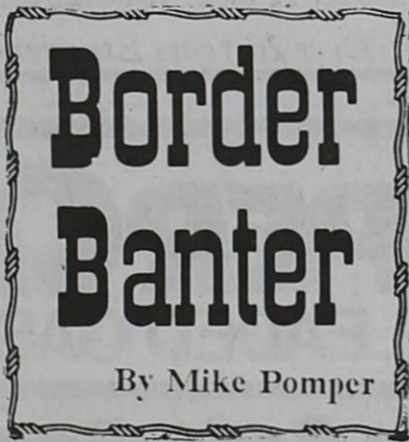

A very small, but highly significant change has occurred with this issue of the State Line Tribune.

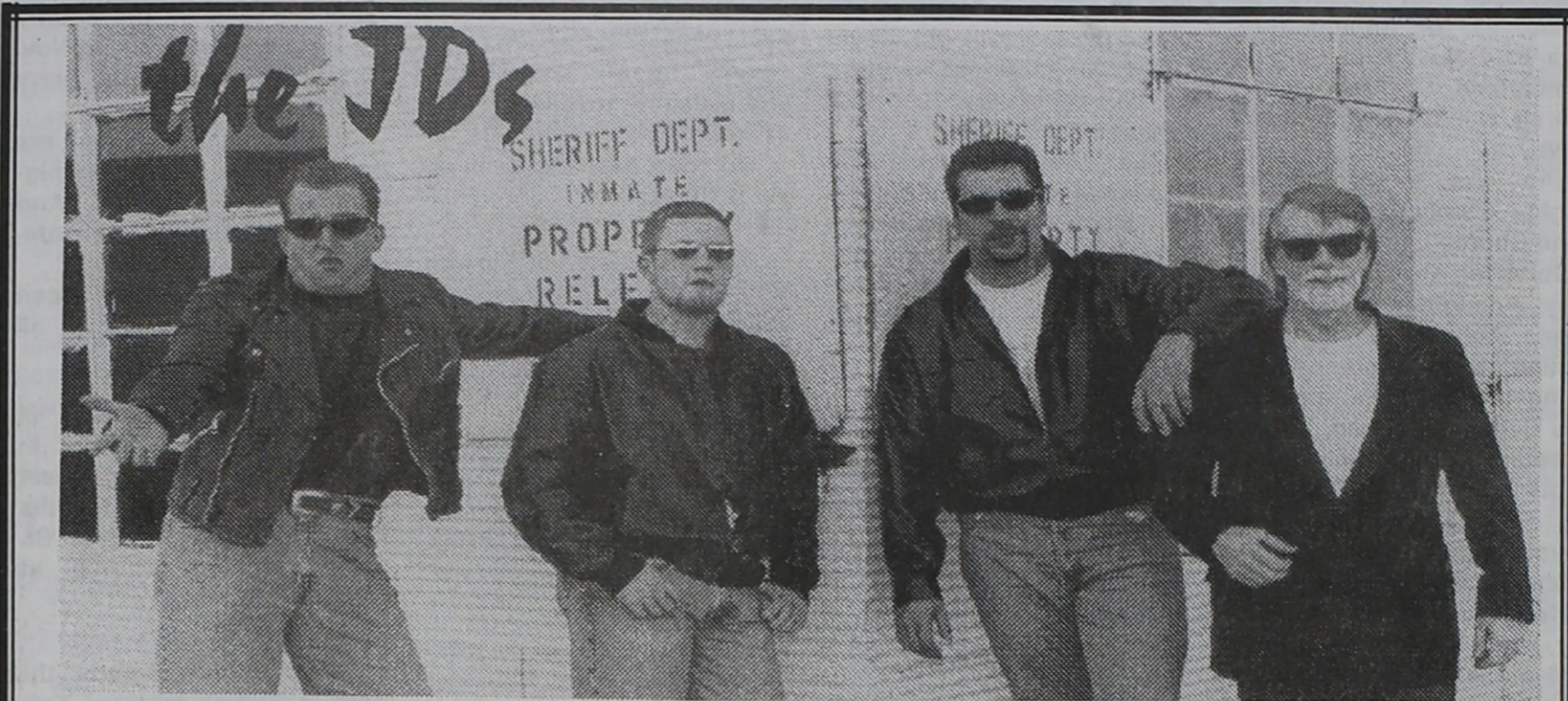
For many, many years, the Tribune came out on Fridays - at least according to the date atop the masthead on Page 1.

Winegeart undergoes spinal surgery

Bobby Winegeart, of Texico, underwent spinal surgery last Friday in Ecuador.

This was the first of two surgeries he will go through in an effort to bring full function and mobility in his lower torso, legs and feet.

Bobby's mother was in contact with Patsy Kelley at the Farwell Convalescent Center and the Tribune to give the first report on Bobby following the surgery and recovery weekend.

The spinal surgery was nine hours long. Dr. Kao was also able to repair a flap from an ulcer that had been bothering Bobby for some time.

He began physical therapy on Sunday and will undergo therapy two times this week. The physical therapy at this point is only to stimulate his feet. Throughout the week, Bobby's head will be raised little by little.

He is also being put into a hyperbaric chamber for pressure treatments to help further stimulate the nerves that have been repaired.

His pain tolerance is very good and things were going great as of the report on Monday morning.

He will undergo a hip replacement on Saturday. If all goes well from there, the plans are to have Bobby home by Nov. 25.

"Linda (Thompson, Bobby's mother) was ecstatic about Bobby and the way things are going so far," reported Ms. Kelley.

Lucio, Martin win 11th grid contest

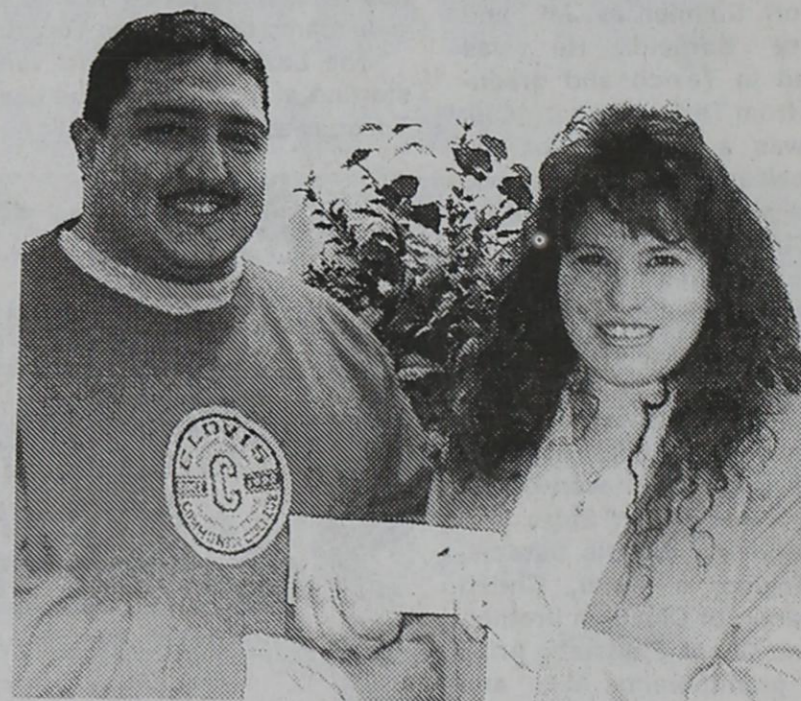
Once again, there was a tie for first place in last week's Area Merchants Football Contest.




