## Farwell School Board Lets Silvas Re-Enroll

Farwell School Board con-
ducted a special called meet-
ing Monday night to discuss
the controversial question of
whether to allow students to
attend local schools if they
live out of the state.
The controversy arose when
Dr. and Mrs. Robert Silva and
their sons, Boby and Elcio,
moved to Clovis; however,
they still wanted the boys to
attend Farwell Schools.
Two other families had
faced this same predicament,
but reluctanty enrolled their
children elsewhere once the
regiuation became apparent to
them. However, the Silvas
petitioned the School Board to
reconsider the issue.
Several members of the
Farwell Hospital District
Board also met with school
board members Monday night
to voice their support of
Silva's request.
The problem stems from
state regulations which do not
allow state funds to pay for
the educational costs of chil-
dren not living in the school
district. Gilbert Kaltwasser,
school board president, said
that the present yearly cost of
education is szozo per student,
of which the state pays 45
percent.
