
She went skipping back through the large doors into the main North Pole workshop just in time to meet up with three large groups of elves and reindeer about to leave.

He grimaces when he talks about today's society, feeling that America peaked in the 1950s through the 1980s. And I agree with his assessment.

I know fully well how negative I have been in past columns, but I don't believe in being a "politician" and telling you what you want to hear.

The problem is that I have been more right than wrong over the years. I would have preferred to say that I am usually wrong in my forecasts.

But when I wrote years and years ago about the coming decline of the middle class, and its ramifications, and the health care crisis, well ... you judge what has happened.

Anyway, my friend asked me what we can do for our families when the junk hits the fan in 20 to 30 years as the U.S. turns into

a Third World country for many of its citizens.

The key is to concentrate on your family. The politicians won't lift a finger to help solve the problem since they will be in the upper tier, as the U.S. fully becomes a two-tier economic nation -- rich and poor.

You have to explain to your children, and grandchildren, that they must plan for the situations coming down the line that will adversely affect them. Basically, each family needs to create a collective, where they will help each other.

When planning for jobs, remember most jobs will be government. Many other jobs in today's private sector will be lost to other nations. Other goodpaying jobs simply will disappear. Most non-government jobs that will be available in the U.S. will be low paying.

While the American middle class may have been 70 percent of the people at one time (that's just a number I am throwing out), in 30 years it may be down to 20 percent. Think what that means.

Thus, as I've written for several years, when you graduate (high school or college), look for government work. It may be the military (good pension

after 20 years), schools, or local, state and federal offices.

Of course, there will always be some non-government jobs that pay well. But the number available will be very small when compared to the number of folks seeking jobs.

Families should have periodic meetings to discuss their situations. Every life has ups and downs. In the future, it will be vital that families form support groups for its own members.

Sure, this takes more work, more planning. But it will be a key for families to make it during the hard times that are looming down the road. And they are rapidly approaching.

When I wrote above in this column, about the Third World nature of the U.S. in the future, I hope I am completely wrong.

But when some folks talk of some Third World nations, they think of stuff like corruption, drugs, poor people, illiteracy, lack of responsibility.

Yeah, I guess I am completely wrong. That would never be the U.S.

Influenza continues to strike Texico-Farwell folks in 1918; World War 1 winding down

Editor's note: Here is another article on the continuing series focused on the Texico-Farwell News issue from early in the century. The following information was published Oct. 25, 1918:

A lead article on Page 1 noted the death of Dr. J.Q. Burton, an early Texico settler. A physician and surgeon, he was a leader in the Church of Christ congregation after locating in Texico in the early days of the town.

Meanwhile, Miss Georgie Thompson and Floyd Lindsay were married at the home of Rev. L.L. Thurston, pastor of the Methodist Church. Floyd is the mechanic at the Texico garage.

The next big financial drive in the U.S. during World War I was the scheduled United War Work Campaign seeking to raise \$170 million for the war effort. It would start Nov. 11 -- which turned out to be the day World War I ended.

The name for the boy's fund-raising campaign was "Victory Boys." For girls, "Victory Girls" with a slogan of "every girl pulling for victory." Curry County committee members from Texico were Mrs. M. M. Craig, Miss Lilian Williams and Prof. J. H. Kays.

There were four large ads on Page 1 -- Wichita Valley Refining Co., offering oil, gas and lubricants in Farwell; Farmers State Bank of Texico; the Texico garage, where batteries are rebuilt and recharged; and Red Cross Pharmacy in Texcico which warns about the Spanish Influenza, and if you have symptoms, see a physician immediately.

Page 2 featured a large ad for the People's Auto Supply Co., which offered goods at jobber's prices. The ad urged folks to buy a share of the new company.

Page 2 featured items from Bovina and Fairfield.

The Bovina items were published recently in the Tribune. As for Fairfield, it noted that W.M. Ford and

family of Farwell ran out to the Boone farm for a few minutes on Sunday; Mr. Landford is working for Mr. Kennedy this week; and Sunday church was cancelled due to the influenza.

Page 3 again featured the usual full-page ad for the Cannon Ball Motor Company with the same photos and information that the newspaper, allied with the company, was promoting each week.

