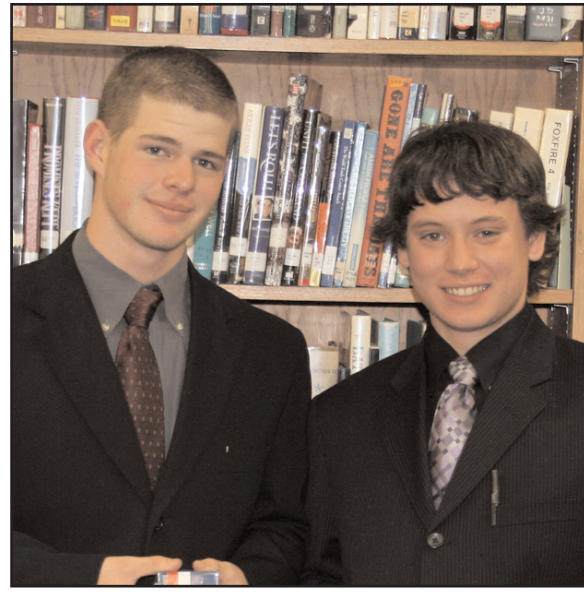
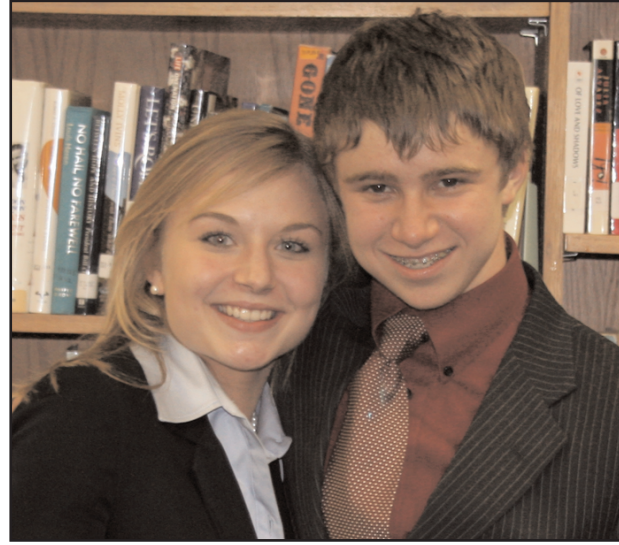

Elvis Presley and numerous others have recorded "Mansion over the Hilltop," a hymn written by Ira F. Stanphill, who was born at Bellview, up the road from Texico.

Other favorite hymns by the early Curry County resident are "Room at the Cross," "Follow Me" and "I Know Who Holds Tomorrow."

I have a CD of his hymn, "Supper time," sung by Psalm IV of Amarillo.

You can read about Ira Stanphill in his 1983 autobiography, "This Side of Heaven," and in two recent books, "Inspirational Hymn & Song Stories of the 20th Century" and "Close Harmony: A History of Southern Gospel."

A 1928 photograph of the Clovis AT&SF Superintendent's Staff currently hangs on the wall at the Clovis Depot Model Train Museum.

Included in the group is Ernest S. Marsh, division accountant, who eventually became president of the Atchison,

LIVE CATTLE: Cattle prices have continued to move higher with prices in their 18th day up from the lows made in early April. Stronger cash beef along with strong seasonal demand has combined to help support a much stronger market than many analysts had expected to see. Prices are probably close to seeing some type of downward correction, but long term trends have turned higher.

FEEDER CATTLE: Feeder prices have also gained some support from higher fed cattle prices. Corn prices have taken very little pressure off of high feed costs, but seem to have stabilized for the moment. The market is probably ready for some type of correction, but higher prices between now into early August is very probable. Feeder weight cattle will remain tight until Fall.

CORN: Corn prices have stalled out for about the last month with no decisive direction. Traders seem to be waiting for news which would give prices a reason to move higher or back to lower levels. With the rest of the grain complex technically turning down, it may be difficult for corn prices to hold these levels. Weather and planting will dictate the direction in coming weeks.

SOYBEANS: Soybeans have also developed a sideways range over the last few weeks with resistance overhead around the \$14.15 level basis the July contract and support below around \$13.00. A close above or below either one of these points should take the market in that direction for several days if not weeks. Market is looking for direction at this time.

WHEAT: Wheat prices have continued to drift lower since turning long term trends down in early March. The volatility in price fluctuations has seen a drastic decrease, but volume remains historically large. The normal seasonal tendency is for prices to drift lower into harvest. There are some long term support between \$7.75-8.00 basis the July KC contract.

