This once-in-a-lifetime honor went to Logan Mason, son of Shane and LeShea Mason. Logan attends Lazbuddie School.

Logan's animals were named Grand Champion Lamb, Grand Champion Goat and Grand Champion Barrow.

This presented a problem because Parmer County livestock show rules only allow a youngster to have a maximum of two animals make the sale.

The heavier animals count the most according to the show rules, so it meant his lamb and barrow would be in the sale but not the goat.

Logan then came up with an extraordinary suggestion:

Auction off his Grand Champion Goat and divide the proceeds among the five youths whose animals didn't make the sale.

Show officials quickly agreed and show Supt. Mac Heald complimented Logan on his idea.

The youths whose animals didn't make the sale were from Farwell, Friona and Lazbuddie. Thus, the proceeds would be divided countywide.

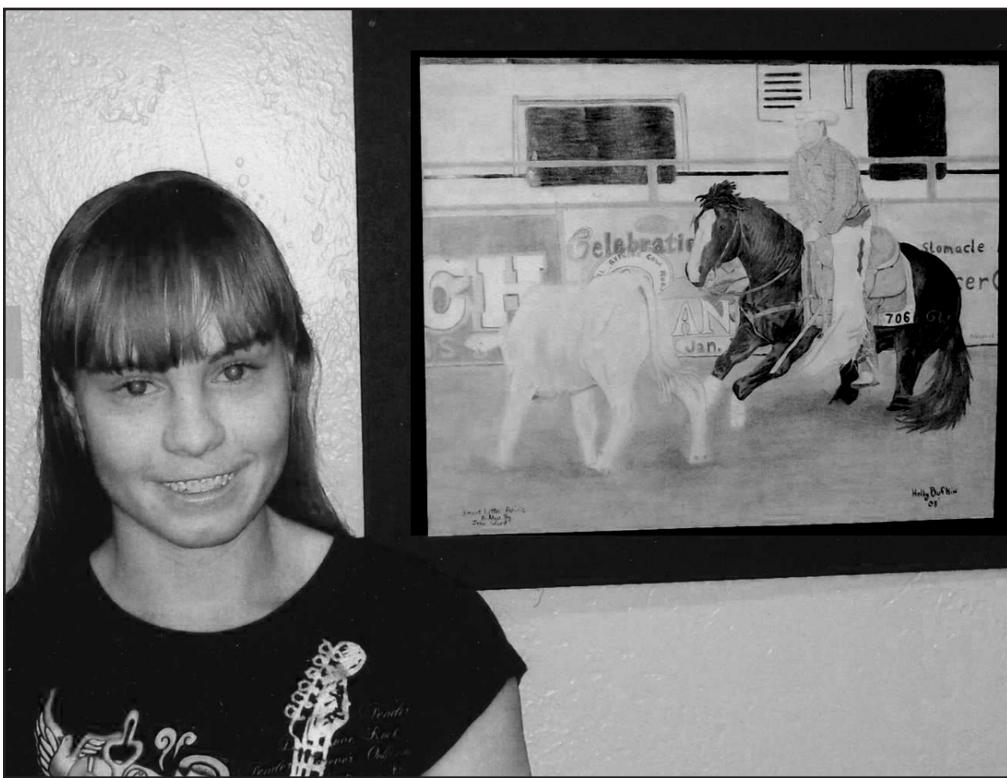

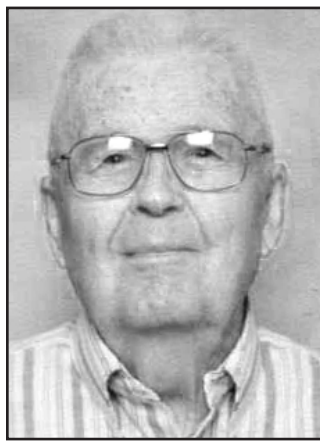
Burial will follow by Blackwell Funeral Home.

New Mexico looks at longer school year

New Mexico Gov. Bill Richardson was in Clovis last week and talked about schools going to a 180-day schedule.

The governor cannot mandate such a decision, but can strongly urge the appropriate state commission to do it.

Currently, Texico students attend school about 170 days a year – but are on a longer schedule than those schools with 180 days.

Texico students attend school for 1,080 hours.

So if the state mandates 180 days or 1,080 hours, it's likely that

Texico School would keep its current schedule.

But if a 180-day schedule is mandated, then Texico would likely shorten their school days.

