just outside Texico's city limits is scheduled for Feb. 1 at 6 p.m. mt at the Texico Community Center.

Representatives from the state's engineer's office, air quality division, and water quality division are expected to attend.

The Texico City Council hopes that there will be a large turnout of Texico and Farwell residents. The council opposes the proposed dairy.

- Okayed the fire chief's contract.
- Asked city employees to give their input into the areas they need for the new city hall, which would be a 50'x60' facility when built.
- Accepted the county's holiday schedule for Texico, too.
