

Santa Rosa finished the season on a roll in the playoffs. Before turning back Texico, Santa Rosa had shut out Tucumcari 48-0 and Lordsburg 41-0. They had an excellent team.

The only loss the Lions suffered during the season was to Dexter, which also ended its season with just one defeat -- to Texico last week in the state semi-finals, 15-14. Texico was seeded No. 4 going into the playoffs, with Dexter No. 1 and Santa Rosa No. 2.

Good news for the squirrels




Sewer project to be redesigned