COTTON: Cotton prices have also stalled out inside a wide range over the last few weeks. There seems to be little interest on either side of the trade these days. Planted acres are substantially lower than seen in past years, but demand and large ending stocks seems to be the anchor around the cotton's neck. A close back of the 90 cent level could create an explosion to the upside by year end?

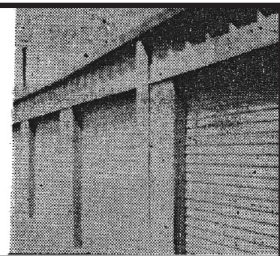
On the sports scene, there is still a lot of activity at Texico High School.

While reading the life stories of some of the senior citizens in Prairie Acres Nursing Home and talking with the people are the Farwell Convalescent Center, it is interesting to hear about their long trek to the area. Most are connected to the farming or ranching industry and that accounts for their migration to the county but whatever brought them here, they are fine folk and welcome.

Also, we are very interested in their family's history and time in Parmer County. The first history book dealt mostly

with the early history of the county and the second leaned more on the families who settled the area and worked for the progress of our county. We would like for the third volume to follow up on the later branches of the county residents and the arrival of other families.

Many of the offspring of original settlers have moved away or have passed away, but their children know a lot of history of their families and especially the continuation of the family story.

Several of the earliest settlers in the county were Hispanic and their stories have not been told. For instance, I grew up with the Britos, Bacas and many others.

Segunda Brito came to Parmer County in the early 1900's and Fidel Baca came in the middle 1940's. Their story is interesting and untold. Others came later and their contribution to our

area is immense. We need to know all their histories and genealogies.

The Parmer County Historical Commission is asking all to write their remembrances and family stories down and submit it for publication in the updated history book. We hope to have those stories in and edited by early October 2008 so the new book can be at the publishers in late 2009.

Parmer County Historical Commission members can give you some help with length and content. Members are Gladys and Don Spring, Gregg and Brenda Wilson, Sharon White, Bonnie Howard, Delwin Allen, Hugh Moseley, Mary Johnston, Judy Cummings, Mack Heald, and Joe Bob Mann.

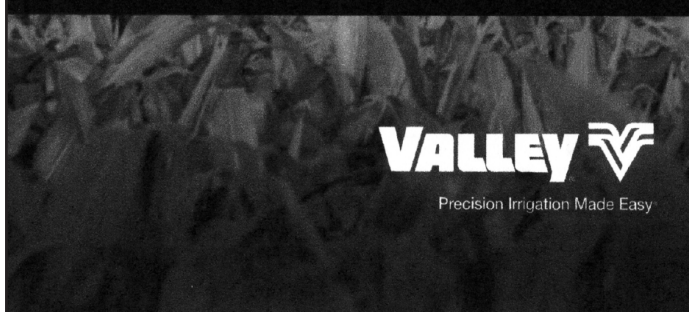

State wants Hwy. 86 moved ... in 1939

Janie Martin stopped by the Tribune last week with a copy of the newspaper's Aug. 31, 1939, issue.

This is a real find because Tribune records only date back to 1940, with a couple of exceptions.

The story we are told is that the publisher in 1940 told a young worker to burn some papers, and he ended up burning all the newspaper issues before that date.

Anyway, here are some of the items from the 1939 Tribune. More items from this issue will be published later.

-- T.H. Haney, a farmer of the extreme eastern edge of Parmer County, was awarded \$2,750 as the price for a 120-ft. strip of right of way across his farm as a new route for Highway 86.

This was the price agreed on by the jury of view, composed of Dutch Quickerl, Wilbur Charles and D.H. Mead, when they reported to the county commissioners.

Haney had asked for \$3,500, and the commissioner countered with \$2,500.

The new route of Highway 86, which branches off Highway 60 at Bovina, was asked for by the state department earlier this year.

-- Very few Parmer County farmers were taking advantage of the wheat insurance plan offered by the federal government, said Clyde Magness, senior wheat crop supervisor, at a meeting of the Farwell Farm and Civic Club.

He said the reason was

because farmers considered the rates too high.

-- Farwell School Supt. Leo Forrest said Farwell Schools would open Sept. 4 instead of the original scheduled date of Sept. 1.

The change was made because Mary Lovelace and Warren Powers, grade school faculty members, were unable to be on hand Sept.1 (a Friday).

A great place to live

It was a year ago that the Tribune published its special "Happy 100th Birthday, Parmer County" issue.

