Texico raises water rates; garbage rates may be next

The Texico City Council on Nov. 9 approved raising water rates, effective Jan. 1 , and is now looking at raising the garbage rates, too. The council voted unanimously (with Mayor Jerry Cunningham and council Cunningham absent) to raise the water rates according to the totals discussed since September. This means:

1. Keeping the minimum use of 4,000 gallons for users within the city limits at the same rate -- $\$ 16.75$ a month.
2. Keeping the minimum
