I think it's most helpful to adolescents as they grow toward maturity to have positive values reinforced in their lives.

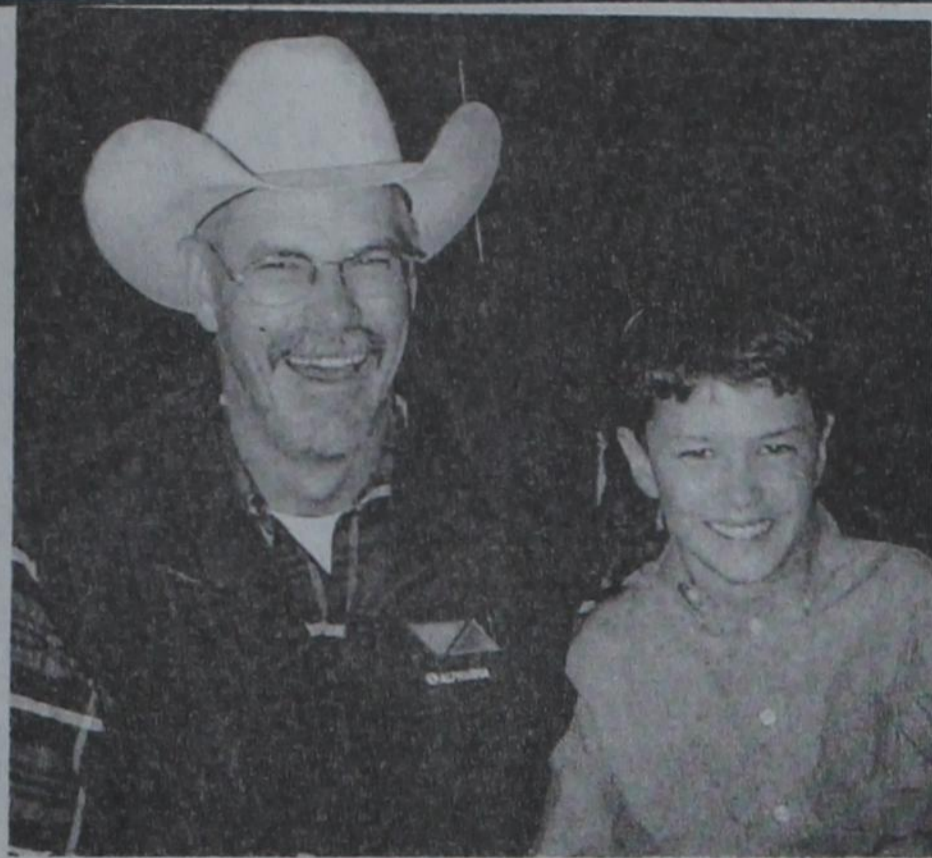
That means that when they excel in academics and athletics, it needs to be publicly noted.

So ... teachers and coaches, be prepared! I will "bug you" to give credit to youths who excel.

