Kimbrough returned the kick to the Steers 33. Goettsch connected with Kimbrough on a 13-yard pass. Ruiz ran up the middle for 22. But Anton intercepted at its 1.

Cade Christian caused a fumble, recovered by Gregory at the Anton 11. Kimbrough then ran the 11 for a TD at 6:40. The kick was blocked and it was 19-13.

On defense, Tyler Scott and Carlos Garcia had good tackles. But Anton tallied at 4:41 on a 46-yard pass. The run for extra points was good and it was 27-13.

Anton recovered an onside kick at the Farwell 42. Hunt had a QB sack for a 5-yard loss. Then Kimbrough intercepted and, behind a great block by Casey Meeks, scored from 45 yards out at 3:22. He kicked the extra point and it was 27-20.

Carlos Garcia tackled the kick returner. Ruiz had a good tackle, Gregory knocked down a pass, the Michael Hernandez and Casey Meeks combined on a great tackle. After Anton punted, Carlos Garcia caught a 15-yard pass.

In the 3rd quarter, Cale Stevenson tackled the kick returner at the Anton 22. Hernandez and Christian combined on a tackle for a 2-yard loss. But Anton hit a short pass, and the long run turned into a 79-yard TD at 10:16. The pass for extra points failed and it was 33-20.

Farwell used a "swinging gate" play, and Kimbrough was not covered by Anton at end. He caught the Goettsch pass and ran 58 yards for a TD. The kick was wide and it was 33-26.







-- Said there was no news on the state decision on allowing the Martin Dairy to be built near Texico.


