Border Town Days swings into action

Planning is under way for the 36th annual Border Town Days, to be held on Saturday, July 27.

As always, the parade will begin at 11 a.m. ct, followed by the Day in the Park activities, highlighted by the Texico-Farwell Rotary Club's BBQ dinner.

Musical entertainment will be featured throughout the day. If you would like to sing or play a musical instrumental at BTDD, please call Mike Pomper at 481-3681 to sign up.

BTD will be a delightful family day, with several carnival rides scheduled, including a kiddie ferris wheel. There will be pony rides, and also train rides, plus other fun stuff for the youngsters.

The arts and crafts show will be expanded this year. In the past, only handmade arts and crafts items were allowed. This year, commercial vendors are invited to participate, too.

Here's a rundown on how the day looks:

Parade: Ruth Anne Bennett and Judy Lekovich are in charge of the parade. Ruth Anne can be called at 825-3822. Judy can be contacted at 482-3331. The parade theme is "Patriot Pride." Cash prizes are given the top four floats -- \$75, \$50, \$35 and \$25. The deadline for signups is July 22. After that date, you can sign up by calling Mike Pomper at the Tribune, 481-3681, but you will be placed at the end of the parade and not be eligible for cash prizes.

Volleyball Tournament: The 10th annual volleyball tourney will feature 6-man teams. The teams can be coed. The tourney will start at 3 p.m. cdt. It will use the Rally format, where a point is scored each time the ball is served. There will be no time limits because games go quicker. The cost is \$40 per team. Buttons: Richard Laverty is handling the buttons. They have been made by Southwest Sports (Doug and Susan Scioli), of Texico. Four hundred were numbered on the back. They will be sold for \$2 apiece in July as the chief fund-raiser to cover BTDD expenses. A number

Ancira resigns from Farwell School Board

Teresa Ancira has resigned from the Farwell School Board after serving nine years on it.

Mrs. Ancira has been board secretary.

She resigned because she has become a fulltime student at Clovis Community College, and will seek a degree in law enforcement.

The school board will meet June 13 and decide whether to appoint a replacement or leave the seat empty (which is allowed because there is less than one year left on Mrs. Ancira's term).

Texico Coach King resigns

Roy King has resigned from Texico Schools after teaching and coaching there for 26 years.

During his tenure as girls varsity basketball coach, he won more than 400 games and four state championships.

He told the Tribune on Wednesday that he really isn't sure what his future plans are.

He's 55 years old and is eligible for full retirement benefits. He may move back to Arlington, Texas, where his ex-wife and children are. He may move back to Kentucky, where he was raised.

Family considerations were a strong reason for his resignation. Also, he was unhappy with a

Veteran Clovis policeman hired by Texico council

Gilbert Salguero was hired as a Texico police officer by the City Council on Tuesday. He starts work Sunday.

Salguero was a Clovis city policeman for 16 years. His was the only application for the post, said Police Chief Kelley Brophy.

Brophy also presented a budget for the coming fiscal year about the same total as this year, except that Brophy has made deep cutbacks in non-salary items in order to propose salary raises for his officers.

Currently, a police officer here receives \$10.21 an hour. He wants this increased to \$11.06 an hour. Other increases would be for senior patrolman, \$12.24 an hour, and the chief, \$15.64 an hour.

Brophy said officers are paid \$11.78 an hour in Clovis; \$12.12 an hour in Curry County, and \$11.80 an hour in Portales.

Brophy stressed that he has saved thousands of dollars off the current budget in order to find money for the pay hikes.

The council took no action after councilman Oran Jay Autrey said he wanted to research this more.

In other business, the council:

-- Approved a fence permit at 709 Hereford St. for Jesus Ramirez, as long as it meets city codes.

-- Allowed Fire Chief Lewis Cooper to buy a radio, chargers and batteries for the fire department.

-- Heard Cooper note that, due to the dry conditions, the state has a no open burning policy in effect, except for irrigated crop land.

-- Heard city Street Supt. Clarence Smith say that the locks have been changed on the landfill.

-- Heard Cooper suggest that if summer help is hired, they can be used to pickup burnable trash items that folks have left in alleys; they are fire hazards.

-- Heard Brophy say that the national antique car rally will be coming through Texico on June 17 probably between 2:30 and 5 p.m., coming from Littlefield. He asked folks to help his office put out flags along the highway starting at 8 a.m. to give the occasion a festive air.

-- Agreed to seek bids for a cemetery well (for irrigation purposes). Autrey has written the specifications.

-- Agreed to seek some summer help. The city has \$2,000 budgeted for this.

-- Heard Autrey report that he has talked with local architects about plans for a new city hall, and he urged

LIVE CATTLE: Cattle have been reluctant to move in either direction up or down. Cash traded at \$63 this week, which was a disappointment. Lows made roughly 7 weeks ago are still expected to support this market. A close below those levels would project another wash-out into the \$50s. Seasonally, prices are usually weak during the summer, but overall higher from May to August.

FEEDER CATTLE: Feeders continue to wait for fed cattle prices before making any quick moves up or down. Prices have caught inside a small range between \$73.75-77.00 basis the August contract. Seasonally, prices have traded higher from late May into late July 14 of the last 15 years. Technically, prices are in position to repeat a move this year, but much depends on fed cattle.

CORN: July prices turned short term trends down on Friday this week as most of the corn in the Midwest is now planted. Weather conditions call for scattered showers across much of the growing area which did little to support the market. There is still some support down around last week's low of \$2.04, but very little below that.

SOYBEANS: Prices have reached for the sky compared to the rest of the grain complex, but are now showing signs of weakness. Short term trends are still higher in the nearby months, but down in the back. Rumors that China had turned down Brazilian beans because of mold problems was supportive over the short term, but expected to be resolved over the long term.

WHEAT: Prices turned down short term trends on Friday. As harvest progresses, this market may still have a shot at higher prices depending on overall production losses. It is very rare to see any type of rally in wheat during this time of year, but if the crop gets shorter than earlier estimates, prices are expected to adjust to the upside.

COTTON: Prices have been caught inside a small 6 day trading range. A move back above 40 cents should push prices up toward the highs made back in March at 41.50 cents basis the July contract. Support levels at 38.50 cents hold in order for this advance to continue. A close below support may signal an end to the uptrend we're now seeing?