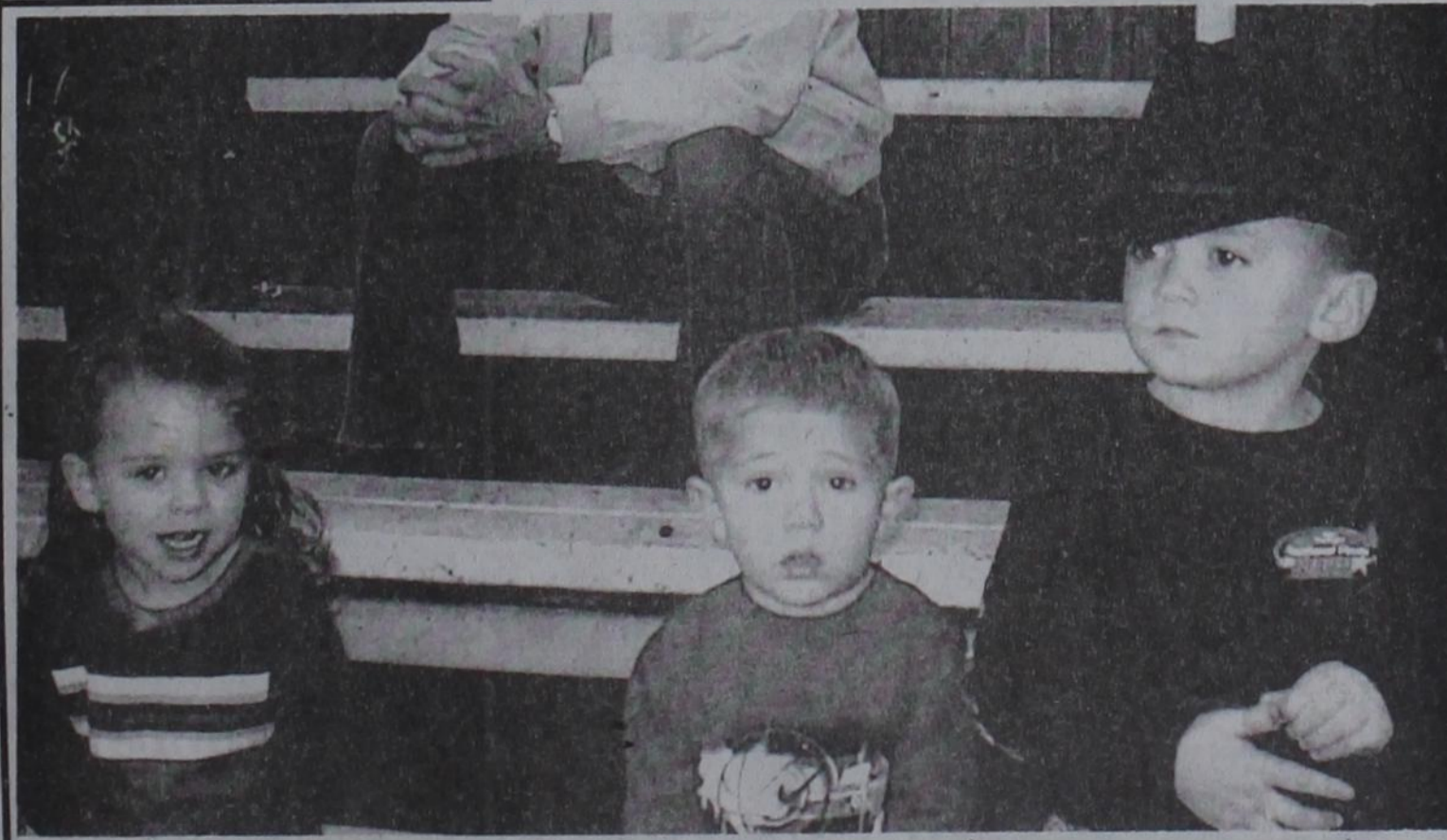
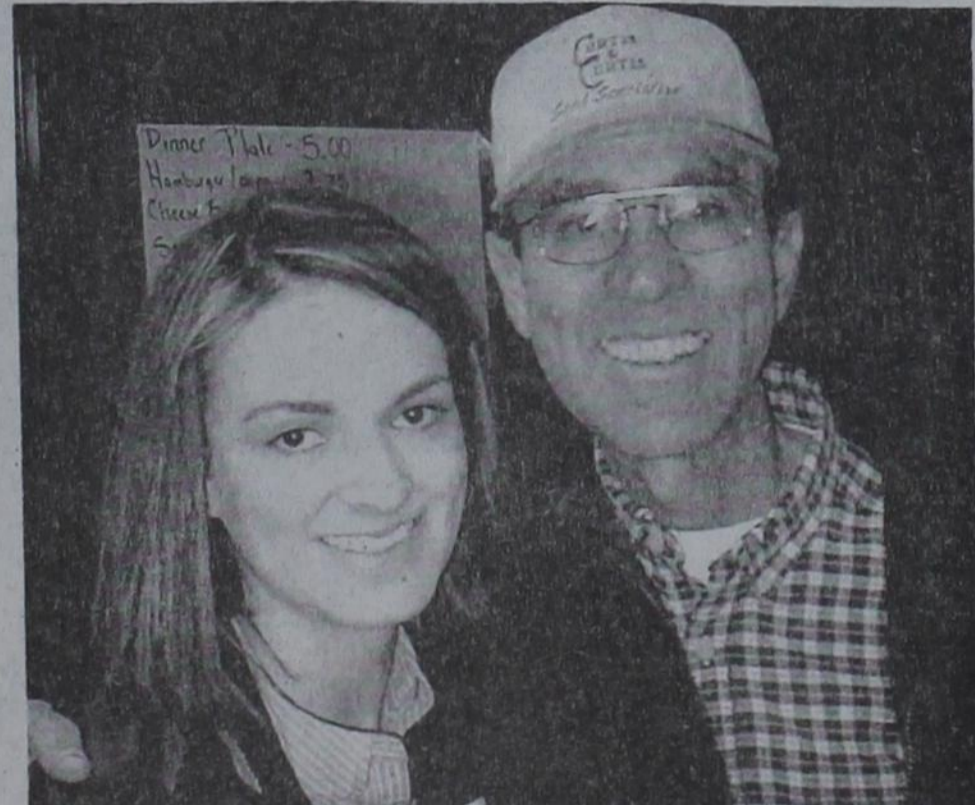

