| 'Senior Hot-Line' Service To Assist Elderly Persons | Heald said. <br> Howard Whitener, who lives six and one-half miles north of Texico, measured 5.45 since Aug. 22 at his home and reported 45 inches of rain fell |
| Beginning Sept. 3 the Eastern Plains Areawide Agency on Aging will activate the "Senior Hot-Line" to disseminate a wide array of information to senior citizens residing within the seven-county planning and service area covered by the Agency. <br> This service will be available to residents in Texico, Farwell and Clovis by dialing the Agency's local number, 762 7714. The Agency is located in the basement of the Curry County Court House. <br> Persons residing in Curry (not Clovis), De Baca, Guadalupe, Harding, Quay, Roosevelt and Union counties may contact the "Senior Hot-Line" by dialing a toll-free direct line to an information specialist. The toll free number is $1-800-432$ 3863. <br> "Any older citizen in the seven-county area needing any information is urged to call this free number," according to W.E. (Bill) Taylor, program director. Mrs. Ellen Gentry will serve as information and referral specialist for this unique service. <br> Currently, the Eastern Plains Areawide Agency on Aging has on file such agencies and services as will be found throughout the state of New Mexico, plus some parts of Texas and Colorado, who serve or can serve the senior citizens. <br> "We feel that this is indeed a breakthrough. for there are many hot-lines geared to alcoholics. runaways, etc., but none available where the senior citizens can get information tailored to their needs, or if necessary, just someone to talk to regarding problems <br> they may face," commented Taylor <br> Although basically a referral service, the information specialist will do some counseling regarding personal problems or situations facing the senior citizens. Among the referral services to be offered by the "Senior Hot-Line" will be transportation, personal or social, leisure time activities, legal, home helps, housing, financial, employment and miscellaneous. <br> The most encompassing information and referral service is in the field of health care.