Page 4 featured lots of local tidbits. They included:







Influenza continues to strike Texico-Farwell folks in 1918; World War 1 winding down

Editor's note: Here is another article on the continuing series focused on the Texico-Farwell News issue from early in the century. The following information was published Oct. 25, 1918:

A lead article on Page 1 noted the death of Dr. J.Q. Burton, an early Texico settler. A physician and surgeon, he was a leader in the Church of Christ congregation after locating in Texico in the early days of the town.

Meanwhile, Miss Georgie Thompson and Floyd Lindsay were married at the home of Rev. L.L. Thurston, pastor of the Methodist Church. Floyd is the mechanic at the Texico garage.

The next big financial drive in the U.S. during World War I was the scheduled United War Work Campaign seeking to raise \$170 million for the war effort. It would start Nov. 11 -- which turned out to be the day World War I ended.

The name for the boy's fund-raising campaign was "Victory Boys." For girls, "Victory Girls" with a slogan of "every girl pulling for victory." Curry County committee members from Texico were Mrs. M. M. Craig, Miss Lilian Williams and Prof. J. H. Kays.

There were four large ads on Page 1 -- Wichita Valley Refining Co., offering oil, gas and lubricants in Farwell; Farmers State Bank of Texico; the Texico garage, where batteries are rebuilt and recharged; and Red Cross Pharmacy in Texcico which warns about the Spanish Influenza, and if you have symptoms, see a physician immediately.

Page 2 featured a large ad for the People's Auto Supply Co., which offered goods at jobber's prices. The ad urged folks to buy a share of the new company.

Page 2 featured items from Bovina and Fairfield.

The Bovina items were published recently in the Tribune. As for Fairfield, it noted that W.M. Ford and

Page 3 again featured the usual full-page ad for the Cannon Ball Motor Company with the same photos and information that the newspaper, allied with the company, was promoting each week.

Page 4 featured lots of local tidbits. They included:



DeBerry announce the birth of a 10-lb. baby girl.

Mr. Baton, who has been operating the local depot for the past several months, had to take a leave of absence due to health. He had been band president here and will be missed, since he is locating to Sweetwater. His brother, Ben Williams, has taken his position here as ticket seller and expressman.

Mr. Britt, the barber at the Farwell Inn, is critically ill with influenza. Also suffering with influenza are Elmina Engram, T.J. Allen and Mr. Ferris, manager of the Kemp Lumber Co.

Mrs. A.H. Overstreet has left for Canyon to be with her son, Lawrence, who has influenza. Hamlin Overstreet also has gone to see Lawrence.

Ads on the page included K.K. Runnels (who KKR Park in Texico was named after) -- "Plenty of good posts on hand. Better buy now at the old price"; J.RS. Meason Lumber Co.; the Cozy Café with regular dinner served from 11:30 to 2; and short orders from 6:30 a.m. to 11 p.m.



From Kim Black, member-tech services for Bailey **County Electric Cooperative:**

"Full deregulation" of the electric industry may be making headlines in the news, but local electric cooperative members don't have to worry about being affected by dergulation.

A 1999 state act allows not-for-profit electric cooperatives the choice to participate in deregulation or not because of the way they are controlled and regulated by their member-owners. There are still major investments in grid interconnections that have to be made before the Panhandle/South Plains area can export or import electric power. Without that capability, the area of the state has been exempted from deregulation by the state legislature.

Electric cooperatives have a track record of delivery electricity at prices below those in the deregulated market. That is one reason whey Texas co-ops and their member-consumers have not been required to make the huge investment or tackle the headaches involved with deregulation.

Will Bailey County Electric ever participate in deregulation? The decision will be made by our members. But

our board monitors the effects of deregulation in other areas of the state and country. The way we see it is that deregulation at this time wouldn't lower our members' rates or contribute to our system's reliability. In fact, by staying self-regulated, we are protecting members against future unknowns.

Unlike other electric utilities, our operating costs rise only when the price of doing business goes up. Our members recently saw this cost go up when the wholesale power cost increased due to fuel costs. But when the price of fuel goes down, our operating costs follow suit, and our members see that on their monthly statements.
