



Parmer County 9-1-1 improvements coming

Parmer County emergency service providers met on May 9 at the Bovina EMS building with the county commissioners, Panhandle Regional Planning Commission's Pam Nielsen, and other interested parties.

Ms. Nielsen called the meeting to discuss how 9-1-1 is working in Parmer County. She discussed the history of 9-1-1, reviewed the emergency service boundaries, discussed standard operating procedures required for dispatching, and homeland security.

The recent situation involving the death of Skip Magby, of Lazbuddie, was discussed. The time frame of responses was not resolved. According to the Friona dispatcher, the first call they received was at 10:53 a.m. But Debbie Weir, a member of the Lazbuddie EMS, said she had gotten a call about 10:48 a.m. from the Magby residence -- after the caller said she had tried to call the dispatchers.

Many folks in the Lazbuddie area have been unhappy about how 9-1-1 has been working, saying that other area emergency agencies were being called to their area before the Lazbuddie EMS and fire departments were called on three occasions.

The Lazbuddie folks were told by Ms. Nielsen that in each of those cases, errors were made and that it was not done deliberately.

Lazbuddie EMS records showed:

-- The first case was on Dec. 26 with a rent house fire. Jim Roy Daniel called 9-1-1, asking for the Lazbuddie Fire Department. Friona dispatcher dispatched Friona Fire Department, which was about 20 miles from the scene; the Lazbuddie Fire Department was 9 miles away. Interviews with Friona officials indicated a false impression that the Lazbuddie Fire Department would not respond north of running water draw.

-- On Jan. 13, a pickup fire: Matt Goe called 9-1-1

Mares named new Texico police chief

After an executive session of May 9, the Texico City Council appointed John Mares as the new city police chief.

The resignation of Kelley Brophy was received.

Mayor Jerry Cunningham said Brophy was taking a job with a computer company in California.

Brophy had served as city police chief for five vears.

Mares was promoted from chief deputy. He has been with the Texico police force for four years.

Also, the city does not plan to hire a fourth police officer, but to go with the current staff: Mares, Wayne Atcheley and Gilbert Salguero.

Parmer County District Attorney Johnny Actkinson said a capital murder, of a police officer charge was filed against Jose Adam Gomez, 38, of Dumas, Texas, this week.

Friona police Officer Jose Herrera, 31, was killed on April 13 during a chase through Parmer County rural roads.

He was killed when his police unit was struck by a pickup driven by Gomez, said state police.

Actkinson said the incident began when police received reports of Gomez panhandling in Bovina.

Killough resigns as Farwell High principal; Cates to take position

Farwell School Supt. Larry Gregory has announced that high school principal Weldon Killough will be returning next school year to being high school counselor.

He had served in that position for several years before becoming principal this school year.

The counselor's post at the high school was left vacant this year.

Gregory also said that the school board is expected to approve this week hiring Gary Cates as

the high school principal. Cates currently is

Wellman School principal. Previously, he was a junior high coach, boys' high school basketball coach and junior high principal at Farwell.

When police arrived, Gomez took off and the county sheriff's office gave chase.

Herrera was off duty at the time doing reports at the Friona police station, said police. He apparently heard about the chase over his scanner and went to assist in a 1998 Ford police unit. He was westbound on County Road N, a dirt road, when he saw Gomez' pickup coming toward him.

Actkinson said Herrera pulled off into the bar ditch and stopped his unit.

Gomez' pickup rammed the police unit. Actkinson said the incident was taped by video cameras in both Herrera's

vehicle and the county sheriff's vehicle chasing Gomez.

"We believe that shows it was capital murder," said Actkinson.


Gomez was taken to Covenant Hospital in Lubbock with head and chest injuries.

There are outstanding warrants against him, including car theft, said Actkinson.


When Gomez is ready to leave the hospital, the capital murder charge will be filed.

A passenger in Gomez' vehicle, Tanya Mireles, 30, of Tulia, Texas, was also injured and taken to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo.

She is currently in Potter County Jail on outstanding warrants. Actkinson said he doesn't expect to file charges against her.

Due to a lack of enough EMS personnel in the sparsely-populated Rhea area, their district is divided among the Friona and Bovina EMS crews (County Road 5). Both the trio and Shonnah Black received All-State honors. Shonnah received a scholarship, too.



The Parmer County Commissioners on Monday passed a resolution urging state legislators to seek a statewide solution to the \$10 billion budget shortfall.

The county is asking the state legislature "to consider passage of state revenue increases that would more evenly spread the burden of costs across the state and better protect local ad valorem taxpayers."

The state Senate and House of Representatives have a legislative conference committee which is seeking to decide how to balance the budget.

Proposed state budget reductions to health care and criminal justice "will greatly affect the counties' abilities to carry out state and federal manhealth facilities to treat increased numbers of indigent and uninsured patients at local taxpayers' expense," says the county's resolution.

It adds, "The criminal justice reductions will necessitate counties and their jails to house growing numbers of criminal offenders at local taxpayers' expense."







of the Lazbuddie school. The cell phone call apparently went to Castro County, then to Parmer County, then to Friona dispatcher. Lazbuddie Fire Department got the call more than 45 minutes after the cell call was made.

-- On Feb. 3, the Magby situation occurred.

Lazbuddie Fire Chief Nicky Nickels said some folks in his area don't feel the 9-1-1 system is working, and are using private phone calls to get response.

A major positive that came out of the meeting was that plans are going into effect to bring the Lazbuddie "965" area code users into direct contact with the Friona dispatcher, instead of going to the Muleshoe dispatcher first.

Other items Ms. Nielsen will work on include:

-- Create operating procedures. She will provide examples to each agency this week.

-- Provide printed maps. They will be sent out to interested agencies this week.

-- Communications improvements. Lazbuddie Fire and EMS, Friona police (the dispatcher) and West Texas Rural Telephone will work together to develop a plan for improving communications between the departments. This plan and related costs will be presented to the Parmer County Commissioners.

-- Address corrections. Five Area Telephone will be contacted for the latest version of its Lazbuddie and Lariat customers in Parmer County. The new listing will be provided to Lazbuddie Fire and EMS as they have volunteered to help address customers in that area.

Ms. Nielsen said a major problem is that folks think they can use a cell phone to call 9-1-1 and it shows on the computer where they live. It doesn't. It only does with landline phones.







-- Increased municipal court fees from \$17 to \$34.


