

# Is there really a recipe for thankfulness?

Most of you know that Vonda and I used to own a restaurant and catering business and both of us love to cook. Vonda still decorates wedding cakes and anniversary, and birthday cakes. When Vonda cooks, she just adds a little bit of this and a little bit of that. But when I cook, I have to have it written down step by step in a recipe.

Sometimes, I want my spiritual life the same way. I want every move of my spiritual life written down. Just like the spiritual subject of thankfulness, I know that I am supposed to be thankful because the Bible says give thanks in everything.

Is there really a recipe for thankfulness? I know what the Bible says but? Why is it that in the midst of our abundance we find it easier to see what we lack rather than we should be grateful for?

Maybe that's an extreme statement but doesn't it seem that we spend more time thinking I could really be happy if ....? Doesn't it make us feel a little "cheated" when others have what we don't?

We want to be taller, (or shorter), smarter, stronger, more talented, more beautiful, and wealthier. We want to have it all and do it all, and we become upset when it doesn't happen. Then when we notice that God gave others characteristics we don't have, we sometimes respond with envy, jealousy, and self-pity. Isn't there a sense in which we sometimes feel we deserve better than what we have?

We will all celebrate Thanksgiving, but . . . will we really BE thankful? Or maybe even a better question is, "how can I be thankful; I know I'm supposed to be but how?"

I want to give you a brief recipe for Thankfulness. If you follow this recipe you are guaranteed a heart running over with gratitude.

## Step 1: See God Clearly

If someone called you "holy" would you consider it to be a compliment? It would depend on the person's definition of holiness.

In the mind of many, "holy" means narrow-minded, uptight, judgmental, and other negative words. In this case being called holy would not be a compliment.

But if you were called holy in the Biblical sense, it would be a great compliment, one we might be very comfortable with.

Of all the attributes of God, holiness is the one that seems to take center stage. In the Hebrew language to repeat a word is to emphasize it. For example if you said a stone was big it would mean one thing. If you said the stone was big, big, you would mean it was a really big stone. If it were big, big, big, it would mean that it was a gigantic boulder.

In Isaiah 6 and in Revelation 4, the angels declare that God is "holy, holy, holy". This is the only attribute of God that is emphasized in this way. God is never called "love, love, love," or "mercy, mercy, mercy".

We need to study the character of God because it is the greatest pursuit of our lives. There is nothing that we need more than to know God in an intimate and personal way. It was the prophet Jeremiah, who wrote:

Let not the wise man boast of his wisdom or the strong man boast of his strength or the rich man boast of his riches, but let him who boasts boast about this: that he understands and knows me, that I am the LORD, who exercises kindness, justice and righteousness on earth, for in these I delight. (Jer. 9:23,24)

There is nothing that is more important or more valuable. There is no knowledge that is more significant than this. We desperately need to know God. Knowing God is the strength of our lives. Knowing God gives us direction and focus.

But even as I say all these things I must confess two frustrations,

First, I know that it is impossible for human words to adequately describe the one who is greater than our ability to comprehend. As someone has said, "If God were small enough for our minds, He wouldn't be big enough for our needs." We must remember that God is bigger than our ability to comprehend Him; we will not "master" the attributes of God.

Second, it is difficult to know what attributes to focus on. We could spend a really long time talking about the attributes of God. I hope to whet your appetite, Because when we begin to see God as He is, we begin to understand why we need to give thanks. In fact, I hope that you will become so fascinated with the character and



person of God that you will devote the rest of your life to getting to know Him better, and the better you know Him the more you will thank God not just for what He does for you or not for just what He gives to you but more for who He is to you.

Consider the delightful attributes of God. In Psalm 145, we are pointed to these characteristics of God: He is great beyond our ability to comprehend; He is more powerful than anything our world can produce; He is majestic and worthy of honor; He is awesome - the only one/thing that rightfully provokes awe and reverence; He is good and righteous - He does not make mistakes, does not fail, is not inconsistent; He is patient and kind; He is everlasting - He does not "go away"; He is faithful to His promises; He is the defender and provider of those who trust Him.

Consider the terrifying attributes of God. In Nahum 1: He is jealous and avenging. God defends His honor. He is zealous, passionate for His people. God gets angry when His people are cheated by being led astray from Him. He will not leave the guilty unpunished. In our time, there is this idea that if you have

For this feat, he won \$200 in cash and two tickets to the Dallas Cowboys -- New Orleans Saints game at Texas Stadium.







enough money or the right lawyers, you can get away with anything. God says, we will get away with nothing.

