

District Proficiency Calculations

Proficiency calculations at the district level differ in two ways from those described for schools. District rates are calculated for students aggregated within each of three grade spans (Kindergaten through grade 5, grade 6 through grade 8, and grade 9 through grade 12). In addition, the One Percent Rule set by the the US Department of Education requires that the percentage of students in nearing Proficient or Advanced scores on an alternate assessment based on the alternate schievement standards (AA-AAS) cannot exceed one percent of the total number of students tested in the district. In districts where the one percent threshold is exceeded, a random sample of students taking the alternate assessment is identified, and their Proficient and Advanced ranking must be recoded to Non-proficient.

How things were in 1939


