ing in Washington, D.C., creating a problem for civil service employees. Interestingly, this problem really
wasn't solved until the 1970 s, with a push into suburbia. As World War I was close to ending (four months away), a story was headlined "Great Victory" and talked about the success of French and American forces be(ween Soissons and Chateau Thierry against the Germans. This was the beginning of the end for the Kaiser's forces as the Allies pressed forward.
Another Page 1 article talked of the Marne battles in France. We are going to counter-attack.
