The Farwell Junior High graduation will be at 7:30 p.m. on May 24.

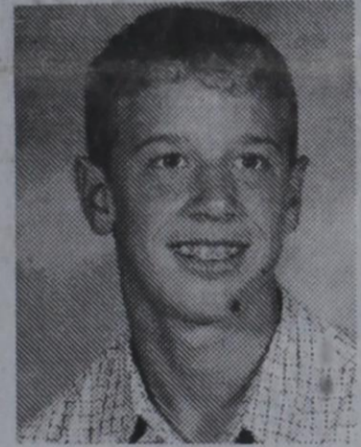

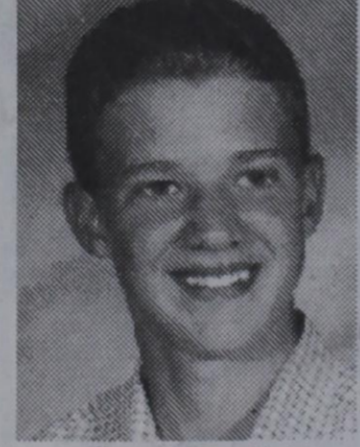

## Subdivision plans told to council

A planned residential subdivision adjacent to the Farwell Country Club was explained to the Farwell City Council on Tuesday by developer Randy Ware and engineer Chad Lydick.

Called Ironwood Estates Unit No. 1, lots are being platted along the country club road, which will be extended north to County Road X.

Lydick said that either the developer would build the road, or the county would do it, and Ware would pay for it. (see county commissioners story elsewhere in today's Tribune).

Lydick noted that homes are being built at two lots in the subdivision right now. Homeowners will be Carl Kirkland, owner of Kirkland Pump Co. and Bovina Pump Co., and his brother, Jack Allen Kirkland, owner of Kirkland, Kirkland & Co. CPA firm.

Ware told the council that although the subdivision is not part of the city of Farwell, they just wanted city officials to know what was going on.

## Lazbuddie man killed in accident

Phil Brockman, 56, of Clay's Corner, was fatally injured when he was hit by a car while riding his motorcycle Sunday evening on FM 145.

According to State Trooper Dean Fant, Brockman was riding his Goldwing Honda motorcycle eastbound when he was struck by a 1995 Mercury Cougar driven by Sammy Chavez, of Morton.

The accident occurred at 6:54 p.m. at the intersection of FM 145 and FM 1731, also known as the Oklahoma Lane crossroads.

Chavez was driving south on FM 1731. No citations have been issued pending an investigation.

Both vehicles came to rest in the southeast corner of the intersection and the adjacent field. Brockman was thrown from the motorcycle into the bar ditch. He was wearing a helmet, but sustained serious bodily and internal injuries.

Brockman was taken by Farwell ambulance to Muleshoe Area Medical Center, where he was pronounced dead.

repairs were completed.

-- Heard a request by Frances Kube, president of Parmer County Crimestoppers, and Murlene Smith, group treasurer, to paint a logo on the west side of city hall.

Mayor Jimmie Mace said the logo that was presented would give a negative image of the city, and the matter was tabled.

The group proposed having the Farwell High art department paint it as a class project. It would include a large police star, with a criminal pictured inside (in jail clothes).

The logo would give the name of the group and say "Callers remain anonymous -- rewards offered," and giving the local phone numbers.

She was born Jan. 13, 1919, in Taylor County. She married Cyrus Humphreys on May 4, 1935, in Quemado, Texas.

