After the initial investigation, charges of endandegree felony, were placed against the parents, Amanda Garcia, 20 and Fidencio Fierro, 26, both of Bovina.

The child died of strangulation from a window blind cord, police said.
The story was reported in the Tribune on May 15 then later by the Lubbock newspaper. The story apparently also went out on the national wire service to other papers.
