Filings continue for local elections

Filings are continuing for this year's local elections on May 7.

Here's a look at the area filings, as of Monday.

The filing period ends March 7. Write-in candidates can sign up until March 14.

Early voting is from April 20 to March 30.

Farwell City Council

All three Farwell city office-holders have filed for re-election: Mayor Jimmie Mace and councilmen Tim Kasel and Joe Stanton. So far, they have no opposition.

Farwell School Board

Signing up so far for the two posts on the Farwell School Board are Keith Hadley and incumbent Darren Haseloff. The other incumbent is Mark Schwertner, who doesn't plan to seek re-election.

Lazbuddie School Board

On the Lazbuddie School Board ballot are three posts. Incumbents are Chris Timms, Terry Jesko and Dieter Isaacson. So far, no one has signed up.

Farwell Hospital District Board

Five posts are on the Farwell Hospital District board. Incumbents are Mike Ratke, Jack Kirkland, Greg Actkinson and Tom Nichols. The 5th spot is not filled.

So far, nobody has signed up for re-election. To sign up, contact board secretary Margie Watkins at 481-9097.

Bovina City Council

Three council posts are on the ballot. Incumbents are Lance Teague, Mike McCallum and John Blackwell. Blackwell has said he will not seek re-election.

So far, there have been two signups -- Gaylon Rhodes and Radford Venable.

Bovina School Board

On the school board ballot are two posts, currently held by Susan Kerby and Izzy Carrasco.

As of Monday, there had been only one signup -- Larry Mitchell.

Clinic problem being worked on

Farwell Hospital District Board President Jack Kirkland gave the Tribune an update on its relationship with the Muleshoe Area Medical Center.

He and board member Tom Nichols met with Muleshoe's board on Feb. 17 to discuss whether to continue that relationship.

Currently, Muleshoe operates the Farwell Medical Clinic. Dr. Kyle Sheets, of Muleshoe, is in charge of the Farwell office and has Marc Osborn, CFNP, and staff here weekdays.

The clinic doesn't include Dr. J.R. Ivins, who has his dentistry office in the Farwell building.

Currently, the clinic is operating at a financial loss. So Nichols and Kirland asked the Muleshoe board what they can do to help. The two groups plan to meet again within 60 days.

Kirkland emphasized that the Farwell clinic is not going to close. He said he is confident the two groups can come to an agreement.

What a future agreement might entail is that the Farwell Hospital District will help subsidize financially keeping the Farwell clinic open.

The two groups likely will go over the financial situation to see how it can be improved.

And one other option is open to Farwell: to end its relationship with the Muleshoe Clinic and replace it with one with the Plains Regional Medical Center in Clovis.

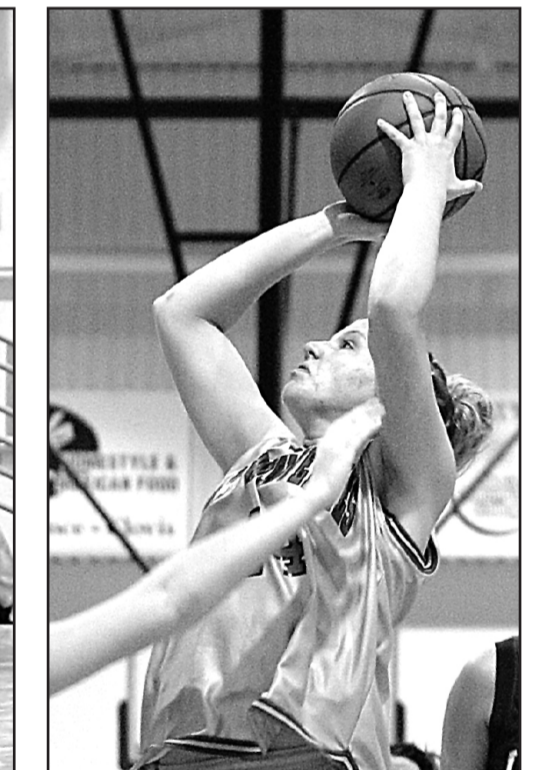
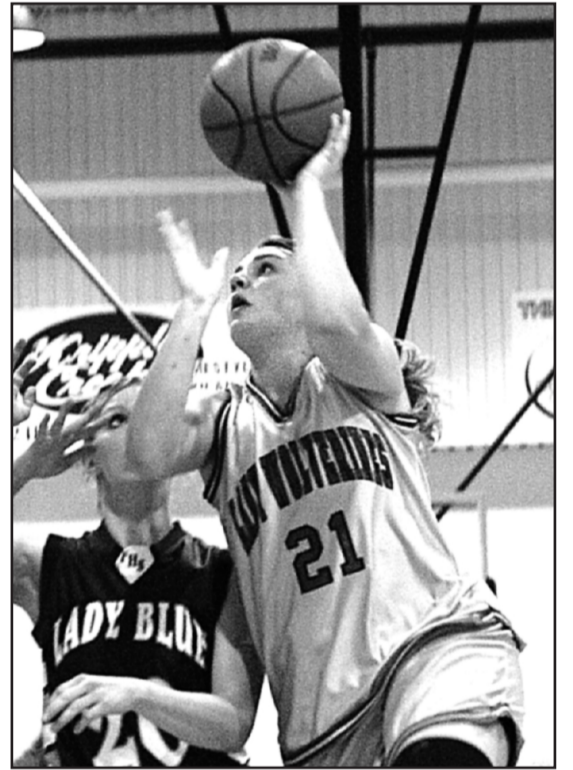
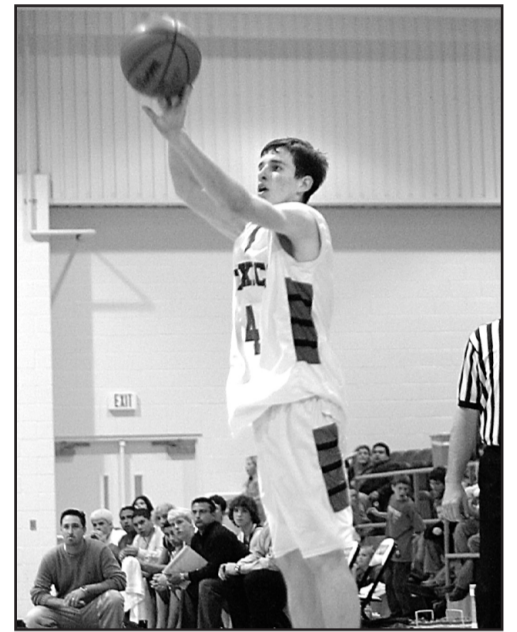

