## Texico City Council receives proposed ordinance to prohibit heavy vehicles

The Texico City Council on Tuesday received a proposed ordinance from city building inspector Terry Martin which would prohibit heavy vehicles within most of the city limits.

The council has been concerned about heavy semi-trailers tearing up the city's streets. So it has been discussing a truck prohibition for several months. This included holding a public hearing in November, but no truckers attended it. So the council is moving forward on a truck prohibition.

Martin's proposal included:

- Making it unlawful for any heavy vehicle (except for recreational vehicles) having a net weight of four or more tons (basically tractor-trailers) to be driven in residential zoned areas within the city.

An exception would be for trucks unloading and delivery or pickup and loading of materials, merchandise and furniture, "and other than for the temporary parking of such vehicle for the purpose of furnishing service to any owner or occupant of property within such zone district."

- It would be unlawful for any person to park a truck, tractor, trailer, semi-trailer or other vehicle, having a net weight of four or more tons, within any street right-of-way in residential zoned areas.

But the ordinance would allow persons to park empty trucks on their property, if they pay an annual \$45 fee. In addition, their trucks a) must be parked off the streets and out of the alleys, b) must have on-site parking, c) cannot be left with engine running for a long period of time, and d) can not have refrigerant unit running long periods of time.

Martin said that the truck prohibitions do not apply to recreational vehicles and motor homes having a gross vehicle weight rating under 18,000 lbs. which are used for personal, non-business purposes and are parked within the aforementioned zone by the owner, occupant, or guest of the occupant.

Martin pointed out that this ordinance draft has come about as a result of the council discussions over the past few months, and at the public hearing. "I hope to stimulate dialog with this draft being presented to the public," he added.

Any persons with questions about the draft may call Martin at 799-9157. He said he is more than willing to discuss it with any Texico residents. He noted that he will make a list of the calls he receives and report back

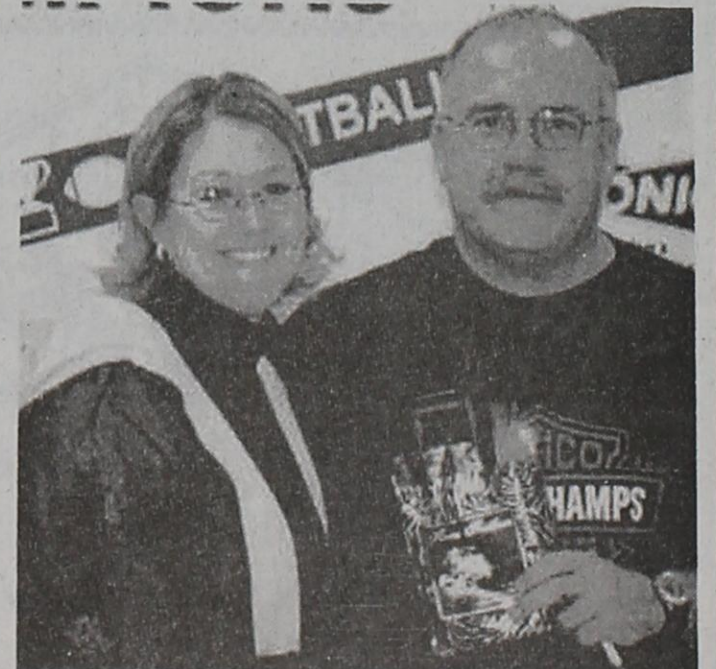

"Every soldier who wanted a photo with the President got one. You

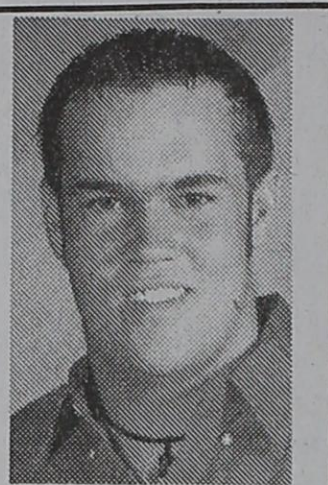
could tell he was really enjoying himself. He worked his way over the course of about 90 minutes toward my side of the room.

To which he responded, "I'm proud of what you do captain." Then he moved on.



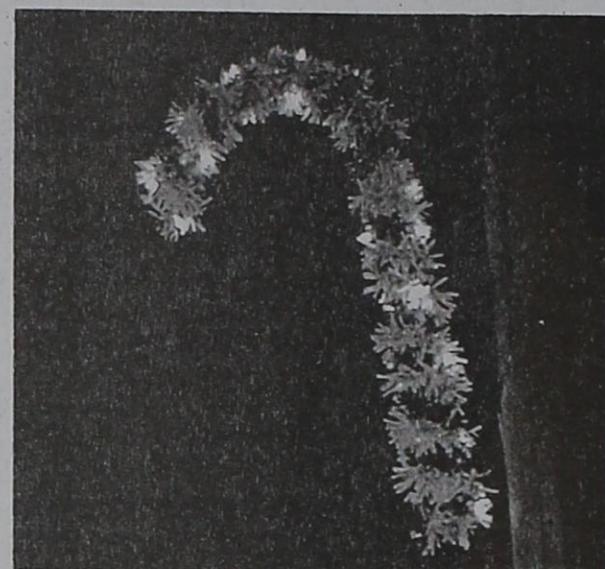

Dec. 3 marked the beginning of the filing period for next year's Parmer County elections. The filing deadline is Jan. 2.

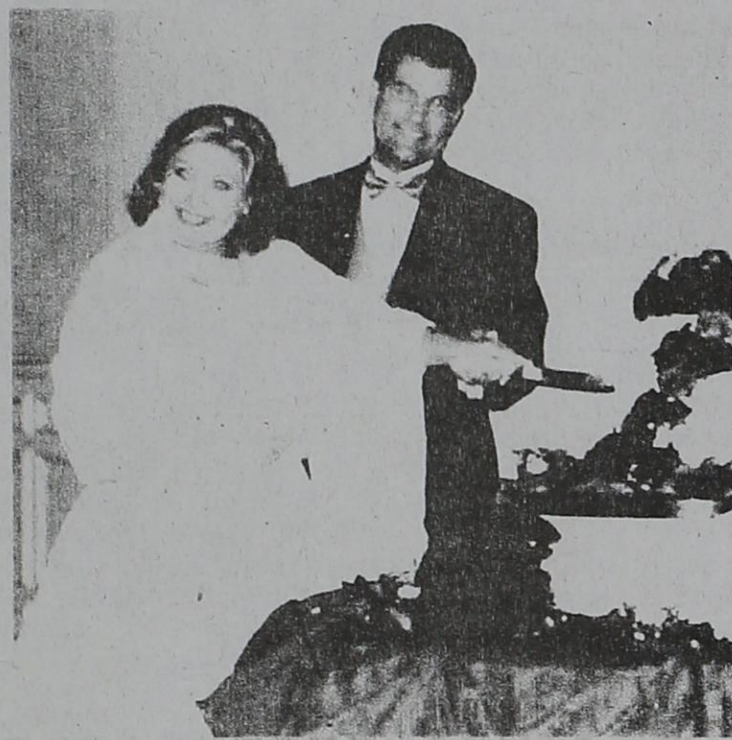
County GOP Chairman John Armstrong reports that as of Monday, the only candidate to sign up is Kirk Frye, for reelection as the county commissioner for the Friona area.
