

# Who killed Kennedy?


A book review today, folks: I got a Christmas gift entitled "Contract on America: The Mafia Murder of John F. Kennedy," by David Scheim. I almost wish I hadn't read it. Because it pretty much conclusively shows that Organized Crime was responsible for Kennedy's death.

What hurts is that our government, which we try to believe, went out of its way to blame the deed on Lee Harvey Oswald, who apparently was just a pawn in the situation.

I first heard of Kennedy while watching the 1956 Democratic convention on TV. Presidential nominee Adlai Stevenson let the convention pick his running mate. I was rooting for Tennessee's Estes "Coonskin Cap" Kefauver, who got the nod, but only after several Southern delegations supported a young senator from Massachusetts named Kennedy. Then came 1960. As with most young people, I supported JFK all the way. What a race that was; there never will be a better one. To be honest about it, the election was stolen in the Chicago Democratic precincts. Nixon was the real election winner and credit should be given him for not contesting the results, which would have caused a real upheaval in our society. Anyway, it wasn't the first stolen election (remember LBJ in '48?). I thought Kennedy did some great things in his short tenure. He also had some failings, as is true of most humans. Regardless, I think it's safe to say that most Americans were shocked when word went out of his assassination in Dallas. You do remember where you were when you first heard, don't you? In listening to the newscasts and reading the papers, there was no question in my mind that Oswald had acted alone. It was only in succeeding years, especially taking into account the famous Zapruder tapes, that I began to consider other gunmen as possible. And we all read about how strange it was that so many witnesses involved on that day in Dallas died mysteriously. Then the special House Committee in the '70s announced that it indeed had been a conspiracy - but stopped short of saying what group or groups were involved. Gutsy, weren't they. It took until now - 27 years later - to fully understand the situation. Certain Mafiosa - namely the Louisiana mob run by Carlos Marcello, on the run under the attack of Attorney General Bobby Kennedy, decided to counter- attack. By killing JFK, a new president (Johnson) would rein in Bobby. And that apparently is what happened, claims Scheim. Scheim's book notes in great detail the connections Jack Ruby (who killed Oswald) had in the Mob. That stunned me because I remember clearly that 1963 commentators said Ruby was merely on Organized Crime's fringe. False. Ruby was a gangster. The "coincidences" that placed him at the Dallas jail when Oswald was being brought out were carefully plotted out. And why did it take until now to learn this? In my opinion, it's because the connection between the Mafia and politics is lot more smug than we want to believe. The politicans - from Presidents on (Continued on Page 2)




## Winter wonderland


The halls have been decked and the season is looking bright at Texico Junior High School. The students recently participated in three Christmas contests.



# Here's how Lazbuddie Schools shape up

The 1989-90 performance report for Lazbuddie Schools has been released. Some of the highlights are:

#### Student Performance

On TEAMS tests: More than 97 percent of the students mastered math; 94 percent mastered reading; 85 percent mastered writing. Over five years, these statistics reflected growths of 17, 13 and 22 percent, respectively.

In UIL competition, 27 elementary students placed in the top six positions. At the junior high, 20 students placed and Lazbuddie was second in district competition. At the high school, 24 percent of the students competed at district. Two qualified for regional and one won at state.

Over 50 percent of the elementary school students were on the honor roll. At the high school, over 40 percent made it. Eighty percent of the 1990 graduates entered college or vocational schools. Scholarships amounting to about \$32,000 were awarded to 10 graduates. Thirty-two percent of the high school students are in the National Honor Society.

A comparison of ACT scores: Lazbuddie, 16.9; Texas, 15.0; national, 17.3.

A comparison of SAT scores: Lazbuddie, 883; Texas, 703; national, 871.

California Achievement Tests (with 50 percent being the national average):

- Reading: grades 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7 and 11 are above average. Grades kindergarten, 6, 8, 9, 10 and 12 are below average.

- Math: All grades are above average, ranging from 59 percent (grade 9) to 83 percent (grade 1).

- Language: grades kindergarten, 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 11 and 12 are above average. Grades 2, 8,9 and 10 are below average.

#### Curriculum

Keyboarding instruction was included in grades 4, 5 and 6; 9 state approved honors courses were taught at the high school; 26 advanced courses were offered in grades 9-12; students in junior high were enrolled in vocational home economics and agriculture for the first time.

Also, a G-T program was implemented in the first 9 grades and plans were made to implement it in grades 9-12 for the current year; computer assisted instruction occurs for all elementary students in language arts and math; and there's a computer in every elementary classroom.

Also, the library collection exceeded 5,000 books; a



dyslexia program was begun.

#### Instructors

Twenty-one percent of the staff has master's degrees. The turnover of teachers was 3, or 13 percent. Fourteen teachers have dual certification. The average experience of teachers is 8.7 years. Seven teachers are on Level II career ladder and four on Level IIIc

#### Management

Efforts to reduce paperwork included: enhanced use of computers, hiring college students in the summer to type and duplicate materials, computer printed report cards for grades 6-12, computer generated attendance accounting for pre-kindergarten through grade 12.

#### Improvements

A fully-equipped weight room was added, replacing the one destroyed by fire; new stage curtains and stage lighting in the auditorium; new sound system in the auditorium and football stadium pressbox; upgraded equipment in the science lab; a new van, pickup and 2 buses; a copier,, and several computers.

#### **Community Involvement**

Emphasis continued on parental and community involvement with: a speaker's bureau; room mothers; athletic and band boosters; Lazbuddie Young Homemakers; parent volunteers; various clubs and organization participants.

#### Instructional Program

Two school inmprovement teams were set up; student recognition through honor rolls, Students of the Month, team success and individual achievements.

#### Financing

Revenues come from: federal, 12 percent; local, 38 percent; state, 50 percent. Expenditures are: instructional and pupil services, 50 percent; plant, 9 percent; administrative, 16 percent; instruction related services, 12 percent; support, 2 percent; debt service, 5 percent; capital outlay, 8 percent.

The total budget was \$1,515,262. This included: debt service, \$87,116; federal funds, \$112,290, and general operations, \$1,315,856.

#### School Year Highlights

All the juniors passed the exit level TEAMS on its first testing. Scores on TEAMS in grades 3, 5,7 and 9 classify Lazbuddie as a "High Performing School."

Sports: state guarter finals in football; boys, regional basketball tourney qualifier; golf - boys won Bovina tourney; girls won district tourney; two participants in Class A regional track meet.

Won Texas state solo ensemble Class A Sweepstakes; 3 Lonestar Farmer Degrees.

The drop-out rate for the year was 0 percent. One hundred percent of the graduates were named to receive some form of financial aid or scholarship for college or vocational school.