And if the state mandates a four-day school week, look for longer school terms.

LIVE CATTLE: Cattle prices have been making every attempt to move higher, but last weeks lower stock market had some negative impact on the market for a couple of days. Prices will need to close above the \$85.00 level basis the nearby February contract in order to move higher. Prices should continue to move higher into the February/April time frame before topping?

FEEDER CATTLE: Feeder prices have also made several attempts over the last week to break out to the upside and continue higher. Last week, prices stalled while watching the financial sector. The March contract needs to close above \$95.60 in order to move back into the high made just a couple of weeks ago. Prices need some help from a higher Live Cattle price in order to continue higher.

CORN: Corn prices were able to turn daily trends back higher on Friday. The move back higher basically countered the sharp decline seen over the last couple of weeks. This market needed to correct and now it looks like prices have turned back higher and should test the highs made just a couple of weeks ago around the \$4.25 level basis the nearby March contract.

SOYBEANS: Soybeans turned their daily chart up on Thursday last week and closed strong. This may have helped the corn to move higher on Friday. In any case, prices should be in position to retest the highs made a couple of weeks ago around the \$10.60 level basis the March contract. If prices can break out above this level, then the market should move higher into the March time frame.

WHEAT: March KC Wheat prices also turned their daily charts up on Friday along with the corn and just behind the beans. Wheat prices will normally try to top during the December/January time frame which leads us to be somewhat cautious. Higher corn and beans may help support higher prices, but if the market cannot penetrate the \$6.75 level, prices may top?

COTTON: Cotton prices have also turned higher back in late December, but have continued to struggle to gain ground. There are still fears concerning the world economy which may have buyers hesitating, but trends remain higher for now. A close above \$51 basis the March contract should push prices up into the \$52-53 level over the near term.

Somalia: Al Quada is placing its new training camps in this lawless nation. The so-called government has authority over a couple of towns. The rest of the country is in disarray, with Moslem extremists as the dominant group. The piracy issue off its coast is a primary example of this mess.

And who knows what other nations will be major issues next year. Indonesia? The Phillippines? Nigeria? The list goes on and on.

But the problem I have is that the U.S. is unwilling to use an overall perspective to combat the Moslem crusade that obviously involves most of the world.

All we do is look at the nations by themselves. We have no overall strategy.

And that is unbelievable for me to say about this one-great nation of ours. But that is exactly what we are seeing: no overview, no worldwide

strategy. And we wonder why we are taking a beating.

When President Obama gives a speech, there should be a world map behind him, showing the points of conflict between Moslems and Christians. And there should be frequent updates on how World War III is progressing.

It won't happen. Our national politicians are not equipped to understand the magnitude of the war. They prefer to stick their heads in the sand, hoping it will go away while they are in office.

And they sure don't want you to understand because if you did, you would demand answers. And they don't have answers.

Welcome to 21st Century America.

It requires that a partnership be developed between both sides.

Community policing is not a program or a tactic, but an overall organizational philosophy. Officers and citizens work together to identify needs and problems.

Prevention of crime and resolution to problems is achieved through adaptation of police methods and mobilization of resources from both the community and the police department.

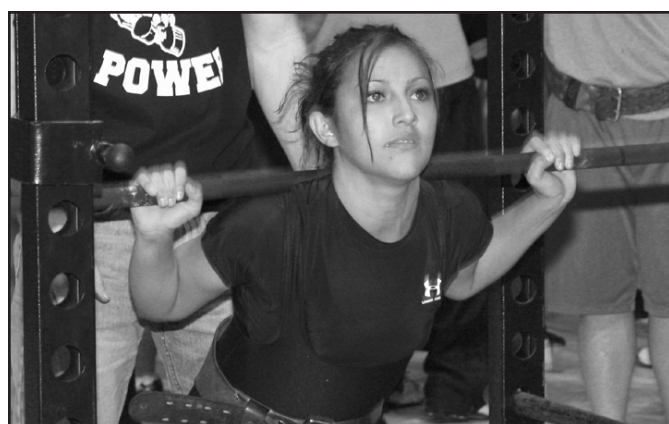

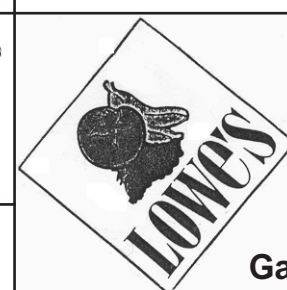
