Berend, Hunt, Parham, Billingsley show champions at Parmer livestock show

The numbers were again strong at this year's Parmer County Junior Livestock Show sale on Saturday at the Friona Show Barn. The total was over \$72,000, compared to over \$73,000 last year, plus add-ons. This compares to just over \$71,000, plus add-ons, two years ago, and \$74,000 three years ago.

One hundred and forty-two animals made the sale, compared to 148 last year. At the sale, the grand champion steer sold for \$2,250; the grand champion goat for \$300; the grand champion swine for \$1,400, and the grand champion lamb for \$1,200.



Goodbye, current **Texico City Hall**

The Texico City Council on Tuesday approved a suggestion by councilman Oran Jay Autrey to include tearing down the current city hall when the new city hall is built.

Autrey will ask the architect, Paul Reid, to include an alternate bid in the bid package for the new city hall which would allow demolition of the current facility if funds are available.

In other business, the council:

-- Heard Mayor Jerry Cunningham say that his suggestion to add a \$1 voluntary cemetery fee onto water bills won't happen because the state says it's illegal. He will look into other ways to help fund cemetery maintenance.

-- Noted that new city inspector Terry Martin will begin work soon after the state gives the final go-ahead.

-- Heard Fire Chief Lewis Cooper report that he and Police Chief Kelley Brophy met with a representative of Mesquite Village to voice their concerns over access to the project and lack of dumpsters. They were told the problem would be worked on.

Cooper also said that long-range plans call for Mesquite Village to double or triple in size. All the current 20 apartments are rented.

-- Tabled a request by Jeff Queener to erect a 6-ft. metal fence at 800 N. Lamar St. Martin will check into it before a vote is taken.

-- Tabled a business registration for Angelica's Mexican Food, located at the flea market, until Martin checks into it.

-- Heard Brophy said that his idea to have more street lights along the highway won't work because of the high cost involved.

-- Okayed Cooper buying a \$300 printer.

-- Heard Cooper say that state regulations say that the Texico Fire Department must have a pharmacy license in order to buy drugs for the ambulance.

-- Heard Martin report on a meeting he attended of the Ute Water Commission. He said, "I don't think they know what they want to do themselves."

-- Called an executive session to discuss personnel and litigation at councilman Doug Scioli's request.

-- Heard about a major sludge problem in the back yard at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Smith. Apparently, the city sewer in the alley stopped up on Jan. 24, and sludge has been appearing in the Smith's back yard.

The Smiths have been unable to use facilities like their bathroom, kitchen sink, etc., due to the problem. City Street Supt. Clarence Smith said plans call to

dig up the sewer with a backhoe on Jan. 29 as soon as the gas mains are marked by PNM Gas.

Supt. Smith said the sludge in the back yard will be raked up by city employees, also.

Texico School District voters go to the polls on Tuesday to elect three school board members and to vote on a 2-mill

While I'm not normally one to support taxes, this is the exception to the

This levy is most important to the continuing success of Texico Schools and I strongly urge all district voters to support it.

Texico Schools are recognized throughout New Mexico as a special school that succeeds on a very high level, both academically and athletically.

That type of level can only be maintained by financial support.

As Supt. R.L. Richards pointed out in a Tribune article two weeks ago, funds raised by this levy can only be used for capital expenditures, such as maintenance and upkeep of the buildings. It doesn't go toward salaries.

In that article, Richards stressed that the levy is vital because it's part of the criteria used to get extra school funds from the state. For example, if the levy had not been in place, the state would not have provided funding for the new Texico Sports

Also, the state matches funds raised by the 2-mill

This levy is actually not a new tax. It simply replaces the past levy that has run out.

All in all, when you weigh the pluses and the minuses, there's absolutely no question: the levy needs to be continued.

In a state like New Mexico, where most funds are doled out from Santa Fe, every school must do all it can to ensure the maximum amount of funds will come back to their school from the

Vote for the levy, please.