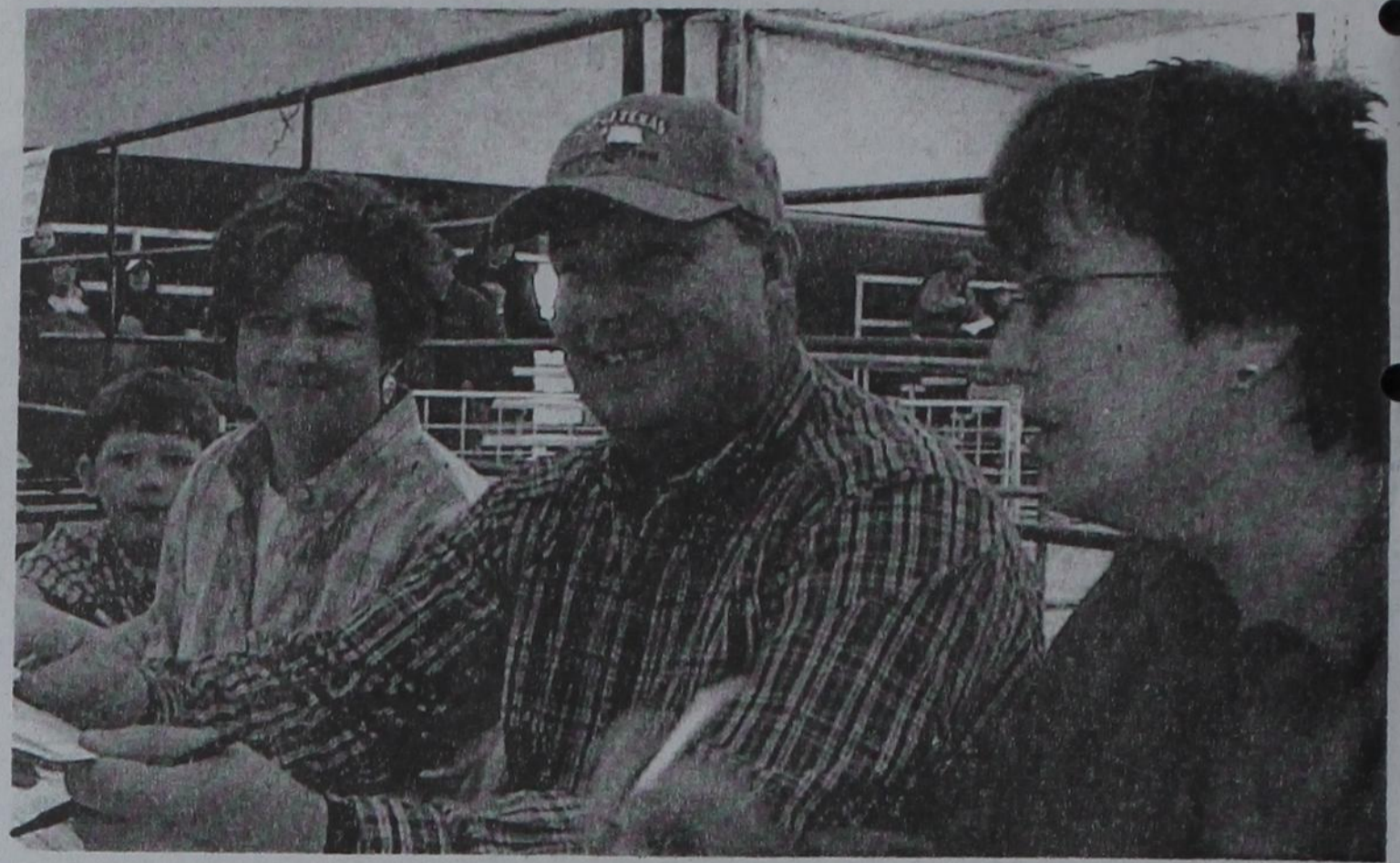

Leslie Vannatta