Dear Mike,

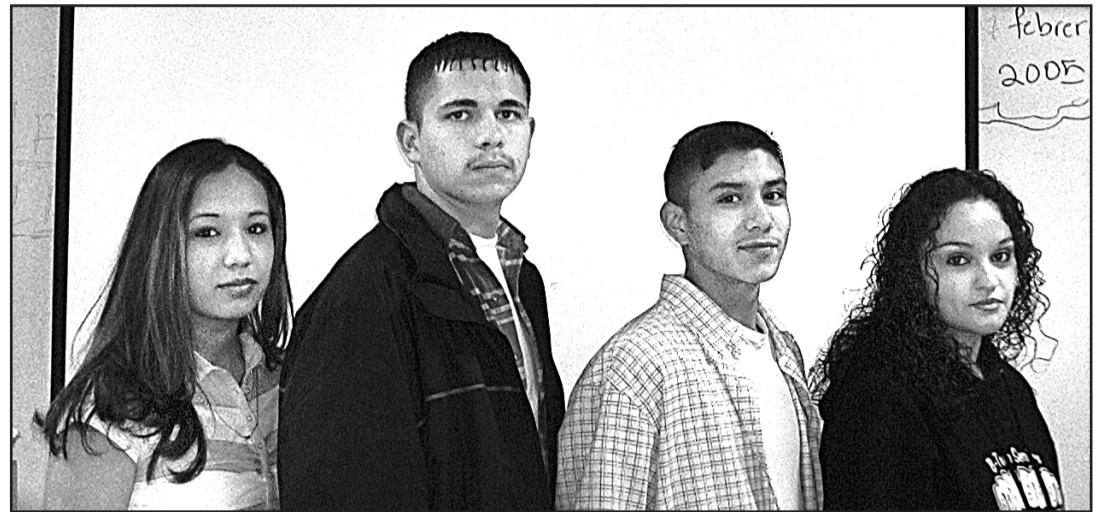

Crackdown begins on junk vehicles, substandard buildings

Bovina has begun a strict enforcement of the junk vehicle and substandard building ordinances.

This is a result of complaints made at the last City Council meeting, and direction given city officials for a crackdown. Here's how it will work:

- Bovina Police are canvassing the community, and if a "junk vehicle" can be seen from a public access (street, sidewalk, or alley), a warning letter will be sent to the owner or property owner.

- The city Public Works Building inspector is canvassing the community, and if a substandard building, structure, or vegetation can be seen from a public access (street, sidewalk, or alley) a warning letter will be sent to the owner or property owner.

Ten days later, if the condition still exists, further actions will be taken -- an official letter, followed by a ticket for action in Municipal Court, and, if necessary, a public hearing by the city council.

At the end of this process, if the condition hasn't changed, the Municipal Judge can issue a removal order, and the property can be removed at the owner's expense.

Thus, Bovina folks could be paying substantial fines for junk vehicles and substandard buildings in the future. State laws and city codes authorize fines as much as \$500 a day.

What is a "junked vehicle"? It's defined as any vehicle that is inoperative and which does not have lawfully affixed unexpired vehicle plates and a valid motor vehicle safety inspection certificate; and which is wrecked,

dismantled, partially dismantled, discarded, or remains inoperative for a continuous period of more than 120 days.

And what is considered "substandard buildings?" These are defined as "all buildings, structures, or vegetation which shall constitute a menace to the health, safety, or general welfare of the occupants or the public."
