## D.C. put in a state of emergency

To say it was a scary situation on Tuesday was an understatement for Patty Brown, who works two blocks from the White House in Washington, D.C.
Patty, a 1985 Farwell High graduate, is the daughter of Mike Pomper, of Farwell.
She was at work in her American Society of Civil Engineers office when the terrorists struck targets in New ork City, Pennsylvania and the Pentagon
Rumors started flying immediately about other prominent D.C. landmarks, such as the Executive Building, and the USA Today building (which is near Se Patty lives in Arlington, Va.).
She called her dad early in the morning -- and the call went through. Shortly afterward, the lines were so tied phe youldn't call in or out of D.C. or New York City. She said that everyone was obviously very upset over might happen.
She told of a co-worker who had stopped at the Pentagon that morning to make a business call. He had just made his call when he saw the bombing. Fortunately, he was in the parking lot and uninjured, but his car shook from the blast.
A state of emergency was declared in Washington, and workers were encouraged to go home early. In fact, traffic could not enter the city, with roadblocks set up.
Normally, Patty would have taken the Metro subway home. But it goes under the Potomac River, and folks were not much in favor of taking that risk, not knowing if there would be further terroristic attacks.
The work day ended late in the morning, and Patty and several of her co-workers walked the $11 / 2$ miles to her condo in Arlington. One co-worker, who lives near Capital Hill in D.C., planned to stay the night at Patty's place.
Patty was scheduled to take an airline flight to Dallas on Wednesday, but her boss gave her the okay to cancel