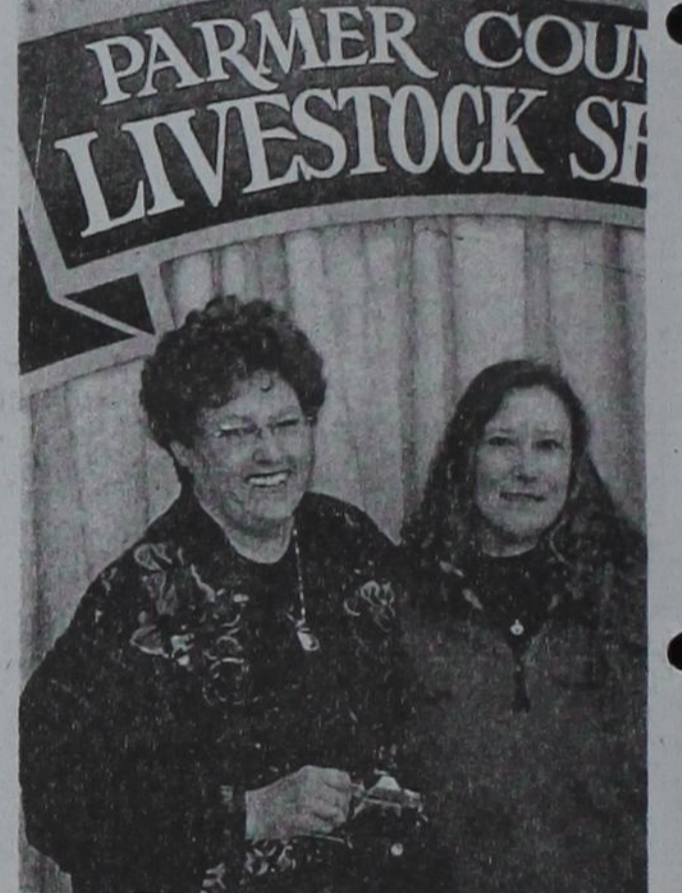
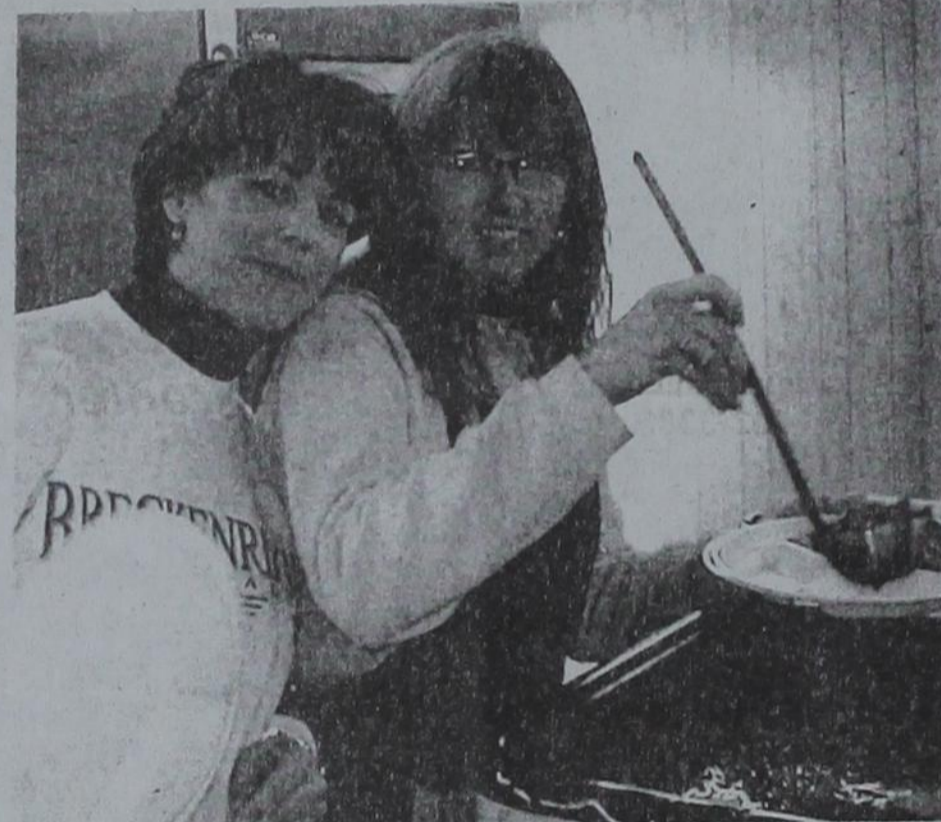

