## 911 situation

leads to call for inquiry
State Line Tribune publisher Mike Pomper asked to address the Parmer County Commis-
sioners on Monday about the recently 911 situation involving the death of Skip Magby, of Lazbuddie. County Judge Bonnie Clayton-Heald told Pomper that since the topic was not on the agenda, he would have to schedule it for the next commissioners' meeting, on March 10 He agreed to do so.

Pomper said he plans to urge the commission-
ers to hire an outside exers to hire an outside ex-
pert or panel to look into how the county's 911 operation is handled and whether improvements are needed.

He said he felt that, due to political interests, it's
in the county's best interin the county's best interest to have someone
other than local law enother than local law enerators of the county's
911 system do an in-depth 911 system do an in-depth
study to see if a serious problem is occuring.
Pomper cited the Letter to the Editor in the Feb. 20
issue of the Tribune from Doyle Weir, Lazbuddie EMS director.

In that letter, Weir said:
"Since this past Christmas, 911 has failed to send the most appropriate emergency agency (the emergency services agency nearest the inci-