**Step Two: See Yourself Clearly and Honestly**

J.L. Packer writes in his book "Knowing God":

"Modern man, conscious of his tremendous scientific achievements in recent years, naturally inclines to a high opinion of himself. He views material wealth as in any case more important than moral character, and in the moral realm he is resolutely kind to himself, treating small virtues as compensating for great vices and refusing to take seriously the idea that, morally speaking, there is anything much wrong with him. He tends to dismiss a bad conscience, in himself as in others, as an unhealthy psychological freak, a sign of disease and mental aberration rather than an index of moral reality. For modern man is convinced that, despite all his little peccadilloes - drinking, gambling, reckless driving, 'fiddling', black and white lies, sharp practice in trading, dirty reading, and what have you - he is at heart a thoroughly good fellow. Then as pagans do, he imagines God as a magnified image of himself, and assumes that God shares his own complacency about himself. The thought of himself as a creature fallen from God's image, a rebel against God's rule, guilty and unclean in God's sight, fit only for God's condemnation, never enters his head."

The task for us is difficult to see ourselves honestly, no excuses. In order to do this we will need God's help.

Romans 3:10-19, 23: no one is righteous (living in a God honoring way); no one who understands or seeks God; all of us have turned away and become worthless; no one does good, not even one; we do not know the way of peace; there is no fear of God before our eyes.

It is certainly a devastating analysis but it is also true.

Genesis 6:5: In talking about Noah and his days God reports that we are addicted to sin: "The LORD saw how great man's wickedness on the earth had become, and that every inclination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil all the time."

Most feel that the problem with man is something a little goodness, education, love and lots and lots of money will cure. They see man as sick. But God sees us as dead. Ours is a terminal condition. Put these two things together. God is good and we are sinful. God punishes those who reject Him and we reject Him. It's a bleak picture so far, but the recipe isn't finished.

**Stir in an Encounter with God's Grace**

Romans 8:1-4: God sent Christ to be a sin offering, to do what we could not do.

Romans 3:21-31: Paul tells us that the death of Christ satisfied the demands of God's justice because it punished sin. But at the same time Christ's death (in our place) made it possible for us to be made right with God. Not only was our punishment applied to Christ. His righteousness is applied to everyone who trusts Him.

J. Vernon McGee told the story: There was a boy down in my Southland years ago, he wanted to join a church. So the deacons were examining him. They asked, "How did you get saved?" His answer was, "God did His part, and I did my part." They thought there was something wrong with his doctrine, so they questioned further, "What was God's part, and what was your part?" His explanation was a good one. He said, "God's part was the saving, and my part was the sinning. I done run from Him as fast as my sinful heart and rebellious legs could take me. He done took out after me til He run me down."

My friends, that is the way I got saved, also. God lovingly pursued me, Aaron Reed, for 33 years before I realized my life was in desperate need of a relationship with a savior. I thought I had done too much for Him to still want me, but He kept pursuing me and showed me that His grace could cover a multitude of sins. And, believe me, mine was a multitude of sins. But He was right. His grace covered them all. When I remember the encounter that I had with that grace, I can't help but want to be thankful.

Someone has offered this penetrating comparison of the difference between revenge, justice, and grace. If someone brutally murders your son and you take things into your own hands, that's revenge. If you're content to allow the law and the courts to arrest and punish the offender, that's justice. But if you pardon the murderer, adopt him, and take him home to live with you as your son, that's grace!

God offers Grace to all who will trust Him.

**The Yield**

When you put all the ingredients of this recipe together and give it to God, this is what you get: humility (Romans 3:27). God is righteous, we are sinful. He deserves honor we give rebellion. We deserve wrath. He gives grace.

So you get peace with God (Romans 5:1-4); hope of the glory of God in a decaying world; joy even in suffer-

ing because God is making us fit for Heaven; incentive for godly living; and, most of all, gratitude.

As you look around you this Thanksgiving season, you may see those who have more than you, you may see those more fortunate than you. But I hope your foremost thought will be that you have not received what you deserve. Every breath, every blessing, every enjoyment is a gift of God's grace.







players that you may be down, but you're never out. They have paved the way for continued success. Third, the team must play together to achieve a common goal. And, they have.