LIVE CATTLE: There are some strong indications that cattle prices may have bottomed this week? Short and long term trends are still down, but prices have all held strong support levels on Friday and were able to close higher on the day. It will still take a close back above \$75 basis the April contract in order to turn charts higher. A move below Friday's low would force a re-test of \$71.

FEEDER CATTLE: This market also looks like prices may have found a bottom as Friday's close was strong. Short term trends would turn higher on a close above \$84.75 basis the March contract. Sales across the country remain strong and numbers are still off significantly from year ago levels. The spread between cash and futures should begin to narrow much like we've seen in the past?

CORN: Prices took a hit early in the week, but were able to recover into Friday's close. Short term trends are still down, but a close above \$2.77 basis the March contract would turn trends back higher. Long term trends have ranged from \$2.85-3.00 with highs so far stopping at \$2.81. World stocks remain historically tight, but much will depend on demand out of China.

SOYBEANS: This market also took a hard hit after the announcement of a ban on blood meal. The market had already prices in the possibility of this law being passed and most of the drop seen this week was more "profit taking" than new selling. Demand is expected strong, but the seasonal pressure from South America may hold prices over the next few weeks?

WHEAT: Although wheat has made several attempts to sell off and the seasonal tendency is to expect lower prices from now into March, prices have held up much better than most analysts expected. Short term trends are still down, but a close above \$3.95 basis the March KC contract would turn trends back up. Most sales have been lost to Australia, but China is still the wild card.

COTTON: The market took a drop along with just about everything else this week. No news to really push prices down, just the fact that Everyone has been looking for significantly higher prices and once prices moved down below major support levels at \$72 basis the March contract, there was massive liquidation. Prices looked better on Friday, but China again will be the wild card?

City Manager Terry reports

From the Desk of Bovina City Manager Ernest Terry:
Three items are prominent of my desk this week, drugs, complaints, and baseball. Without declaring an order of importance, let's just take them one at a time.

Drugs: the Bovina Independent Schools had a meeting with the parents to express concerns about drugs in Bovina. Some concerns were expressed about the city's efforts and ability to effect change in this area.

A request was made for a town hall meeting on the subject. Every meeting that the City Council holds in regular session is an open meeting where anyone and everyone is invited to attend. The Council goes one step further and specifies a special place, in the agenda, for Bovina citizen's comments.

At every regular scheduled meeting, any Bovina citizen may express an opinion, make a statement, or ask a question about fact or policy. Any request for action or policy change may be placed on the next meeting's agenda to be considered and discussed. All are welcome, and the Council meets in the EMS Building where we have plenty of room and chairs.

Having said that, let me assure you that Bovina and the Bovina Police Department are involved in enforcing the laws and looking for drug activity. I can't comment on ongoing or pending investigations. The enforcement issue has some rules that must be followed, and they are dictated by the Constitution of the United States of America. Those rules are important. I would be glad to talk with each of you about this at any time at City Hall.

If you wish to report illegal drug activity, I will be glad to hear from you. If you wish to remain anonymous, that will be respected, as well. The Mayor, Galen Hromas, and the City Council take this matter very seriously and would like your help.

Complaints: my door at City Hall is open to anyone at any time. Come and visit with me. Find out what we are doing. If you see me around town, I will listen to you then, also. If you disagree with what we are doing, want us to do more or less, or wish to address a grievance concerning a City employee, my door is open.

If I'm not in the office, speak with the City Secretary, Bonnie Scaff. For those who know me, customer satisfaction and community needs are very important.

Baseball: This is a chance to thank Caprock Feeders and Xcel. They are donating \$7,500 each to replace the lights on the Bovina Baseball Field. Bovina appreciates their help, very much! Construction is expected to start in February, in order to be ready to play night games when the weather turns warm. This is a project that has been ongoing ever since I came to Bovina.