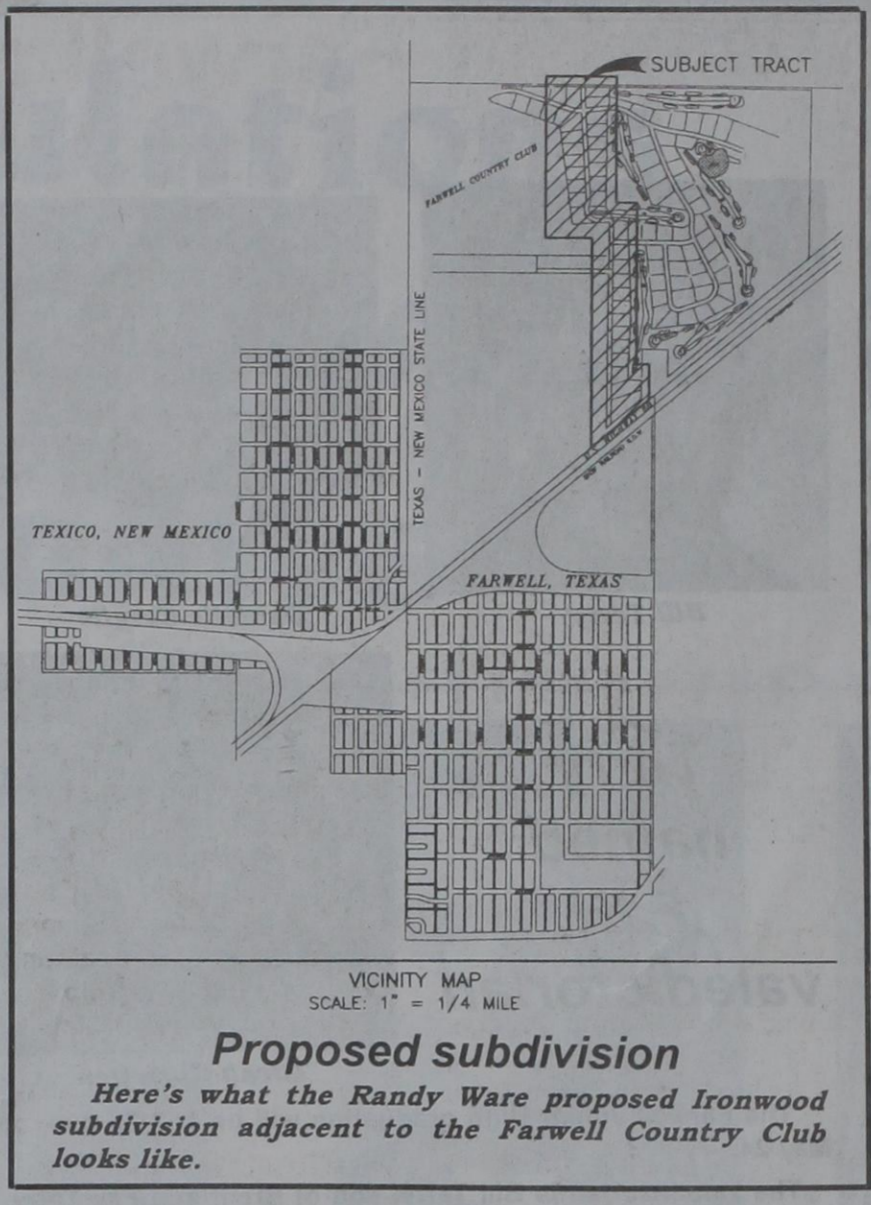
She was a lifetime VFW member, past president of the Auxiliary, past district president, a homemaker and a member of the Second Baptist Church.

**Financial Focus**

With more than 10,000 mutual funds on the market, you will almost always be able to find, at any given time, a few funds that are earning truly extraordinary returns. But before you invest in these funds, take a good, long look at what you are buying.

Some of these "super winners" could be showing triple-digit returns in a particular year. If you look beyond the current numbers, however, you may find some things that are unsettling.

First, an ultra-high performing fund may have a high "expense ratio" -- a figure used to determine the percent of assets taken from a fund to cover all operating costs. High expenses can cut into your returns.

More importantly, funds with stratospheric short-term performance may have poor long-term track records. To really get a sense of how a fund has performed in different economic environments, you should look at its 5- and 10-year returns.

Even these longer-term figures can't really help you predict how the fund will do in the future, but they will give you a more realistic sense of what the fund's managers have achieved over time.

Finally, some funds achieve their high short-term numbers because most of their assets are heavily concentrated in a few different stocks in one particular sector. That can work if the sector is "hot", but when it cools off, the fund's performance will plummet. The more diversified a fund's holdings are, the less susceptible the fund is to sudden "meltdowns."

Instead of chasing after those funds with sizzling short-term returns, how should you go about building a portfolio of mutual funds? Start by identifying your own investment goals and preferences and discussing them with your investment representative.

Above all else, don't look to "get rich quick" from mutual funds. They are truly designed for long-term investors. If you can keep that perspective in mind, and you do your homework, then you won't have to worry about pursuing the so-called "super winners."

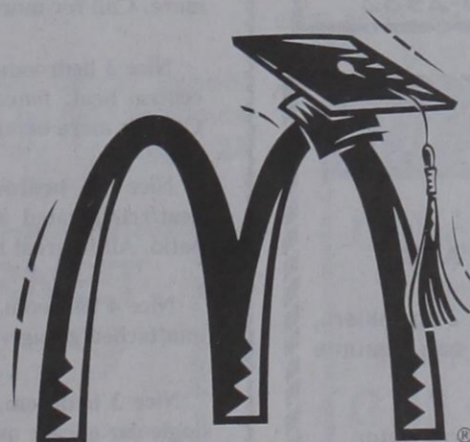

### Recipe of the Week

Tandoori Lobster Salad with Yogurt-Dill Dressing

- 1/2 lb. lobster meat, cooked
- 1 oz. Tandoori spice
- juice of 1 lemon
- 3 oz. baby mixed greens, washed
- 1/2 bunch fresh dill
- 1/2 cup plain (unsweetened) yogurt
- 1/2 cucumber, peeled and julienned
- 1/2 tomato, seeded and diced
- salt and pepper to taste

Marinate lobster with 1/4 tsp. lemon juice, tandoori spice, 1 tsp. yogurt and salt. Chill for one hour. Combine the greens with cucumber and tomato. For dressing, mix yogurt, lemon juice, dill, salt and pepper. Toss greens and dressing. Cut lobster into bite-sized pieces and place on top of salad. Garnish with chives and any fresh herbs.