We appreciated the wonderful response we received from the many communities in our county over the job that was done.

Parmer County has a proud history and it was fun to provide it, through its many settlements, ranging from Lazbuddie

to Black to Parmerton to Rhea.

I had a chance the other day to peruse that issue, again reading about how the XIT Ranch came about, the Farwell brothers, the days of the plains Indians, the pioneers who homesteaded here.

I'm especially proud of those early pioneers. What difficulties they must have faced. Can you imagine living in the kinds of "homes" they set up? Today, they couldn't meet building codes!

I've lived in Parmer County now going on 24 years, and consider it my home. I'm blessed to say that.

Hearing the speech for Gilbert Kaltwasser at the Farwell Chamber of Commerce banquet on

Saturday night brought that home. How he considered himself blessed to have spent his life here.

I agree.

Oh, yeah, I know there are "better" places to live. If I were rich, I wouldn't mind spending my time in La Jolla, Calif., for example.

But I don't have a lot of money. And I do like the small-town atmosphere where you know the delivery men, the folks at the car repair shop, the clerks at the supermarket.

That's special. And it's missing from the big cities.

A friend of mine calls our area "the hub." Because it's in the middle of some great places to visit – 90 miles to Amarillo, 90 miles to Lubbock, a bit further to Ruidoso, and a bit longer to Santa Fe and Albuquerque.

All within a few hours traveling time. Mountains, forests, national parks, all within a relatively short distance.

But more importantly,

Parmer County consists of small communities where the term "neighbor" still means something.

Last week, I had lunch with a fella from Omaha, Neb.

He had grown up in Guymon, Okla. And what he said hit home: as a kid, it was great to know his neighbors and enjoy their company. But now he lives in a big city where he doesn't know his neighbors – they come and go.

Sure, big cities have their advantages – movie shows and plays, bigger sporting events, great restaurants and more places to shop. But as I said, hop in the car and ... you are there.

As for me, small town life is just fine. Having a good neighbor means more to me than being closer to a big sports event, especially since high school sports (football and basketball) are a whole lot more fun to watch than at the college and pro levels (with the exception of the Dallas Cowboys, of course).

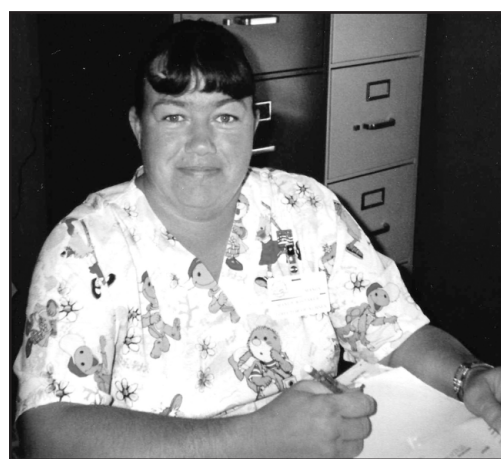



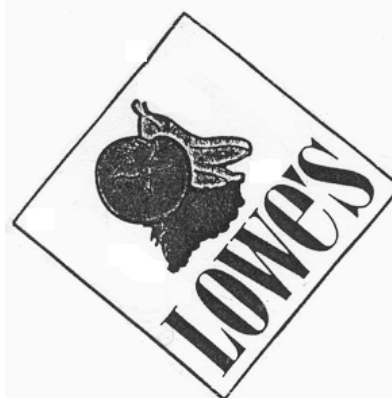

On April 22, Bovina lost a close one to Claude 13-12.

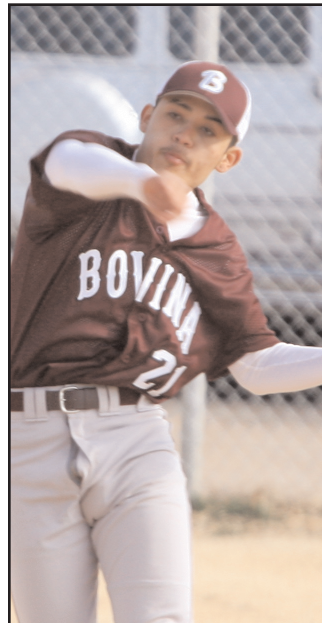

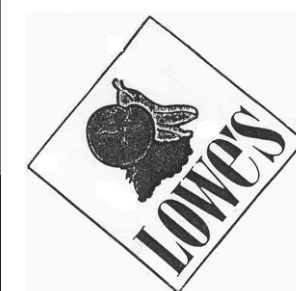