Cloudcroft wasted no time putting points on the board when they completed a pass for a 77 yard score on the first play from scrimmage. Before the players could break a sweat, Texico was down 7-0. Fortunately, that was the last time the Bears got even close to scoring until late in the game. The Wolverine defense held Cloudcroft to two 1st downs the rest of the game until the last series when they got four more, but two of those came after penalties.

The Bears' defense started out the game playing very well as they managed to stop the Wolverine runners many times for little or no gain. It forced Texico to go to the air to get things going and loosen up the Cloudcroft defense. Quarterback Braden Vaughan went 6 for 10 with 124 yards and 1 TD as he connected with three different receivers. Garrett Mayfield caught two passes for 48 yards, Tony Clements caught two for 45 yards and a TD, and Chris Phillips caught two for 31 yards.

By the 2nd half, the Texico offensive line and running backs had worn down the Bears defense. Holes started to open up for running backs Serrano and Phillips as linemen Bryan Vannatta and Logan Brown led the way. Serrano finished with 127 yards on 28 carries and 1 TD while Phillips rushed for 56 yards on 14 carries, scored a TD, and had a 52-yard punt return.

Brown and Leo Muniz made several good plays for losses on the Cloudcroft rushers, Blake Smith had an interception and a rushing TD, Johnny Ortiz did a great job at nose, and Jacob Freitas stood up blockers to pressure the quarterback. It's truly awesome to watch such a team perform on the field.

After the Bears scored to begin the game, the Wolverines Dustin McDaniel covered the semi-onside kickoff at the 39. Cloudcroft's defense came out fired up as they forced the only Texico punt of the game. The Wolverines returned the favor and started on their own 44. They managed one first down before they were stopped on 4th and 4.

On the next series, Cloudcroft got one first down, but two good tackles by Muniz and an incomplete pass required them to punt again. The Wolverines took over on the 30 yard line. On 3rd and 10, Clements found Vaughan open up the middle for a 20-yard gain on a half-back pass. The Bears defense was playing very aggressive forcing a 4th down with 5 yards to go. Texico decided to go for it and Vaughan connected with Mayfield on a 37-yard pass to set up their first score at the 6 yard line.

It wasn't easy as the Wolverines were still at the 6 after 3 plays. On 4th and 6, Phillips found his way into the end zone and the Brown kick made it 7-7 at the 8:02 mark in the second quarter.

The Wolverine defense pressured the QB on three straight plays forcing another punt. The offensive line began wearing on the Cloudcroft defense and Serrano broke open on a 22-yard carry. But, on the next play a fumble gave the ball back to the Bears.

Cloudcroft went no where again as a blitzing Brown met the ball carrier in the back field for a 4-yard loss, and Brown and Serrano teamed up to stop the runner after a 1-yard gain. The Bears punted again. In two plays, the Wolverines had two more first downs after a Serrano run of 10 yards and a Vaughan run of 10. But, a holding penalty put them in a 3rd and 16 situation. Vaughan found Phillips wide open for a 26-yard gain.

After a good stop by the Bears and two incomplete passes, the Wolverines were faced with 4th and 14. This time Vaughan hit Clements for 19 yards. Then, Mayfield tiptoed the sidelines for an 11-yard catch putting the ball at the 5. A QB sneak by Vaughan and another kick by Brown made the score 14-7 with 27 seconds remaining in the half.

The Bears were trying to tie the score with a long pass down field but Justin Garrison intercepted it to end the first half.

In the 2nd half, Cloudcroft tried some trickery that worked when they recovered an onside kick at the Texico 43. The Wolverine defense forced a fumble on 3rd

Cloudcroft went 3 and out again. Phillips returned the punt 52 yards to the Bear 28, setting up another scoring opportunity. On 3rd down, Vaughan found Clements wide open in the end zone. With 3:31 remaining in the 3rd quarter, it was 28-7.

The Bears got their 2nd first down of the game after a 12-yard run, but three incomplete passes found them punting again. The Wolverines marched down the field on several big runs by Serrano and a big 13-yard gain by Phillips on 3rd down. Cloudcroft tightened their defense forcing a 4th down and an interception at the goal line.





The Bovina Mustangs opened the season on a successful note, with a 47-30 win over Clovis Christian on Nov. 16.


The big gun for Bovina was Jeff Casas, who canned 34 points, including a trio of 3-pointers. Also scoring were Michael
