## Letter to the Editor

 Dear EditorTwo days before last Thanksgiving, while driving my daughter to school, we were involved in a serius accident.
Heading into the fierce rising sun, I looked down to the place where my sunglasses were stored to
retrieve the glasses. When I looked up, I was running upon a semi-tanker which had just pulled onto the highway and into the lane in which I was traveling. The semi was moving about 10 miles per hour, and I was at highway speed.
In the split second I had to think, I realized that if we ran up under the tanker, my daughter and I would likely be killed. Instinctively, I braked and jerked the steering wheel hard to the right. After that, I remember feeling and hearing the impact as my little Saturn struck the trailer just to the left of the center of my hood. The next thing I knew I was hanging upside down by my seatbelt. The car, after striking the anker truck, had rolled more than once.
In the aftermath of the crash, we were assisted by many, many good people. The truck driver was the cate herself from her seatbelt and got out of the car The trucker cut my seatbelt off me and assisted me in exiting the vehicle. He also telephoned my wife,

Another couple was there to comfort my daughter. moments, assessed our condition and then transported us to the hospital in Muleshoe. There, we were examined and attended by numerous medical personnel under the direction of Dr. Purdy.
Thorough x-rays revealed no broken bones for my daughter. She sustained severe bruises from the lapbelt, which held her in place through the crash, and a burn on the face from the powder in the airbag

knee, a hairline fracture in the left elbow, and a knee, a hairline fracture in the left elbow, and a

Our healing continues with remarkable progress. My surgeon told me at my last checkup my recovery three to six months after such an injury. I have no other explanation for this other than the merciful intervention of our gracious Savior God, who not only spared our lives but has responded in the affirmative to the many prayers on our behalf!
A gifted surgeon, very capable chiropractor, massage therapist, and occupational therapist have been the instruments of God to bring about my steady recovery. Countless friends and acquaintances in our communities have also been instrumental in our recovery.
Moments after the accident, I told my daughter that we would have extra cause to give thanks on Thanksgiving. In fact, I was released from the hospital the evening before Thanksgiving and was able to worship with my congregation the next morning!
It wasn't long before was back
It wasn't long before I was back in the pulpit ings and merciful love in His Son, Jesus Christ. l've also told many of you about the apparent council held by the angels that morning: deciding I was not yet in appropriate voice to join the heavenly choirs, they simply stuffed my car like those Styrofoam peanuts used in packaging parcels to prevent my death or serious injury! Their plan worked, and l'm still practicing my singing.
What a wonderful outpouring of Christian love and concern we have experienced! People whose names do not even know still stop me to ask how we are doing, or to share that my daughter and I have been in their prayers. A couple of weeks after the wreck I telephoned the truck driver. He was glad to hear how our recovery was going, and said that he, too, had been praying for us.
I'd like to take this opportunity to publicly acknowledge everyone who became the hands of
our powerful Healer, Christ, through this extraordinary experience. Amelia and I - and the rest of the family - are deeply grateful for your ministrations, your prayers, and your kind expressions of care. God bless you!
