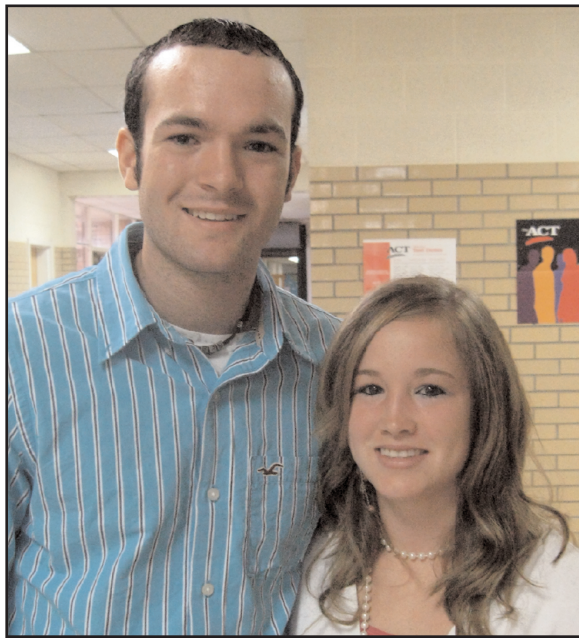




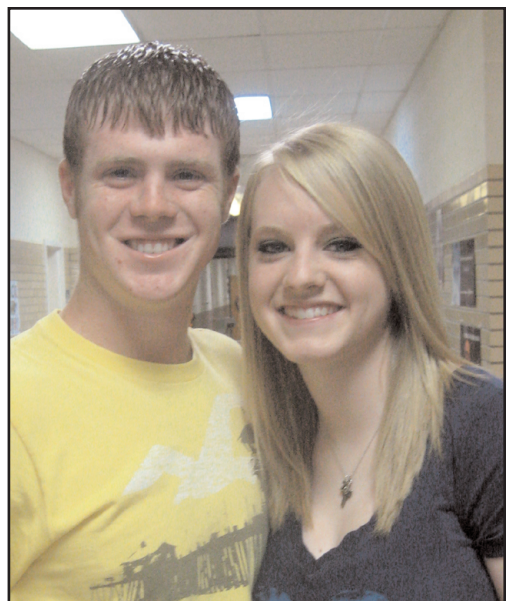
History in the making

Well situation forces Texico city officials to ask residents to conserve water

Last week, the Texico City Council asked residents to conserve water in every way possible. Here is a look at why that is necessary.

The city owns five wells. Only one is in service.

The well at KKR Park has been drawing in air as well as water for some time. This is the only well that servicing the town.

The Tower Well at Garwood and Hamlin streets, had been working, but the motor failed. It has been removed and sent to Lubbock for repair.

The Brown Well is at Anderson and Mildred streets. This well is set up, but has not been put into service because the fittings don't match up with the city water system.

The other two wells have been recently purchased south of the city. Texico's Phase 2 project is designed to incorporate these wells into the water system.

Last week, the city council discussed the Phase 2 water project with Brandon Autrey from AMD Engineering. AMD is putting together a bid package for the work.

The wells (which may have to be re-drilled) have been purchased and are south of town, but the water lines have not been put in place.

Current estimates show Texico's water levels will be dangerously low in the next three years.

The project will also look at replacing some of the oldest underground water lines in town. Signs point to a significant amount of water being lost due to damaged and worn-out pipes.

They will also look at more fire hydrants in town to aid the fire department.

Other ideas mentioned were types of well houses, water line routes in and around the city, pressure valves and radio controlled well monitoring.

Farwell area man dies in accident

Jason Crume, a Farwell area resident, died in a tractor accident the night of Sept. 11.

Crume had used a tractor to pull a vehicle out of the mud, then was crossing a field to head home when the accident occurred.

He had been manager of Mesa Financial in Clovis for nearly two years.

Charlie Domenici, his son Chuck, a pallbearer, and his son-in-law, also a pallbearer, attended the burial service at Mission

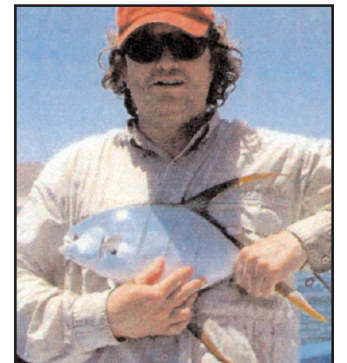


Garden of Memories in Clovis.

He specialized in political geography, international relations and national security policy, according to his obituary in the scholarly publication, "Political Science and Politics."

Texas Attorney General Waggoner Carr spoke at the 1965 dedication of the National Mule Memorial at Muleshoe.

"Without ancestral pride or hope for offspring, the mule – along with the buffalo, hound and longhorn – made Texas history" attests the historical marker accompanying a statue of "Old Pete" on U.S. Hwy. 84.

"In war, he carried cannon on his back. Because he was available to haul freight, forts arose on frontiers.

"Indians ate horses hitched to cart or coach, but let tough mule meat go by.

"His small hooves scaled rock and steep untrod by horse or ox, but big ears endangered him in lake or river. He went fast, endured much, ate sparingly. "Since beginning of Christian era, has helped all over the world to bear burdens of mankind."

