**Phipps, Lookingbill announce for JP position**

The announcements keep coming for next year's Parmer County political races.

County GOP Chairman John Tannahill had predicted that two persons would run for the Friona area Justice of the Peace post in the Republican primary. Announcing were Virgil Phipps and Shara Lookingbill.

The incumbent JP is Frances Euler, a Democrat. She has not announced yet whether she would run again or not.

Here's how the other races shape up:

\* Altha Herington will be running as a Republican for the county treasurer's post, due to the retirement of Anne Norton, a Democrat.

\* Elvis Powell, a Republican, has announced for the Lazbuddie area County Commissioner's post, due to the retirement of Raymond McGehee, a Democrat.

All the other incumbents have announced they will seek re-election: county clerk Colleen Stover, county judge Bonnie Clayton, Bovina area county commissioner Tom Ware, district clerk Sandra Warren, District Judge Gordon Green and JPs Vi Hutto (Bovina area) and Pam Haseloff (Farwell area). All are Democrats except for Mrs. Warren.

The filing period for next year's elections ends Jan. 2. Candidates need to register with their respective county chairmen -- Tannahill and Democrat Robert White.

## Telephone charge to increase

The Federal Communications Commission has ordered increases in telephone interstate end user access charges, to go into effect Jan. 1.

Monthly telephone bills from ENMR • Plateau will reflect the new rates.

Residential and single-line business interstate end user access charges will increase from \$3.50 per month to \$5.

Multi-line business customers will see their interstate end user access charge increase from \$6 per line per month to \$9.20.

Local phone companies also will be required to reduce access charges paid by long distance companies.

As a result, an increased portion of the cost of telephone line connections is to be recovered directly from

rates paid by local customers. In adopting the new rates, the FCC stressed that rural telephone companies serve only 8 percent of the nation's access lines, and with the new rates the interstate end user access charge paid by these customers will be more in line with the charges already paid by subscribers who receive service from larger, urban telephone companies.

## Area cotton crop shows consistently high quality

Plains Cotton Growers Inc. reports that this year's crop has showed consistently high quality.

Overall, the crop has averaged some of the best color, staple and strength readings observed in recent memory.

As of Dec. 7, the Lubbock cotton classing office had processed just over 1.6 million bales of cotton and expects to see just over 2 million bales by the end of the ginning season.

Staple lengths recorded at the USDA ag marketing service cotton classing office in Lubbock are averaging just under 1 1/16 inches (Staple 34) with about half having staples of 34 or longer and the rest coming in below that figure.

HVI color and leaf measurements have also been a pleasant surprise. More than 75 percent of the crop classed to date has been assigned color grades 11 or 21 while 93 percent of the bales have received leaf grades of 3 or better.

The only HVI reading that appears to be less than optimal appears to be Micronaire where the trend for much of the season has been to the high side of the optimal range. This is further evidenced by the fact that 45 percent of the bales classed at Lubbock has mike measurements in the 4.3-4.9 range and 19.9 percent have been assigned mike grades of 5.0 or greater.

The high mike readings are in many cases keeping producers from realizing the full price benefits of the longer than expected staple readings.
