|  | Congress just completed action to repeal what were clearly some the most unpopular regulations puit forth by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) in a long time - the burdensome IRS vehicle recordkeeping requirements. <br> These requirements, drafted by the Internal Revenue Service to implement the 1984 Tax Reform Act, called for individuals to keep detailed, up-to-date records of their business and personal travel. <br> When these regulations went into effect on January 1st of this year, Congress was immediately besieged by calls and letters of protest. Farmers, small businessmen and women and others not ony ing and impractical, but also considered their privacy violated by having to report their daily travel to a government agency like the IRS. In mid-February, responding to the IRS issued revised regulations that exempted certain taxpayers from the detailed record-keeping requirements. However, the IRS still required most people who de- duct a portion of the sale price and operating costs of their vehicles to keep the records. <br> This was unacceptable to Conures were passed. The House <br> Bagworms can be controlled <br> Bagworms are one of the major shrubs in Texas. <br> Spring hatch began in early May in the Lubbock area this year and is now almost complete. Insecticide control is most effective in late May and early June when the bagworms are small, says Gary Patterson, Parmer County Extension Agent. In the spring, bagworm larvae emerge from hatching eggs inside last year's bags and begin feeding on leaves. They soon begin to con- struct their own protective bag of silk, twigs and leaves, making them camouflaged and hard to see. As the larvae and their bags continue to grow, <br> Bagworms feed throughout the bags until the bags are about $1^{1 / 2}$ inches long, Patterson adds. In the fall, the bagworms become adults, mate and the females lay eggs inside their bags. They then overwinter in these bags in trees and shrubs.