City seeks grant for water well

The Bovina City Council on Sept. 11 discussed a state grant it has applied for to drill a new 350-ft. city water well.

It is seeking the grant through the Office of Rural and Community Affairs. The city will find out if it will receive the grant in December.

The proposed well would serve the entire community and be about 2,500 feet from an existing water well on the east side of the city. The location complies with state environmental regulations.

It is felt that because of the decline in water levels, it's best to drill this well deeper than existing water wells and should ensure the city's water supply for years to come.

The preliminary construction estimate is about \$250,000, including surveying, engineering design and contingencies.

In other business, the council:

-- Approved a Mission Statement (see ad elsewhere in today's Tribune for details).

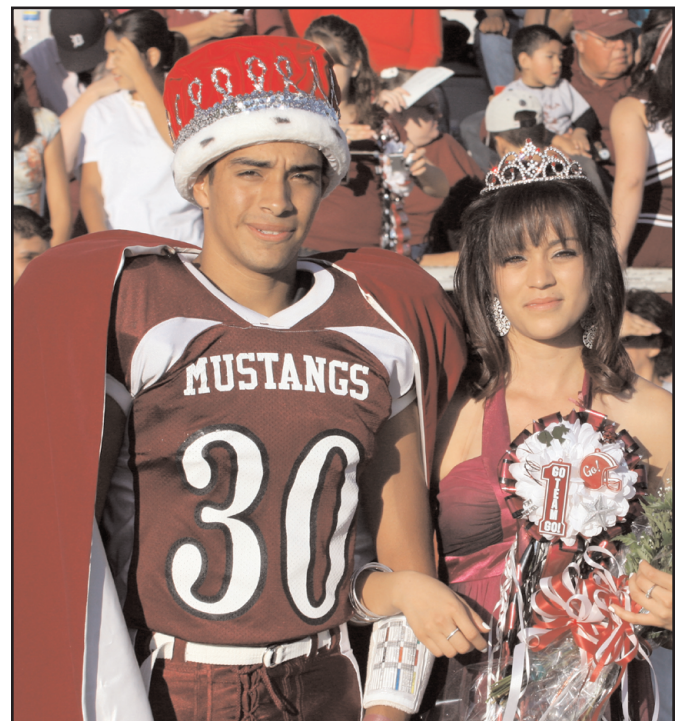
-- Approved a two-year contract with Jana Pitcock to serve as city manager.

-- Held the public hearing on the proposed 2009 tax rate; no comments were made on this.

Coach Royce Winnett said the team did a decent defensive job in the second half.

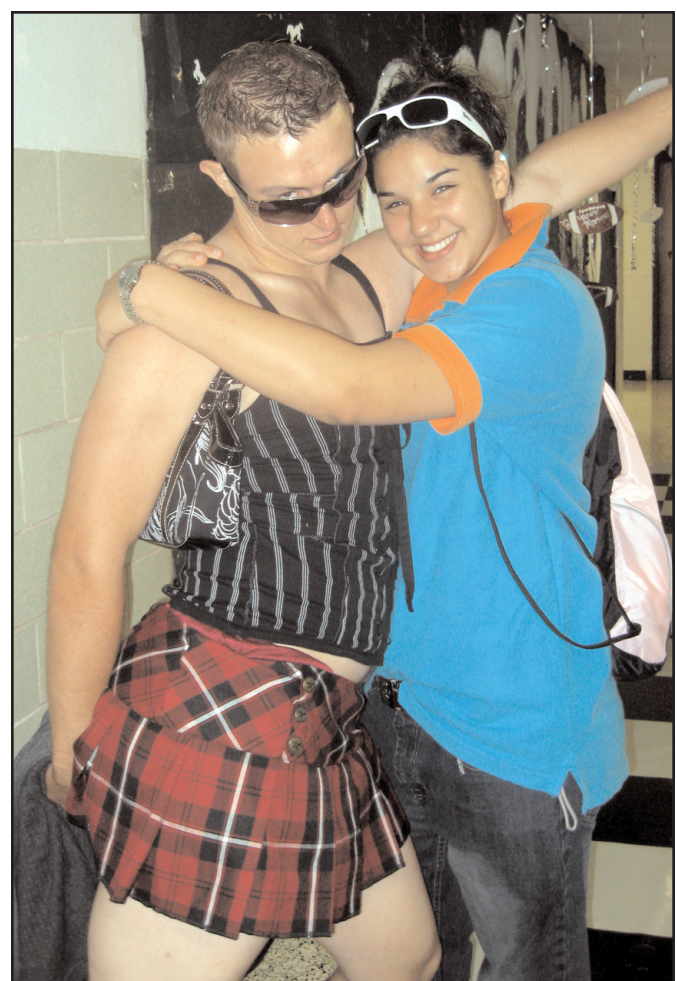

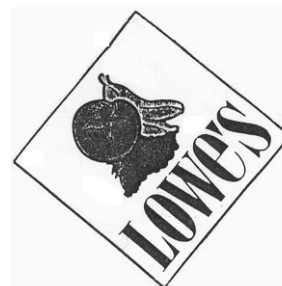
