



<u>LIVE CATTLE</u>: April Live were able to close higher on the week after testing lows twice over the last 4 days. Packers bought a few cattle at \$70, but are out looking aggressively today. If packers are short bought, prices may actually end up trading steady at \$71 this week? Cash prices have dropped about \$4 off their highs and the nearby futures almost \$6. It's time to see a turn back up!

FEEDER CATTLE: Feeders basically have followed the Live Cattle prices on the way down. The fact that August Live Cattle traded down to a low of \$65 was enough to keep the pressure on the feeders. Cash feeders are beginning to show some improvement as of late last week. All the spreads have come back to normal which means that the entire cattle complex should move together.

<u>CORN</u>: The USDA Planting Intention report released today showed increases in planted acres by 4% over last year, and based upon trend line yields of 138 Bu/Ac., another possible record this year at 10.9 billion bushels. This pushed prices to new lows late in the day. All trends are still lower and it will take some work to turn this market. The corn is not in the ground yet?

<u>SOYBEANS</u>: Today's USDA Planting Intention report showed about a 2% decrease in planted acres from last year. This generated some buying interest off the open and then prices began to cool off during the rest of the day. Trends are still up and price targets remain up around the \$5.00 level basis the May contract. Exports and demand should remain strong throughout the year.

<u>WHEAT</u>: The USDA report was basically neutral and prices were able to trade a little higher early in the day, but once short term trends began to turn down, there was a rush to exit the market. Prices traded in a 17 cent range today with the nearby May Chicago Wheat closing over 9 cents lower on the day. The KC Wheat held up much better and long term trends are still pointing up.

<u>COTTON</u>: The overall trade was somewhat surprised when prices opened lower and continued to fall throughout the day today. Although the nearby May finished down about 123 points, basically the market just erased the gains from the previous day. It was enough move down to turn short term trends lower, but support around the 38 cent level was able to hold.
