I am thankful for doctors, nurses, pharmacists




and medical workers, who care for our physical needs and of those suffering from disease, injury and old age.


Craig Walls, also with 11 right, won the 2nd place prize of \$7. He was 8 off the tie breaker.





nied their first state title since 1996 after coming up short the last two years. Texico was determined to win and they did! You could see the determination on the faces of the players and in the way they played the

Texico kicked off to start the game with a touchback. Loving completed an 8-yard pass before Jared Curtis and Bryce Bailey teamed up for a QB sack and a 9-yard loss. On 3rd down, Logan Brown stuck the running back for a 1-yard loss, forcing the punt.

Texico started with great field position at the Loving 44 due to a short punt -- the winds were fierce all game long. Texico was held and punted into the end zone. On 3rd and 2, Braden Vaughan stopped the runner for no gain; forcing another punt.

From the Loving 47, Texico got a first down before being halted. Again, they punted into the end zone. Excellent defense by Texico, highlighted by a tackle by Corey Bell and Brown for a 1-yard loss and a stop on 3rd and 3 by Bailey forced another Loving punt.


Texico started at its 43 and scored on the 2nd play from scrimmage when Vaughan broke through the line and raced 53 yards to paydirt. The kick missed and it was 6-0 with 40 seconds left in the first quarter.

The Falcons started at their 20. John Nate Williams batted down a pass, then teamed with Curtis on a QB pressure to force an incomplete pass. The Falcons punted to the Wolverines 47. Texico got a first down but had to punt. It was partially blocked and loving took over at the Texico 48.

The Falcons were successful in moving the ball for the first time in the game. They came up with first downs

on big pass plays and some good runs. They scored when the QB was forced to scramble and was about to be wrapped up, he managed to find an open receiver in the end zone for a 12-yard score. The kick was wide and it was 6-6 at 5:59 of the second quarter.

The Wolverines started at their 20 and were able to move the ball downfield to the Loving 21 highlighted by a Vaughan run of 38 yards. But a penalty and a tough defense stopped the drive when a 4th down pass fell in-

Loving started at its 21. Joe Zaikowski had a QB sack for a 16-yard loss. Loving punted to end the first half.

Mark Peabody returned the 2nd half kickoff 23 yards to the Texico 34. Again, Texico moved the ball well, with big runs by Peabody, for 12, and Vaughan, for 10. But the ball was turned over on downs at the Falcons 30.

The Wolverine defense forced Loving to go 3 and out after Bailey and Brown tackled the runner, and Bailey had a solo tackle. A wind-aided punt put Texico at its 12 but they quickly moved to midfield on runs of Peabody, for 10, and Vaughan, for 16.

Going for it at midfield on 4th and 1, Vaughan snuck over for the 1st down. Vaughan and Peabody traded runs to get to the 31, but a 4th and 4 effort fell short.

After a couple of good tackles by Zane Anderson, Loving had to punt, to the Texico 35. A 15-yard face mask penalty gave Texico the ball at the Loving 32. A reverse run by Zaikowski gained 9, and Peabody made a first down at the Loving 15. Vaughan then hit Zaikowski with a TD pass. Peabody ran in the extra points and Texico led 14-6 with 3:52 left in the game.

Loving started at its 20 and moved the ball to midfield on passes of 15, 13 and 9 yards. But Bailey tipped a Loving pass directly to Jesse Serrano, who returned it 67 yards for a score to ice the game with 2:25 to go. Brown kicked and extra point and it was 21-6.

The Wolverine defense didn't let up. On 1st down, they tackled the receiver for a 3-yard loss. Curtis and Alex Mendoza teamed up on the next play to pressure the QB, forcing an incomplete pass. And Peabody knocked down a long pass on 3rd down. The Falcons' last pass try on 4th down went incomplete. The Wolverines took over on the Loving 19 and ran out the clock.

All year long, fans had wanted to see a close game for the Wolverines. When they got it, they held their breath all game long until Serrano's interception. After the game, I heard several fans say they were both mentally and physically exhausted. What an awesome way to end the season!


Offensively, the Wolverines did what they had to do to win each game. Nothing more, nothing less. The coaches never panicked, and it was reflected in the kids. The offense put up big numbers all year, averaging 42.25 points and 330 yards per game.

Defensively, they dared teams to beat them. Nobody could run on the Wolverines. The defense held opponents to a total of 19 points for the season, and an average of 90 yards per game. At times, the secondary appeared to be playing too soft on the receivers allowing some easy pass completions. What the Wolverines were saying was, "We will give you the short pass, but you won't beat us long." And "You won't beat us passing the ball because sooner or later, you are going to make a mistake ... and when you make a mistake, we will be there to take advantage."

Credit for the team's success must also go to all those kids who don't necessarily get their name in the paper each week, they do their job every day whether it's making that block to open a hole, or it's playing on red team each week in practice, or it's being a team manager. Every person on the team is just as important to the team's success as any other. Be proud of yourself -- you deserve it!

I, for one, am very proud to be a part of Texico Schools and the community of Texico, it's more than just a school or a town, it's one big family. This state championship is yours, too!

Texico continues moving toward truck prohibition

The Texico City Council and its city inspector, Terry Martin, held a public hearing on Nov. 20 at the Texico Community Center to discuss prohibiting heavy trucks

The hearing was held for the benefit of any trucker who live in the city so they could voice their concerns.

None showed up. Instead, the hearing turned into an informal discussion by the council on how to proceed with an ordinance since city streets are taking a beating.

Problems include street corners where trucks turn. and oil spilled on the streets by trucks. Butch Tharp, former Texico mayor, said loaded trucks on State and Craig streets, in particular, were a serious problem. He also complained of trucking businesses being operated out of homes without the owners having business light censes from the city.

The council discussed the need to do a better job of seeking state funds for infrastructure work.

Also suggested was requiring folks who park trucks in the city to get parking permits if certain requirements

It was noted that not all trucks would be prohibited under a new ordinance. For example, the trash disposal trucks would be allowed, plus delivery vehicles.

Martin presented a copy of Clovis' ordinance prohib iting certain vehicles in residential areas. Based on this, he will put together a proposal to give to the council at its Nov. 25 meeting.

A pass interference call against Sunray moved the ball to the Bobcat 32. On 4th and 10, Johnson hit Gregory with a pass good for 20 yards to the Sunray 12 as the 1st quarter ended.

Farwell went for it on 4th and 3 at its 44, putting in the jumbo package -- linemen Chavez and Cabello in the backfield. And Edwards gained the first down running behind them.

But Sunray intercepted at midfield to stop the drive.

On defense, good tackles were recorded by Olmos, Cabello, Ware, Mitchell and Gregory as Sunray ran out the clock.


