touring with Pat Green and will be performing in Amarillo soon.

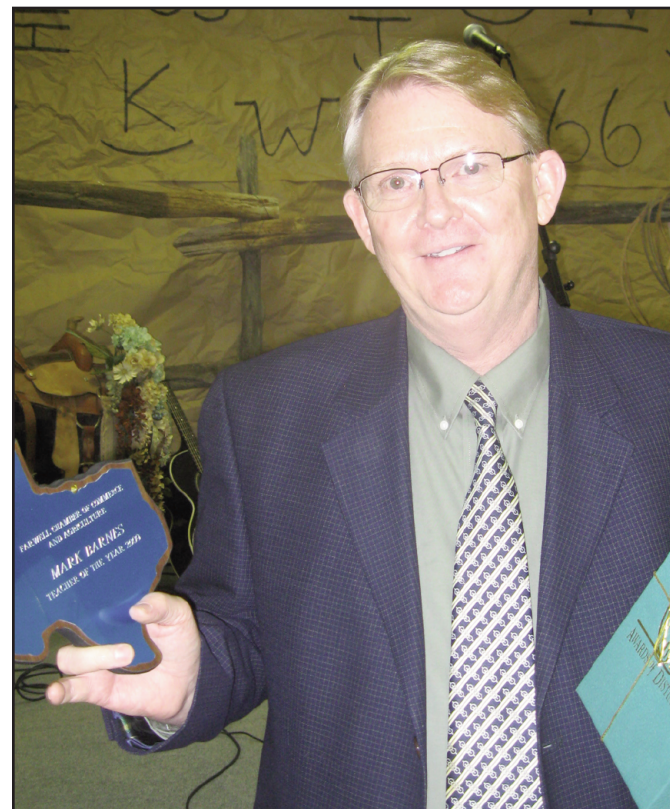

Son John is the farm manager and also works in office sales and inventory when needed.

FEC has asked folks to seriously look into the climate change legislation that is in front of Congress right now.

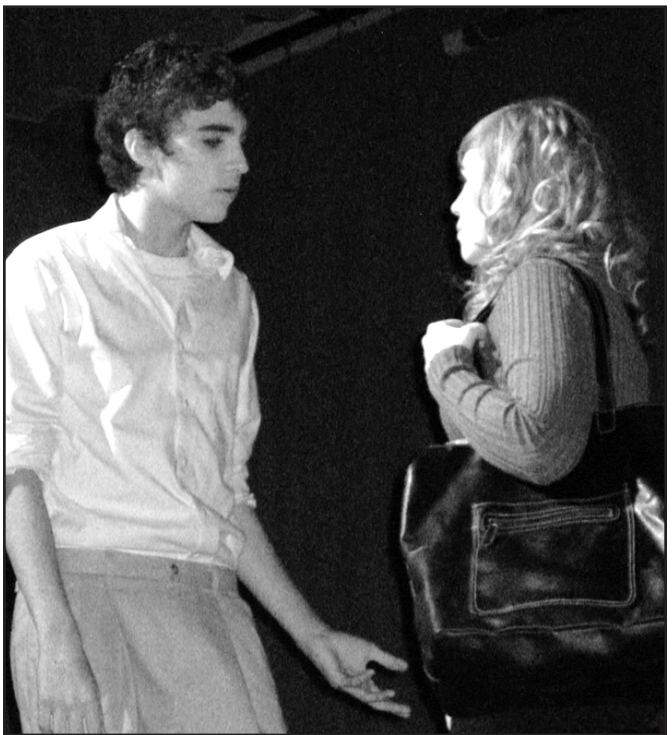
Reps. Markey and Waxman have proposed a taxation plan that could greatly increase the price

An understatement: area needs a lot more rain

From Monti Vandiver, Parmer County Extension Agent-IPM

To say the area needs a good soaking rain would be an understatement but for many wheat producers that concern has been superseded by potential freeze damage their crop may have sustained as a result of unseasonably cold weather the last week of March.

Symptoms of freeze injury to area wheat has ranged from light to severe with most surveyed fields falling into the moderate to heavy category. Local weather stations recorded temperatures as low as 23 degrees F for the high and 14 degrees F for the low over a 24 hour period.

Wheat becomes much more sensitive to cold temperatures after it

begins growing in the spring. Most injury is likely to occur when sensitive growth stages are synchronized with cold temperatures. There is minimal difference in freeze tolerance between wheat varieties at the same growth stage.

Prolonged exposure to freezing causes much more injury than brief exposure to the same temperature.

Plant growth stage, plant moisture content, and duration of exposure influ-

ence spring freeze injury to wheat and make it difficult to predict the extent of damage.

Most of the area wheat was well into the jointing stage at the time of the winter storm. Jointing wheat is much more sensitive to freezing temperatures than tiller stage wheat.

- Cancelled the city election since the incumbents running had no opponents.

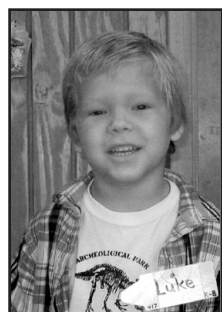
